

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God; Chap. 1, Verse 1, [MAR].

As it is written in the prophets, Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare thy way before thee. Chap. 1, Verse 2, [MAR].

The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Chap. 1, Verse 3, [MAR].

John did baptize in the wilderness, and preach the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins. Chap. 1, Verse 4, [MAR].

And there went out unto him all the land of Judaea, and they of Jerusalem, and were all baptized of him in the river of Jordan, confessing their sins. Chap. 1, Verse 5, [MAR].

And John was clothed with camel's hair, and with a girdle of a skin about his loins; and he did eat locusts and wild honey; Chap. 1, Verse 6, [MAR].

And preached, saying, There cometh one mightier than I after me, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to stoop down and unloose. Chap. 1, Verse 7, [MAR].

I indeed have baptized you with water: but he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost. Chap. 1, Verse 8, [MAR].

And it came to pass in those days, that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was baptized of John in Jordan. Chap. 1, Verse 9, [MAR].

And straightway coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens opened, and the Spirit like a dove descending upon him: Chap. 1, Verse 10, [MAR].

And there came a voice from heaven, [saying], Thou art my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Chap. 1, Verse 11, [MAR].

And immediately the Spirit driveth him into the wilderness. Chap. 1, Verse 12, [MAR].

And he was there in the wilderness forty days, tempted of Satan; and was with the wild beasts; and the angels ministered unto him. Chap. 1, Verse 13, [MAR].

Now after that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, Chap. 1, Verse 14, [MAR].

And saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel. Chap. 1, Verse 15, [MAR].

Now as he walked by the sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers. Chap. 1, Verse 16, [MAR].

And Jesus said unto them, Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men. Chap. 1, Verse 17, [MAR].

And straightway they forsook their nets, and followed him. Chap. 1, Verse 18, [MAR].

And when he had gone a little farther thence, he saw James the [son] of Zebedee, and John his brother, who also were in the ship mending their nets. Chap. 1, Verse 19, [MAR].

And straightway he called them: and they left their father Zebedee in the ship with the hired servants, and went after him. Chap. 1, Verse 20, [MAR].

And they went into Capernaum; and straightway on the sabbath day he entered into the synagogue, and taught. Chap. 1, Verse 21, [MAR].

And they were astonished at his doctrine: for he taught them as one that had authority, and not as the scribes. Chap. 1, Verse 22, [MAR].

And there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, Chap. 1, Verse 23, [MAR].

Saying, Let [us] alone; what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art, the Holy One of God. Chap. 1, Verse 24, [MAR].

And Jesus rebuked him, saying, Hold thy peace, and come out of him. Chap. 1, Verse 25, [MAR].

And when the unclean spirit had torn him, and cried with a loud voice, he came out of him. Chap. 1, Verse 26, [MAR].

And they were all amazed, insomuch that they questioned among themselves, saying, What thing is this? what new doctrine [is] this? for with authority commandeth he even the unclean spirits, and they do obey him. Chap. 1, Verse 27, [MAR].

And immediately his fame spread abroad throughout all the region round about Galilee. Chap. 1, Verse 28, [MAR].

And forthwith, when they were come out of the synagogue, they entered into the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Chap. 1, Verse 29, [MAR].

But Simon's wife's mother lay sick of a fever, and anon they tell him of her. Chap. 1, Verse 30, [MAR].

And he came and took her by the hand, and lifted her up; and immediately the fever left her, and she ministered unto them. Chap. 1, Verse 31, [MAR].

And at even, when the sun did set, they brought unto him all that were diseased, and them that were possessed with devils. Chap. 1, Verse 32, [MAR].

And all the city was gathered together at the door. Chap. 1, Verse 33, [MAR].

And he healed many that were sick of divers diseases, and cast out many devils; and suffered not the devils to speak, because they knew him. Chap. 1, Verse 34, [MAR].

And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed. Chap. 1, Verse 35, [MAR].

And Simon and they that were with him followed after him. Chap. 1, Verse 36, [MAR].

And when they had found him, they said unto him, All [men] seek for thee. Chap. 1, Verse 37, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Let us go into the next towns, that I may preach there also: for therefore came I forth. Chap. 1, Verse 38, [MAR].

And he preached in their synagogues throughout all Galilee, and cast out devils. Chap. 1, Verse 39, [MAR].

And there came a leper to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, and saying unto him, If thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. Chap. 1, Verse 40, [MAR].

And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth [his] hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I will; be thou clean. Chap. 1, Verse 41, [MAR].

And as soon as he had spoken, immediately the leprosy departed from him, and he was cleansed. Chap. 1, Verse 42, [MAR].

And he straitly charged him, and forthwith sent him away; Chap. 1, Verse 43, [MAR].

And saith unto him, See thou say nothing to any man: but go thy way, shew thyself to the priest, and offer for thy cleansing those things which Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them. Chap. 1, Verse 44, [MAR].

But he went out, and began to publish [it] much, and to blaze abroad the matter, insomuch that Jesus could no more openly enter into the city, but was without in desert places: and they came to him from every quarter. Chap. 1, Verse 45, [MAR].

And again he entered into Capernaum after [some] days; and it was noised that he was in the house. Chap. 2, Verse 1, [MAR].

And straightway many were gathered together, insomuch that there was no room to receive [them], no, not so much as about the door: and he preached the word unto them. Chap. 2, Verse 2, [MAR].

And they come unto him, bringing one sick of the palsy, which was borne of four. Chap. 2, Verse 3, [MAR].

And when they could not come nigh unto him for the press, they uncovered the roof where he was: and when they had

broken [it] up, they let down the bed wherein the sick of the palsy lay. Chap. 2, Verse 4, [MAR].

When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee. Chap. 2, Verse 5, [MAR].

But there were certain of the scribes sitting there, and reasoning in their hearts, Chap. 2, Verse 6, [MAR].

Why doth this [man] thus speak blasphemies? who can forgive sins but God only? Chap. 2, Verse 7, [MAR].

And immediately when Jesus perceived in his spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, he said unto them, Why reason ye these things in your hearts? Chap. 2, Verse 8, [MAR].

Whether is it easier to say to the sick of the palsy, [Thy] sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Arise, and take up thy bed, and walk? Chap. 2, Verse 9, [MAR].

But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy,) Chap. 2, Verse 10, [MAR].

I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy bed, and go thy way into thine house. Chap. 2, Verse 11, [MAR].

And immediately he arose, took up the bed, and went forth before them all; insomuch that they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, We never saw it on this fashion. Chap. 2, Verse 12, [MAR].

And he went forth again by the sea side; and all the multitude resorted unto him, and he taught them. Chap. 2, Verse 13, [MAR].

And as he passed by, he saw Levi the [son] of Alphaeus sitting at the receipt of custom, and said unto him, Follow me. And he arose and followed him. Chap. 2, Verse 14, [MAR].

And it came to pass, that, as Jesus sat at meat in his house, many publicans and sinners sat also together with Jesus and his disciples: for there were many, and they followed him. Chap. 2, Verse 15, [MAR].

And when the scribes and Pharisees saw him eat with publicans and sinners, they said unto his disciples, How is it that he eateth and drinketh with publicans and sinners? Chap. 2, Verse 16, [MAR].

When Jesus heard [it], he saith unto them, They that are whole have no need of the physician, but they that are sick: I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance. Chap. 2, Verse 17, [MAR].

And the disciples of John and of the Pharisees used to fast: and they come and say unto him, Why do the disciples of John and of the Pharisees fast, but thy disciples fast not? Chap. 2, Verse 18, [MAR].

And Jesus said unto them, Can the children of the bridechamber fast, while the bridegroom is with them? as long as they have the bridegroom with them, they cannot fast. Chap. 2, Verse 19, [MAR].

But the days will come, when the bridegroom shall be taken away from them, and then shall they fast in those days. Chap. 2, Verse 20, [MAR].

No man also seweth a piece of new cloth on an old garment: else the new piece that filled it up taketh away from the old, and the rent is made worse. Chap. 2, Verse 21, [MAR].

And no man putteth new wine into old bottles: else the new wine doth burst the bottles, and the wine is spilled, and the bottles will be marred: but new wine must be put into new bottles. Chap. 2, Verse 22, [MAR].

And it came to pass, that he went through the corn fields on the sabbath day; and his disciples began, as they went, to pluck the ears of corn. Chap. 2, Verse 23, [MAR].

And the Pharisees said unto him, Behold, why do they on the sabbath day that which is not lawful? Chap. 2, Verse 24, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Have ye never read what David did, when he had need, and was an hungred, he, and they that were with him? Chap. 2, Verse 25, [MAR].

How he went into the house of God in the days of Abiathar

the high priest, and did eat the shewbread, which is not lawful to eat but for the priests, and gave also to them which were with him? Chap. 2, Verse 26, [MAR].

And he said unto them, The sabbath was made for man, and not man for the sabbath: Chap. 2, Verse 27, [MAR].

Therefore the Son of man is Lord also of the sabbath. Chap. 2, Verse 28, [MAR].

And he entered again into the synagogue; and there was a man there which had a withered hand. Chap. 3, Verse 1, [MAR].

And they watched him, whether he would heal him on the sabbath day; that they might accuse him. Chap. 3, Verse 2, [MAR].

And he saith unto the man which had the withered hand, Stand forth. Chap. 3, Verse 3, [MAR].

And he saith unto them, Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath days, or to do evil? to save life, or to kill? But they held their peace. Chap. 3, Verse 4, [MAR].

And when he had looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, he saith unto the man, Stretch forth thine hand. And he stretched [it] out: and his hand was restored whole as the other. Chap. 3, Verse 5, [MAR].

And the Pharisees went forth, and straightway took counsel with the Herodians against him, how they might destroy him. Chap. 3, Verse 6, [MAR].

But Jesus withdrew himself with his disciples to the sea: and a great multitude from Galilee followed him, and from Judaea, Chap. 3, Verse 7, [MAR].

And from Jerusalem, and from Idumaea, and [from] beyond Jordan; and they about Tyre and Sidon, a great multitude, when they had heard what great things he did, came unto him. Chap. 3, Verse 8, [MAR].

And he spake to his disciples, that a small ship should wait on him because of the multitude, lest they should throng him. Chap. 3, Verse 9, [MAR].

For he had healed many; insomuch that they pressed upon him for to touch him, as many as had plagues. Chap. 3, Verse 10, [MAR].

And unclean spirits, when they saw him, fell down before him, and cried, saying, Thou art the Son of God. Chap. 3, Verse 11, [MAR].

And he straitly charged them that they should not make him known. Chap. 3, Verse 12, [MAR].

And he goeth up into a mountain, and calleth [unto him] whom he would: and they came unto him. Chap. 3, Verse 13, [MAR].

And he ordained twelve, that they should be with him, and that he might send them forth to preach, Chap. 3, Verse 14, [MAR].

And to have power to heal sicknesses, and to cast out devils: Chap. 3, Verse 15, [MAR].

And Simon he surnamed Peter; Chap. 3, Verse 16, [MAR].

And James the [son] of Zebedee, and John the brother of James; and he surnamed them Boanerges, which is, The sons of thunder: Chap. 3, Verse 17, [MAR].

And Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the [son] of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Canaanite, Chap. 3, Verse 18, [MAR].

And Judas Iscariot, which also betrayed him: and they went into an house. Chap. 3, Verse 19, [MAR].

And the multitude cometh together again, so that they could not so much as eat bread. Chap. 3, Verse 20, [MAR].

And when his friends heard [of it], they went out to lay hold on him: for they said, He is beside himself. Chap. 3, Verse 21, [MAR].

And the scribes which came down from Jerusalem said, He hath Beelzebub, and by the prince of the devils casteth he out devils. Chap. 3, Verse 22, [MAR].

And he called them [unto him], and said unto them in parables, How can Satan cast out Satan? Chap. 3, Verse 23, [MAR].

And if a kingdom be divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. Chap. 3, Verse 24, [MAR].

And if a house be divided against itself, that house cannot stand. Chap. 3, Verse 25, [MAR].

And if Satan rise up against himself, and be divided, he cannot stand, but hath an end. Chap. 3, Verse 26, [MAR].

No man can enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he will first bind the strong man; and then he will spoil his house. Chap. 3, Verse 27, [MAR].

Verily I say unto you, All sins shall be forgiven unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme: Chap. 3, Verse 28, [MAR].

But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgiveness, but is in danger of eternal damnation: Chap. 3, Verse 29, [MAR].

Because they said, He hath an unclean spirit. Chap. 3, Verse 30, [MAR].

There came then his brethren and his mother, and, standing without, sent unto him, calling him. Chap. 3, Verse 31, [MAR].

And the multitude sat about him, and they said unto him, Behold, thy mother and thy brethren without seek for thee. Chap. 3, Verse 32, [MAR].

And he answered them, saying, Who is my mother, or my brethren? Chap. 3, Verse 33, [MAR].

And he looked round about on them which sat about him, and said, Behold my mother and my brethren! Chap. 3, Verse 34, [MAR].

For whosoever shall do the will of God, the same is my brother, and my sister, and mother. Chap. 3, Verse 35, [MAR].

And he began again to teach by the sea side: and there was gathered unto him a great multitude, so that he entered into a ship, and sat in the sea; and the whole multitude was by the sea on the land. Chap. 4, Verse 1, [MAR].

And he taught them many things by parables, and said unto them in his doctrine, Chap. 4, Verse 2, [MAR].

Hearken; Behold, there went out a sower to sow: Chap. 4, Verse 3, [MAR].

And it came to pass, as he sowed, some fell by the way side, and the fowls of the air came and devoured it up. Chap. 4, Verse 4, [MAR].

And some fell on stony ground, where it had not much earth; and immediately it sprang up, because it had no depth of earth: Chap. 4, Verse 5, [MAR].

But when the sun was up, it was scorched; and because it had no root, it withered away. Chap. 4, Verse 6, [MAR].

And some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up, and choked it, and it yielded no fruit. Chap. 4, Verse 7, [MAR].

And other fell on good ground, and did yield fruit that sprang up and increased; and brought forth, some thirty, and some sixty, and some an hundred. Chap. 4, Verse 8, [MAR].

And he said unto them, He that hath ears to hear, let him hear. Chap. 4, Verse 9, [MAR].

And when he was alone, they that were about him with the twelve asked of him the parable. Chap. 4, Verse 10, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Unto you it is given to know the mystery of the kingdom of God: but unto them that are without, all [these] things are done in parables: Chap. 4, Verse 11, [MAR].

That seeing they may see, and not perceive; and hearing they may hear, and not understand; lest at any time they should be converted, and [their] sins should be forgiven them. Chap. 4, Verse 12, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Know ye not this parable? and how then will ye know all parables? Chap. 4, Verse 13, [MAR].

The sower soweth the word. Chap. 4, Verse 14, [MAR].

And these are they by the way side, where the word is sown; but when they have heard, Satan cometh immediately, and taketh away the word that was sown in their hearts. Chap. 4, Verse 15, [MAR].

And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness; Chap. 4, Verse 16, [MAR].

And have no root in themselves, and so endure but for a time: afterward, when affliction or persecution ariseth for the word's sake, immediately they are offended. Chap. 4, Verse 17, [MAR].

And these are they which are sown among thorns; such as hear the word, Chap. 4, Verse 18, [MAR].

And the cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things entering in, choke the word, and it becometh unfruitful. Chap. 4, Verse 19, [MAR].

And these are they which are sown on good ground; such as hear the word, and receive [it], and bring forth fruit, some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some an hundred. Chap. 4, Verse 20, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Is a candle brought to be put under a bushel, or under a bed? and not to be set on a candlestick? Chap. 4, Verse 21, [MAR].

For there is nothing hid, which shall not be manifested; neither was any thing kept secret, but that it should come abroad. Chap. 4, Verse 22, [MAR].

If any man have ears to hear, let him hear. Chap. 4, Verse 23, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Take heed what ye hear: with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you: and unto you that hear shall more be given. Chap. 4, Verse 24, [MAR].

For he that hath, to him shall be given: and he that hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he hath. Chap. 4, Verse 25, [MAR].

And he said, So is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the ground; Chap. 4, Verse 26, [MAR].

And should sleep, and rise night and day, and the seed should spring and grow up, he knoweth not how. Chap. 4, Verse 27, [MAR].

For the earth bringeth forth fruit of herself; first the blade, then the ear, after that the full corn in the ear. Chap. 4, Verse 28, [MAR].

But when the fruit is brought forth, immediately he putteth in the sickle, because the harvest is come. Chap. 4, Verse 29, [MAR].

And he said, Whereunto shall we liken the kingdom of God? or with what comparison shall we compare it? Chap. 4, Verse 30, [MAR].

[It is] like a grain of mustard seed, which, when it is sown in the earth, is less than all the seeds that be in the earth: Chap. 4, Verse 31, [MAR].

But when it is sown, it groweth up, and becometh greater than all herbs, and shooteth out great branches; so that the fowls of the air may lodge under the shadow of it. Chap. 4, Verse 32, [MAR].

And with many such parables spake he the word unto them, as they were able to hear [it]. Chap. 4, Verse 33, [MAR].

But without a parable spake he not unto them: and when they were alone, he expounded all things to his disciples. Chap. 4, Verse 34, [MAR].

And the same day, when the even was come, he saith unto them, Let us pass over unto the other side. Chap. 4, Verse 35, [MAR].

And when they had sent away the multitude, they took him even as he was in the ship. And there were also with him other little ships. Chap. 4, Verse 36, [MAR].

And there arose a great storm of wind, and the waves beat into the ship, so that it was now full. Chap. 4, Verse 37, [MAR].

And he was in the hinder part of the ship, asleep on a pillow: and they awake him, and say unto him, Master, carest thou not that we perish? Chap. 4, Verse 38, [MAR].

And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. Chap. 4, Verse 39, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith? Chap. 4, Verse 40, [MAR].

And they feared exceedingly, and said one to another, What manner of man is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him? Chap. 4, Verse 41, [MAR].

And they came over unto the other side of the sea, into the country of the Gadarenes. Chap. 5, Verse 1, [MAR].

And when he was come out of the ship, immediately there met him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit, Chap. 5, Verse 2, [MAR].

Who had [his] dwelling among the tombs; and no man could bind him, no, not with chains: Chap. 5, Verse 3, [MAR].

Because that he had been often bound with fetters and chains, and the chains had been plucked asunder by him, and the fetters broken in pieces: neither could any [man] tame him. Chap. 5, Verse 4, [MAR].

And always, night and day, he was in the mountains, and in the tombs, crying, and cutting himself with stones. Chap. 5, Verse 5, [MAR].

But when he saw Jesus afar off, he ran and worshipped him, Chap. 5, Verse 6, [MAR].

And cried with a loud voice, and said, What have I to do with thee, Jesus, [thou] Son of the most high God? I adjure thee by God, that thou torment me not. Chap. 5, Verse 7, [MAR].

For he said unto him, Come out of the man, [thou] unclean

spirit. Chap. 5, Verse 8, [MAR].

And he asked him, What [is] thy name? And he answered, saying, My name [is] Legion: for we are many. Chap. 5, Verse 9, [MAR].

And he besought him much that he would not send them away out of the country. Chap. 5, Verse 10, [MAR].

Now there was there nigh unto the mountains a great herd of swine feeding. Chap. 5, Verse 11, [MAR].

And all the devils besought him, saying, Send us into the swine, that we may enter into them. Chap. 5, Verse 12, [MAR].

And forthwith Jesus gave them leave. And the unclean spirits went out, and entered into the swine: and the herd ran violently down a steep place into the sea, (they were about two thousand;) and were choked in the sea. Chap. 5, Verse 13, [MAR].

And they that fed the swine fled, and told [it] in the city, and in the country. And they went out to see what it was that was done. Chap. 5, Verse 14, [MAR].

And they come to Jesus, and see him that was possessed with the devil, and had the legion, sitting, and clothed, and in his right mind: and they were afraid. Chap. 5, Verse 15, [MAR].

And they that saw [it] told them how it befell to him that was possessed with the devil, and [also] concerning the swine. Chap. 5, Verse 16, [MAR].

And they began to pray him to depart out of their coasts. Chap. 5, Verse 17, [MAR].

And when he was come into the ship, he that had been possessed with the devil prayed him that he might be with him. Chap. 5, Verse 18, [MAR].

Howbeit Jesus suffered him not, but saith unto him, Go home to thy friends, and tell them how great things the Lord hath done for thee, and hath had compassion on thee. Chap. 5, Verse 19, [MAR].

And he departed, and began to publish in Decapolis how great things Jesus had done for him: and all [men] did marvel. Chap. 5, Verse 20, [MAR].

And when Jesus was passed over again by ship unto the other side, much people gathered unto him: and he was nigh unto the sea. Chap. 5, Verse 21, [MAR].

And, behold, there cometh one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name; and when he saw him, he fell at his feet, Chap. 5, Verse 22, [MAR].

And besought him greatly, saying, My little daughter lieth at the point of death: [I pray thee], come and lay thy hands on her, that she may be healed; and she shall live. Chap. 5, Verse 23, [MAR].

And [Jesus] went with him; and much people followed him, and thronged him. Chap. 5, Verse 24, [MAR].

And a certain woman, which had an issue of blood twelve years, Chap. 5, Verse 25, [MAR].

And had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse, Chap. 5, Verse 26, [MAR].

When she had heard of Jesus, came in the press behind, and touched his garment. Chap. 5, Verse 27, [MAR].

For she said, If I may touch but his clothes, I shall be whole. Chap. 5, Verse 28, [MAR].

And straightway the fountain of her blood was dried up; and she felt in [her] body that she was healed of that plague. Chap. 5, Verse 29, [MAR].

And Jesus, immediately knowing in himself that virtue had gone out of him, turned him about in the press, and said, Who touched my clothes? Chap. 5, Verse 30, [MAR].

And his disciples said unto him, Thou seest the multitude thronging thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me? Chap. 5, Verse 31, [MAR].

And he looked round about to see her that had done this thing. Chap. 5, Verse 32, [MAR].

But the woman fearing and trembling, knowing what was done in her, came and fell down before him, and told him all the truth. Chap. 5, Verse 33, [MAR].

And he said unto her, Daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace, and be whole of thy plague. Chap. 5, Verse 34, [MAR].

While he yet spake, there came from the ruler of the synagogue's [house certain] which said, Thy daughter is dead: why troublest thou the Master any further? Chap. 5, Verse 35, [MAR].

As soon as Jesus heard the word that was spoken, he saith unto the ruler of the synagogue, Be not afraid, only believe. Chap. 5, Verse 36, [MAR].

And he suffered no man to follow him, save Peter, and James, and John the brother of James. Chap. 5, Verse 37, [MAR].

And he cometh to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and seeth the tumult, and them that wept and wailed greatly. Chap. 5, Verse 38, [MAR].

And when he was come in, he saith unto them, Why make ye this ado, and weep? the damsel is not dead, but sleepeth. Chap. 5, Verse 39, [MAR].

And they laughed him to scorn. But when he had put them all out, he taketh the father and the mother of the damsel, and them that were with him, and entereth in where the damsel was lying. Chap. 5, Verse 40, [MAR].

And he took the damsel by the hand, and said unto her, Talitha cumi; which is, being interpreted, Damsel, I say unto thee, arise. Chap. 5, Verse 41, [MAR].

And straightway the damsel arose, and walked; for she was [of the age] of twelve years. And they were astonished with a great astonishment. Chap. 5, Verse 42, [MAR].

And he charged them straitly that no man should know it; and commanded that something should be given her to eat. Chap. 5, Verse 43, [MAR].

And he went out from thence, and came into his own country; and his disciples follow him. Chap. 6, Verse 1, [MAR].

And when the sabbath day was come, he began to teach in the synagogue: and many hearing [him] were astonished, saying, From whence hath this [man] these things? and what wisdom [is] this which is given unto him, that even such mighty works are wrought by his hands? Chap. 6, Verse 2, [MAR].

Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary, the brother of James, and Joses, and of Juda, and Simon? and are not his sisters here with us? And they were offended at him. Chap. 6, Verse 3, [MAR].

But Jesus said unto them, A prophet is not without honour, but in his own country, and among his own kin, and in his own house. Chap. 6, Verse 4, [MAR].

And he could there do no mighty work, save that he laid his hands upon a few sick folk, and healed [them]. Chap. 6, Verse 5, [MAR].

And he marvelled because of their unbelief. And he went round about the villages, teaching. Chap. 6, Verse 6, [MAR].

And he called [unto him] the twelve, and began to send them forth by two and two; and gave them power over unclean spirits; Chap. 6, Verse 7, [MAR].

And commanded them that they should take nothing for [their] journey, save a staff only; no scrip, no bread, no money in [their] purse: Chap. 6, Verse 8, [MAR].

But [be] shod with sandals; and not put on two coats. Chap. 6, Verse 9, [MAR].

And he said unto them, In what place soever ye enter into an house, there abide till ye depart from that place. Chap. 6, Verse 10, [MAR].

And whosoever shall not receive you, nor hear you, when ye depart thence, shake off the dust under your feet for a testimony against them. Verily I say unto you, It shall be more tolerable for Sodom and Gomorrha in the day of

judgment, than for that city. Chap. 6, Verse 11, [MAR].

And they went out, and preached that men should repent. Chap. 6, Verse 12, [MAR].

And they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many that were sick, and healed [them]. Chap. 6, Verse 13, [MAR].

And king Herod heard [of him]; (for his name was spread abroad:) and he said, That John the Baptist was risen from the dead, and therefore mighty works do shew forth themselves in him. Chap. 6, Verse 14, [MAR].

Others said, That it is Elias. And others said, That it is a prophet, or as one of the prophets. Chap. 6, Verse 15, [MAR].

But when Herod heard [thereof], he said, It is John, whom I beheaded: he is risen from the dead. Chap. 6, Verse 16, [MAR].

For Herod himself had sent forth and laid hold upon John, and bound him in prison for Herodias' sake, his brother Philip's wife: for he had married her. Chap. 6, Verse 17, [MAR].

For John had said unto Herod, It is not lawful for thee to have thy brother's wife. Chap. 6, Verse 18, [MAR].

Therefore Herodias had a quarrel against him, and would have killed him; but she could not: Chap. 6, Verse 19, [MAR].

For Herod feared John, knowing that he was a just man and an holy, and observed him; and when he heard him, he did many things, and heard him gladly. Chap. 6, Verse 20, [MAR].

And when a convenient day was come, that Herod on his birthday made a supper to his lords, high captains, and chief [estates] of Galilee; Chap. 6, Verse 21, [MAR].

And when the daughter of the said Herodias came in, and danced, and pleased Herod and them that sat with him, the king said unto the damsel, Ask of me whatsoever thou wilt, and I will give [it] thee. Chap. 6, Verse 22, [MAR].

And he sware unto her, Whatsoever thou shalt ask of me, I will give [it] thee, unto the half of my kingdom. Chap. 6, Verse 23, [MAR].

And she went forth, and said unto her mother, What shall I ask? And she said, The head of John the Baptist. Chap. 6, Verse 24, [MAR].

And she came in straightway with haste unto the king, and asked, saying, I will that thou give me by and by in a charger the head of John the Baptist. Chap. 6, Verse 25, [MAR].

And the king was exceeding sorry; [yet] for his oath's sake, and for their sakes which sat with him, he would not reject her. Chap. 6, Verse 26, [MAR].

And immediately the king sent an executioner, and commanded his head to be brought: and he went and beheaded him in the prison, Chap. 6, Verse 27, [MAR].

And brought his head in a charger, and gave it to the damsel: and the damsel gave it to her mother. Chap. 6, Verse 28, [MAR].

And when his disciples heard [of it], they came and took up his corpse, and laid it in a tomb. Chap. 6, Verse 29, [MAR].

And the apostles gathered themselves together unto Jesus, and told him all things, both what they had done, and what they had taught. Chap. 6, Verse 30, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Come ye yourselves apart into a desert place, and rest a while: for there were many coming and going, and they had no leisure so much as to eat. Chap. 6, Verse 31, [MAR].

And they departed into a desert place by ship privately. Chap. 6, Verse 32, [MAR].

And the people saw them departing, and many knew him, and ran afoot thither out of all cities, and outwent them, and came together unto him. Chap. 6, Verse 33, [MAR].

And Jesus, when he came out, saw much people, and was

moved with compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd: and he began to teach them many things. Chap. 6, Verse 34, [MAR].

And when the day was now far spent, his disciples came unto him, and said, This is a desert place, and now the time [is] far passed: Chap. 6, Verse 35, [MAR].

Send them away, that they may go into the country round about, and into the villages, and buy themselves bread: for they have nothing to eat. Chap. 6, Verse 36, [MAR].

He answered and said unto them, Give ye them to eat. And they say unto him, Shall we go and buy two hundred pennyworth of bread, and give them to eat? Chap. 6, Verse 37, [MAR].

He saith unto them, How many loaves have ye? go and see. And when they knew, they say, Five, and two fishes. Chap. 6, Verse 38, [MAR].

And he commanded them to make all sit down by companies upon the green grass. Chap. 6, Verse 39, [MAR].

And they sat down in ranks, by hundreds, and by fifties. Chap. 6, Verse 40, [MAR].

And when he had taken the five loaves and the two fishes, he looked up to heaven, and blessed, and brake the loaves, and gave [them] to his disciples to set before them; and the two fishes divided he among them all. Chap. 6, Verse 41, [MAR].

And they did all eat, and were filled. Chap. 6, Verse 42, [MAR].

And they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments, and of the fishes. Chap. 6, Verse 43, [MAR].

And they that did eat of the loaves were about five thousand men. Chap. 6, Verse 44, [MAR].

And straightway he constrained his disciples to get into the ship, and to go to the other side before unto Bethsaida, while he sent away the people. Chap. 6, Verse 45, [MAR].

And when he had sent them away, he departed into a mountain to pray. Chap. 6, Verse 46, [MAR].

And when even was come, the ship was in the midst of the sea, and he alone on the land. Chap. 6, Verse 47, [MAR].

And he saw them toiling in rowing; for the wind was contrary unto them: and about the fourth watch of the night he cometh unto them, walking upon the sea, and would have passed by them. Chap. 6, Verse 48, [MAR].

But when they saw him walking upon the sea, they supposed it had been a spirit, and cried out: Chap. 6, Verse 49, [MAR].

For they all saw him, and were troubled. And immediately he talked with them, and saith unto them, Be of good cheer: it is I; be not afraid. Chap. 6, Verse 50, [MAR].

And he went up unto them into the ship; and the wind ceased: and they were sore amazed in themselves beyond measure, and wondered. Chap. 6, Verse 51, [MAR].

For they considered not [the miracle] of the loaves: for their heart was hardened. Chap. 6, Verse 52, [MAR].

And when they had passed over, they came into the land of Gennesaret, and drew to the shore. Chap. 6, Verse 53, [MAR].

And when they were come out of the ship, straightway they knew him, Chap. 6, Verse 54, [MAR].

And ran through that whole region round about, and began to carry about in beds those that were sick, where they heard he was. Chap. 6, Verse 55, [MAR].

And whithersoever he entered, into villages, or cities, or country, they laid the sick in the streets, and besought him that they might touch if it were but the border of his garment: and as many as touched him were made whole. Chap. 6, Verse 56, [MAR].

Then came together unto him the Pharisees, and certain of the scribes, which came from Jerusalem. Chap. 7, Verse 1, [MAR].

And when they saw some of his disciples eat bread with defiled, that is to say, with unwashen, hands, they found fault. Chap. 7, Verse 2, [MAR].

For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, except they wash [their] hands oft, eat not, holding the tradition of the elders. Chap. 7, Verse 3, [MAR].

And [when they come] from the market, except they wash, they eat not. And many other things there be, which they have received to hold, [as] the washing of cups, and pots, brasen vessels, and of tables. Chap. 7, Verse 4, [MAR].

Then the Pharisees and scribes asked him, Why walk not thy disciples according to the tradition of the elders, but eat bread with unwashen hands? Chap. 7, Verse 5, [MAR].

He answered and said unto them, Well hath Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, This people honoureth me with [their] lips, but their heart is far from me. Chap. 7, Verse 6, [MAR].

Howbeit in vain do they worship me, teaching [for] doctrines the commandments of men. Chap. 7, Verse 7, [MAR].

For laying aside the commandment of God, ye hold the tradition of men, [as] the washing of pots and cups: and many other such like things ye do. Chap. 7, Verse 8, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Full well ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tradition. Chap. 7, Verse 9, [MAR].

For Moses said, Honour thy father and thy mother; and, Whoso curseth father or mother, let him die the death: Chap. 7, Verse 10, [MAR].

But ye say, If a man shall say to his father or mother, [It is] Corban, that is to say, a gift, by whatsoever thou mightest be profited by me; [he shall be free]. Chap. 7, Verse 11, [MAR].

And ye suffer him no more to do ought for his father or his mother; Chap. 7, Verse 12, [MAR].

Making the word of God of none effect through your tradition, which ye have delivered: and many such like things do ye. Chap. 7, Verse 13, [MAR].

And when he had called all the people [unto him], he said unto them, Hearken unto me every one [of you], and understand: Chap. 7, Verse 14, [MAR].

There is nothing from without a man, that entering into him can defile him: but the things which come out of him, those are they that defile the man. Chap. 7, Verse 15, [MAR].

If any man have ears to hear, let him hear. Chap. 7, Verse 16, [MAR].

And when he was entered into the house from the people, his disciples asked him concerning the parable. Chap. 7, Verse 17, [MAR].

And he saith unto them, Are ye so without understanding also? Do ye not perceive, that whatsoever thing from without entereth into the man, [it] cannot defile him; Chap. 7, Verse 18, [MAR].

Because it entereth not into his heart, but into the belly, and goeth out into the draught, purging all meats? Chap. 7, Verse 19, [MAR].

And he said, That which cometh out of the man, that defileth the man. Chap. 7, Verse 20, [MAR].

For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, Chap. 7, Verse 21, [MAR].

Thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness: Chap. 7, Verse 22, [MAR].

All these evil things come from within, and defile the man. Chap. 7, Verse 23, [MAR].

And from thence he arose, and went into the borders of Tyre and Sidon, and entered into an house, and would have no man know [it]: but he could not be hid. Chap. 7, Verse 24, [MAR].

For a [certain] woman, whose young daughter had an unclean spirit, heard of him, and came and fell at his feet: Chap. 7, Verse 25, [MAR].

The woman was a Greek, a Syrophenician by nation; and she besought him that he would cast forth the devil out of her daughter. Chap. 7, Verse 26, [MAR].

But Jesus said unto her, Let the children first be filled: for it is not meet to take the children's bread, and to cast [it] unto the dogs. Chap. 7, Verse 27, [MAR].

And she answered and said unto him, Yes, Lord: yet the dogs under the table eat of the children's crumbs. Chap. 7, Verse 28, [MAR].

And he said unto her, For this saying go thy way; the devil is gone out of thy daughter. Chap. 7, Verse 29, [MAR].

And when she was come to her house, she found the devil gone out, and her daughter laid upon the bed. Chap. 7, Verse 30, [MAR].

And again, departing from the coasts of Tyre and Sidon, he came unto the sea of Galilee, through the midst of the coasts of Decapolis. Chap. 7, Verse 31, [MAR].

And they bring unto him one that was deaf, and had an impediment in his speech; and they beseech him to put his hand upon him. Chap. 7, Verse 32, [MAR].

And he took him aside from the multitude, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spit, and touched his tongue; Chap. 7, Verse 33, [MAR].

And looking up to heaven, he sighed, and saith unto him, Ephphatha, that is, Be opened. Chap. 7, Verse 34, [MAR].

And straightway his ears were opened, and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spake plain. Chap. 7, Verse 35, [MAR].

And he charged them that they should tell no man: but the more he charged them, so much the more a great deal they published [it]; Chap. 7, Verse 36, [MAR].

And were beyond measure astonished, saying, He hath done all things well: he maketh both the deaf to hear, and the dumb to speak. Chap. 7, Verse 37, [MAR].

In those days the multitude being very great, and having nothing to eat, Jesus called his disciples [unto him], and saith unto them, Chap. 8, Verse 1, [MAR].

I have compassion on the multitude, because they have now been with me three days, and have nothing to eat: Chap. 8, Verse 2, [MAR].

And if I send them away fasting to their own houses, they will faint by the way: for divers of them came from far. Chap. 8, Verse 3, [MAR].

And his disciples answered him, From whence can a man satisfy these [men] with bread here in the wilderness? Chap. 8, Verse 4, [MAR].

And he asked them, How many loaves have ye? And they said, Seven. Chap. 8, Verse 5, [MAR].

And he commanded the people to sit down on the ground: and he took the seven loaves, and gave thanks, and brake, and gave to his disciples to set before [them]; and they did set [them] before the people. Chap. 8, Verse 6, [MAR].

And they had a few small fishes: and he blessed, and commanded to set them also before [them]. Chap. 8, Verse 7, [MAR].

So they did eat, and were filled: and they took up of the broken [meat] that was left seven baskets. Chap. 8, Verse 8, [MAR].

And they that had eaten were about four thousand: and he sent them away. Chap. 8, Verse 9, [MAR].

And straightway he entered into a ship with his disciples, and came into the parts of Dalmanutha. Chap. 8, Verse 10, [MAR].

And the Pharisees came forth, and began to question with him, seeking of him a sign from heaven, tempting him. Chap. 8, Verse 11, [MAR].

And he sighed deeply in his spirit, and saith, Why doth this generation seek after a sign? verily I say unto you, There shall no sign be given unto this generation. Chap. 8, Verse 12, [MAR].

And he left them, and entering into the ship again departed to the other side. Chap. 8, Verse 13, [MAR].

Now [the disciples] had forgotten to take bread, neither had they in the ship with them more than one loaf. Chap. 8, Verse 14, [MAR].

And he charged them, saying, Take heed, beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, and [of] the leaven of Herod. Chap. 8, Verse 15, [MAR].

And they reasoned among themselves, saying, [It is] because we have no bread. Chap. 8, Verse 16, [MAR].

And when Jesus knew [it], he saith unto them, Why reason ye, because ye have no bread? perceive ye not yet, neither understand? have ye your heart yet hardened? Chap. 8, Verse 17, [MAR].

Having eyes, see ye not? and having ears, hear ye not? and do ye not remember? Chap. 8, Verse 18, [MAR].

When I brake the five loaves among five thousand, how many baskets full of fragments took ye up? They say unto him, Twelve. Chap. 8, Verse 19, [MAR].

And when the seven among four thousand, how many baskets full of fragments took ye up? And they said, Seven. Chap. 8, Verse 20, [MAR].

And he said unto them, How is it that ye do not understand? Chap. 8, Verse 21, [MAR].

And he cometh to Bethsaida; and they bring a blind man unto him, and besought him to touch him. Chap. 8, Verse 22, [MAR].

And he took the blind man by the hand, and led him out of the town; and when he had spit on his eyes, and put his hands upon him, he asked him if he saw ought. Chap. 8, Verse 23, [MAR].

And he looked up, and said, I see men as trees, walking. Chap. 8, Verse 24, [MAR].

After that he put [his] hands again upon his eyes, and made him look up: and he was restored, and saw every man clearly. Chap. 8, Verse 25, [MAR].

And he sent him away to his house, saying, Neither go into the town, nor tell [it] to any in the town. Chap. 8, Verse 26, [MAR].

And Jesus went out, and his disciples, into the towns of Caesarea Philippi: and by the way he asked his disciples, saying unto them, Whom do men say that I am? Chap. 8, Verse 27, [MAR].

And they answered, John the Baptist: but some [say], Elias; and others, One of the prophets. Chap. 8, Verse 28, [MAR].

And he saith unto them, But whom say ye that I am? And Peter answereth and saith unto him, Thou art the Christ. Chap. 8, Verse 29, [MAR].

And he charged them that they should tell no man of him. Chap. 8, Verse 30, [MAR].

And he began to teach them, that the Son of man must suffer many things, and be rejected of the elders, and [of] the chief priests, and scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. Chap. 8, Verse 31, [MAR].

And he spake that saying openly. And Peter took him, and began to rebuke him. Chap. 8, Verse 32, [MAR].

But when he had turned about and looked on his disciples, he rebuked Peter, saying, Get thee behind me, Satan: for thou savourest not the things that be of God, but the things that be of men. Chap. 8, Verse 33, [MAR].

And when he had called the people [unto him] with his disciples also, he said unto them, Whosoever will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me. Chap. 8, Verse 34, [MAR].

For whosoever will save his life shall lose it; but

whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospel's, the same shall save it. Chap. 8, Verse 35, [MAR].

For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Chap. 8, Verse 36, [MAR].

Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul? Chap. 8, Verse 37, [MAR].

Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels. Chap. 8, Verse 38, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you, That there be some of them that stand here, which shall not taste of death, till they have seen the kingdom of God come with power. Chap. 9, Verse 1, [MAR].

And after six days Jesus taketh [with him] Peter, and James, and John, and leadeth them up into an high mountain apart by themselves: and he was transfigured before them. Chap. 9, Verse 2, [MAR].

And his raiment became shining, exceeding white as snow; so as no fuller on earth can white them. Chap. 9, Verse 3, [MAR].

And there appeared unto them Elias with Moses: and they were talking with Jesus. Chap. 9, Verse 4, [MAR].

And Peter answered and said to Jesus, Master, it is good for us to be here: and let us make three tabernacles; one for thee, and one for Moses, and one for Elias. Chap. 9, Verse 5, [MAR].

For he wist not what to say; for they were sore afraid. Chap. 9, Verse 6, [MAR].

And there was a cloud that overshadowed them: and a voice came out of the cloud, saying, This is my beloved Son: hear him. Chap. 9, Verse 7, [MAR].

And suddenly, when they had looked round about, they saw no man any more, save Jesus only with themselves. Chap. 9, Verse 8, [MAR].

And as they came down from the mountain, he charged them that they should tell no man what things they had seen, till the Son of man were risen from the dead. Chap. 9, Verse 9, [MAR].

And they kept that saying with themselves, questioning one with another what the rising from the dead should mean. Chap. 9, Verse 10, [MAR].

And they asked him, saying, Why say the scribes that Elias must first come? Chap. 9, Verse 11, [MAR].

And he answered and told them, Elias verily cometh first, and restoreth all things; and how it is written of the Son of man, that he must suffer many things, and be set at nought. Chap. 9, Verse 12, [MAR].

But I say unto you, That Elias is indeed come, and they have done unto him whatsoever they listed, as it is written of him. Chap. 9, Verse 13, [MAR].

And when he came to [his] disciples, he saw a great multitude about them, and the scribes questioning with them. Chap. 9, Verse 14, [MAR].

And straightway all the people, when they beheld him, were greatly amazed, and running to [him] saluted him. Chap. 9, Verse 15, [MAR].

And he asked the scribes, What question ye with them? Chap. 9, Verse 16, [MAR].

And one of the multitude answered and said, Master, I have brought unto thee my son, which hath a dumb spirit; Chap. 9, Verse 17, [MAR].

And wheresoever he taketh him, he teareth him: and he foameth, and gnasheth with his teeth, and pineth away: and I spake to thy disciples that they should cast him out; and they could not. Chap. 9, Verse 18, [MAR].

He answereth him, and saith, O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you? bring him unto me. Chap. 9, Verse 19, [MAR].

And they brought him unto him: and when he saw him, straightway the spirit tare him; and he fell on the ground,

and wallowed foaming. Chap. 9, Verse 20, [MAR].

And he asked his father, How long is it ago since this came unto him? And he said, Of a child. Chap. 9, Verse 21, [MAR].

And oftentimes it hath cast him into the fire, and into the waters, to destroy him: but if thou canst do any thing, have compassion on us, and help us. Chap. 9, Verse 22, [MAR].

Jesus said unto him, If thou canst believe, all things [are] possible to him that believeth. Chap. 9, Verse 23, [MAR].

And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief. Chap. 9, Verse 24, [MAR].

When Jesus saw that the people came running together, he rebuked the foul spirit, saying unto him, [Thou] dumb and deaf spirit, I charge thee, come out of him, and enter no more into him. Chap. 9, Verse 25, [MAR].

And [the spirit] cried, and rent him sore, and came out of him: and he was as one dead; insomuch that many said, He is dead. Chap. 9, Verse 26, [MAR].

But Jesus took him by the hand, and lifted him up; and he arose. Chap. 9, Verse 27, [MAR].

And when he was come into the house, his disciples asked him privately, Why could not we cast him out? Chap. 9, Verse 28, [MAR].

And he said unto them, This kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting. Chap. 9, Verse 29, [MAR].

And they departed thence, and passed through Galilee; and he would not that any man should know [it]. Chap. 9, Verse 30, [MAR].

For he taught his disciples, and said unto them, The Son of man is delivered into the hands of men, and they shall kill him; and after that he is killed, he shall rise the third day. Chap. 9, Verse 31, [MAR].

But they understood not that saying, and were afraid to ask him. Chap. 9, Verse 32, [MAR].

And he came to Capernaum: and being in the house he asked them, What was it that ye disputed among yourselves by the way? Chap. 9, Verse 33, [MAR].

But they held their peace: for by the way they had disputed among themselves, who [should be] the greatest. Chap. 9, Verse 34, [MAR].

And he sat down, and called the twelve, and saith unto them, If any man desire to be first, [the same] shall be last of all, and servant of all. Chap. 9, Verse 35, [MAR].

And he took a child, and set him in the midst of them: and when he had taken him in his arms, he said unto them, Chap. 9, Verse 36, [MAR].

Whosoever shall receive one of such children in my name, receiveth me: and whosoever shall receive me, receiveth not me, but him that sent me. Chap. 9, Verse 37, [MAR].

And John answered him, saying, Master, we saw one casting out devils in thy name, and he followeth not us: and we forbad him, because he followeth not us. Chap. 9, Verse 38, [MAR].

But Jesus said, Forbid him not: for there is no man which shall do a miracle in my name, that can lightly speak evil of me. Chap. 9, Verse 39, [MAR].

For he that is not against us is on our part. Chap. 9, Verse 40, [MAR].

For whosoever shall give you a cup of water to drink in my name, because ye belong to Christ, verily I say unto you, he shall not lose his reward. Chap. 9, Verse 41, [MAR].

And whosoever shall offend one of [these] little ones that believe in me, it is better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and he were cast into the sea. Chap. 9, Verse 42, [MAR].

And if thy hand offend thee, cut it off: it is better for thee to enter into life maimed, than having two hands to go

into hell, into the fire that never shall be quenched:
Chap. 9, Verse 43, [MAR].

Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched.
Chap. 9, Verse 44, [MAR].

And if thy foot offend thee, cut it off: it is better for thee to enter halt into life, than having two feet to be cast into hell, into the fire that never shall be quenched:
Chap. 9, Verse 45, [MAR].

Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched.
Chap. 9, Verse 46, [MAR].

And if thine eye offend thee, pluck it out: it is better for thee to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than having two eyes to be cast into hell fire: Chap. 9, Verse 47, [MAR].

Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched.
Chap. 9, Verse 48, [MAR].

For every one shall be salted with fire, and every sacrifice shall be salted with salt. Chap. 9, Verse 49, [MAR].

Salt [is] good: but if the salt have lost his saltness, wherewith will ye season it? Have salt in yourselves, and have peace one with another. Chap. 9, Verse 50, [MAR].

And he arose from thence, and cometh into the coasts of Judaea by the farther side of Jordan: and the people resort unto him again; and, as he was wont, he taught them again.
Chap. 10, Verse 1, [MAR].

And the Pharisees came to him, and asked him, Is it lawful for a man to put away [his] wife? tempting him. Chap. 10, Verse 2, [MAR].

And he answered and said unto them, What did Moses command you? Chap. 10, Verse 3, [MAR].

And they said, Moses suffered to write a bill of divorcement, and to put [her] away. Chap. 10, Verse 4, [MAR].

And Jesus answered and said unto them, For the hardness of

your heart he wrote you this precept. Chap. 10, Verse 5, [MAR].

But from the beginning of the creation God made them male and female. Chap. 10, Verse 6, [MAR].

For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and cleave to his wife; Chap. 10, Verse 7, [MAR].

And they twain shall be one flesh: so then they are no more twain, but one flesh. Chap. 10, Verse 8, [MAR].

What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder. Chap. 10, Verse 9, [MAR].

And in the house his disciples asked him again of the same [matter]. Chap. 10, Verse 10, [MAR].

And he saith unto them, Whosoever shall put away his wife, and marry another, committeth adultery against her. Chap. 10, Verse 11, [MAR].

And if a woman shall put away her husband, and be married to another, she committeth adultery. Chap. 10, Verse 12, [MAR].

And they brought young children to him, that he should touch them: and [his] disciples rebuked those that brought [them]. Chap. 10, Verse 13, [MAR].

But when Jesus saw [it], he was much displeased, and said unto them, Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God. Chap. 10, Verse 14, [MAR].

Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein. Chap. 10, Verse 15, [MAR].

And he took them up in his arms, put [his] hands upon them, and blessed them. Chap. 10, Verse 16, [MAR].

And when he was gone forth into the way, there came one running, and kneeled to him, and asked him, Good Master, what shall I do that I may inherit eternal life? Chap. 10, Verse 17, [MAR].

And Jesus said unto him, Why callest thou me good? [there is] none good but one, [that is], God. Chap. 10, Verse 18, [MAR].

Thou knowest the commandments, Do not commit adultery, Do not kill, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Defraud not, Honour thy father and mother. Chap. 10, Verse 19, [MAR].

And he answered and said unto him, Master, all these have I observed from my youth. Chap. 10, Verse 20, [MAR].

Then Jesus beholding him loved him, and said unto him, One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me. Chap. 10, Verse 21, [MAR].

And he was sad at that saying, and went away grieved: for he had great possessions. Chap. 10, Verse 22, [MAR].

And Jesus looked round about, and saith unto his disciples, How hardly shall they that have riches enter into the kingdom of God! Chap. 10, Verse 23, [MAR].

And the disciples were astonished at his words. But Jesus answereth again, and saith unto them, Children, how hard is it for them that trust in riches to enter into the kingdom of God! Chap. 10, Verse 24, [MAR].

It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God. Chap. 10, Verse 25, [MAR].

And they were astonished out of measure, saying among themselves, Who then can be saved? Chap. 10, Verse 26, [MAR].

And Jesus looking upon them saith, With men [it is] impossible, but not with God: for with God all things are possible. Chap. 10, Verse 27, [MAR].

Then Peter began to say unto him, Lo, we have left all, and have followed thee. Chap. 10, Verse 28, [MAR].

And Jesus answered and said, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or brethren, or sisters, or

father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my sake, and the gospel's, Chap. 10, Verse 29, [MAR].

But he shall receive an hundredfold now in this time, houses, and brethren, and sisters, and mothers, and children, and lands, with persecutions; and in the world to come eternal life. Chap. 10, Verse 30, [MAR].

But many [that are] first shall be last; and the last first. Chap. 10, Verse 31, [MAR].

And they were in the way going up to Jerusalem; and Jesus went before them: and they were amazed; and as they followed, they were afraid. And he took again the twelve, and began to tell them what things should happen unto him, Chap. 10, Verse 32, [MAR].

[Saying], Behold, we go up to Jerusalem; and the Son of man shall be delivered unto the chief priests, and unto the scribes; and they shall condemn him to death, and shall deliver him to the Gentiles: Chap. 10, Verse 33, [MAR].

And they shall mock him, and shall scourge him, and shall spit upon him, and shall kill him: and the third day he shall rise again. Chap. 10, Verse 34, [MAR].

And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, come unto him, saying, Master, we would that thou shouldest do for us whatsoever we shall desire. Chap. 10, Verse 35, [MAR].

And he said unto them, What would ye that I should do for you? Chap. 10, Verse 36, [MAR].

They said unto him, Grant unto us that we may sit, one on thy right hand, and the other on thy left hand, in thy glory. Chap. 10, Verse 37, [MAR].

But Jesus said unto them, Ye know not what ye ask: can ye drink of the cup that I drink of? and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with? Chap. 10, Verse 38, [MAR].

And they said unto him, We can. And Jesus said unto them, Ye shall indeed drink of the cup that I drink of; and with the baptism that I am baptized withal shall ye be baptized: Chap. 10, Verse 39, [MAR].

But to sit on my right hand and on my left hand is not mine to give; but [it shall be given to them] for whom it is prepared. Chap. 10, Verse 40, [MAR].

And when the ten heard [it], they began to be much displeased with James and John. Chap. 10, Verse 41, [MAR].

But Jesus called them [to him], and saith unto them, Ye know that they which are accounted to rule over the Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and their great ones exercise authority upon them. Chap. 10, Verse 42, [MAR].

But so shall it not be among you: but whosoever will be great among you, shall be your minister: Chap. 10, Verse 43, [MAR].

And whosoever of you will be the chiefest, shall be servant of all. Chap. 10, Verse 44, [MAR].

For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many. Chap. 10, Verse 45, [MAR].

And they came to Jericho: and as he went out of Jericho with his disciples and a great number of people, blind Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, sat by the highway side begging. Chap. 10, Verse 46, [MAR].

And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out, and say, Jesus, [thou] son of David, have mercy on me. Chap. 10, Verse 47, [MAR].

And many charged him that he should hold his peace: but he cried the more a great deal, [Thou] son of David, have mercy on me. Chap. 10, Verse 48, [MAR].

And Jesus stood still, and commanded him to be called. And they call the blind man, saying unto him, Be of good comfort, rise; he calleth thee. Chap. 10, Verse 49, [MAR].

And he, casting away his garment, rose, and came to Jesus. Chap. 10, Verse 50, [MAR].

And Jesus answered and said unto him, What wilt thou that I should do unto thee? The blind man said unto him, Lord, that I might receive my sight. Chap. 10, Verse 51, [MAR].

And Jesus said unto him, Go thy way; thy faith hath made thee whole. And immediately he received his sight, and followed Jesus in the way. Chap. 10, Verse 52, [MAR].

And when they came nigh to Jerusalem, unto Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount of Olives, he sendeth forth two of his disciples, Chap. 11, Verse 1, [MAR].

And saith unto them, Go your way into the village over against you: and as soon as ye be entered into it, ye shall find a colt tied, whereon never man sat; loose him, and bring [him]. Chap. 11, Verse 2, [MAR].

And if any man say unto you, Why do ye this? say ye that the Lord hath need of him; and straightway he will send him hither. Chap. 11, Verse 3, [MAR].

And they went their way, and found the colt tied by the door without in a place where two ways met; and they loose him. Chap. 11, Verse 4, [MAR].

And certain of them that stood there said unto them, What do ye, loosing the colt? Chap. 11, Verse 5, [MAR].

And they said unto them even as Jesus had commanded: and they let them go. Chap. 11, Verse 6, [MAR].

And they brought the colt to Jesus, and cast their garments on him; and he sat upon him. Chap. 11, Verse 7, [MAR].

And many spread their garments in the way: and others cut down branches off the trees, and strawed [them] in the way. Chap. 11, Verse 8, [MAR].

And they that went before, and they that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna; Blessed [is] he that cometh in the name of the Lord: Chap. 11, Verse 9, [MAR].

Blessed [be] the kingdom of our father David, that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest. Chap. 11, Verse 10, [MAR].

And Jesus entered into Jerusalem, and into the temple: and when he had looked round about upon all things, and now the eventide was come, he went out unto Bethany with the twelve. Chap. 11, Verse 11, [MAR].

And on the morrow, when they were come from Bethany, he was hungry: Chap. 11, Verse 12, [MAR].

And seeing a fig tree afar off having leaves, he came, if haply he might find any thing thereon: and when he came to it, he found nothing but leaves; for the time of figs was not [yet]. Chap. 11, Verse 13, [MAR].

And Jesus answered and said unto it, No man eat fruit of thee hereafter for ever. And his disciples heard [it]. Chap. 11, Verse 14, [MAR].

And they come to Jerusalem: and Jesus went into the temple, and began to cast out them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the moneychangers, and the seats of them that sold doves; Chap. 11, Verse 15, [MAR].

And would not suffer that any man should carry [any] vessel through the temple. Chap. 11, Verse 16, [MAR].

And he taught, saying unto them, Is it not written, My house shall be called of all nations the house of prayer? but ye have made it a den of thieves. Chap. 11, Verse 17, [MAR].

And the scribes and chief priests heard [it], and sought how they might destroy him: for they feared him, because all the people was astonished at his doctrine. Chap. 11, Verse 18, [MAR].

And when even was come, he went out of the city. Chap. 11, Verse 19, [MAR].

And in the morning, as they passed by, they saw the fig tree dried up from the roots. Chap. 11, Verse 20, [MAR].

And Peter calling to remembrance saith unto him, Master, behold, the fig tree which thou cursedst is withered away. Chap. 11, Verse 21, [MAR].

And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. Chap. 11, Verse 22, [MAR].

For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the

sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. Chap. 11, Verse 23, [MAR].

Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive [them], and ye shall have [them]. Chap. 11, Verse 24, [MAR].

And when ye stand praying, forgive, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses. Chap. 11, Verse 25, [MAR].

But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father which is in heaven forgive your trespasses. Chap. 11, Verse 26, [MAR].

And they come again to Jerusalem: and as he was walking in the temple, there come to him the chief priests, and the scribes, and the elders, Chap. 11, Verse 27, [MAR].

And say unto him, By what authority doest thou these things? and who gave thee this authority to do these things? Chap. 11, Verse 28, [MAR].

And Jesus answered and said unto them, I will also ask of you one question, and answer me, and I will tell you by what authority I do these things. Chap. 11, Verse 29, [MAR].

The baptism of John, was [it] from heaven, or of men? answer me. Chap. 11, Verse 30, [MAR].

And they reasoned with themselves, saying, If we shall say, From heaven; he will say, Why then did ye not believe him? Chap. 11, Verse 31, [MAR].

But if we shall say, Of men; they feared the people: for all [men] counted John, that he was a prophet indeed. Chap. 11, Verse 32, [MAR].

And they answered and said unto Jesus, We cannot tell. And Jesus answering saith unto them, Neither do I tell you by what authority I do these things. Chap. 11, Verse 33, [MAR].

And he began to speak unto them by parables. A [certain] man planted a vineyard, and set an hedge about [it], and

digged [a place for] the winefat, and built a tower, and let it out to husbandmen, and went into a far country. Chap. 12, Verse 1, [MAR].

And at the season he sent to the husbandmen a servant, that he might receive from the husbandmen of the fruit of the vineyard. Chap. 12, Verse 2, [MAR].

And they caught [him], and beat him, and sent [him] away empty. Chap. 12, Verse 3, [MAR].

And again he sent unto them another servant; and at him they cast stones, and wounded [him] in the head, and sent [him] away shamefully handled. Chap. 12, Verse 4, [MAR].

And again he sent another; and him they killed, and many others; beating some, and killing some. Chap. 12, Verse 5, [MAR].

Having yet therefore one son, his wellbeloved, he sent him also last unto them, saying, They will reverence my son. Chap. 12, Verse 6, [MAR].

But those husbandmen said among themselves, This is the heir; come, let us kill him, and the inheritance shall be our's. Chap. 12, Verse 7, [MAR].

And they took him, and killed [him], and cast [him] out of the vineyard. Chap. 12, Verse 8, [MAR].

What shall therefore the lord of the vineyard do? he will come and destroy the husbandmen, and will give the vineyard unto others. Chap. 12, Verse 9, [MAR].

And have ye not read this scripture; The stone which the builders rejected is become the head of the corner: Chap. 12, Verse 10, [MAR].

This was the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes? Chap. 12, Verse 11, [MAR].

And they sought to lay hold on him, but feared the people: for they knew that he had spoken the parable against them: and they left him, and went their way. Chap. 12, Verse 12, [MAR].

And they send unto him certain of the Pharisees and of the

Herodians, to catch him in [his] words. Chap. 12, Verse 13, [MAR].

And when they were come, they say unto him, Master, we know that thou art true, and carest for no man: for thou regardest not the person of men, but teachest the way of God in truth: Is it lawful to give tribute to Caesar, or not? Chap. 12, Verse 14, [MAR].

Shall we give, or shall we not give? But he, knowing their hypocrisy, said unto them, Why tempt ye me? bring me a penny, that I may see [it]. Chap. 12, Verse 15, [MAR].

And they brought [it]. And he saith unto them, Whose [is] this image and superscription? And they said unto him, Caesar's. Chap. 12, Verse 16, [MAR].

And Jesus answering said unto them, Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's. And they marvelled at him. Chap. 12, Verse 17, [MAR].

Then come unto him the Sadducees, which say there is no resurrection; and they asked him, saying, Chap. 12, Verse 18, [MAR].

Master, Moses wrote unto us, If a man's brother die, and leave [his] wife [behind him], and leave no children, that his brother should take his wife, and raise up seed unto his brother. Chap. 12, Verse 19, [MAR].

Now there were seven brethren: and the first took a wife, and dying left no seed. Chap. 12, Verse 20, [MAR].

And the second took her, and died, neither left he any seed: and the third likewise. Chap. 12, Verse 21, [MAR].

And the seven had her, and left no seed: last of all the woman died also. Chap. 12, Verse 22, [MAR].

In the resurrection therefore, when they shall rise, whose wife shall she be of them? for the seven had her to wife. Chap. 12, Verse 23, [MAR].

And Jesus answering said unto them, Do ye not therefore err, because ye know not the scriptures, neither the power of God? Chap. 12, Verse 24, [MAR].

For when they shall rise from the dead, they neither marry, nor are given in marriage; but are as the angels which are in heaven. Chap. 12, Verse 25, [MAR].

And as touching the dead, that they rise: have ye not read in the book of Moses, how in the bush God spake unto him, saying, I [am] the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob? Chap. 12, Verse 26, [MAR].

He is not the God of the dead, but the God of the living: ye therefore do greatly err. Chap. 12, Verse 27, [MAR].

And one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together, and perceiving that he had answered them well, asked him, Which is the first commandment of all? Chap. 12, Verse 28, [MAR].

And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments [is], Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord: Chap. 12, Verse 29, [MAR].

And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this [is] the first commandment. Chap. 12, Verse 30, [MAR].

And the second [is] like, [namely] this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these. Chap. 12, Verse 31, [MAR].

And the scribe said unto him, Well, Master, thou hast said the truth: for there is one God; and there is none other but he: Chap. 12, Verse 32, [MAR].

And to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love [his] neighbour as himself, is more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices. Chap. 12, Verse 33, [MAR].

And when Jesus saw that he answered discreetly, he said unto him, Thou art not far from the kingdom of God. And no man after that durst ask him [any question]. Chap. 12, Verse 34, [MAR].

And Jesus answered and said, while he taught in the

temple, How say the scribes that Christ is the son of David? Chap. 12, Verse 35, [MAR].

For David himself said by the Holy Ghost, The Lord said to my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand, till I make thine enemies thy footstool. Chap. 12, Verse 36, [MAR].

David therefore himself calleth him Lord; and whence is he [then] his son? And the common people heard him gladly. Chap. 12, Verse 37, [MAR].

And he said unto them in his doctrine, Beware of the scribes, which love to go in long clothing, and [love] salutations in the marketplaces, Chap. 12, Verse 38, [MAR].

And the chief seats in the synagogues, and the uppermost rooms at feasts: Chap. 12, Verse 39, [MAR].

Which devour widows' houses, and for a pretence make long prayers: these shall receive greater damnation. Chap. 12, Verse 40, [MAR].

And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much. Chap. 12, Verse 41, [MAR].

And there came a certain poor widow, and she threw in two mites, which make a farthing. Chap. 12, Verse 42, [MAR].

And he called [unto him] his disciples, and saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: Chap. 12, Verse 43, [MAR].

For all [they] did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, [even] all her living. Chap. 12, Verse 44, [MAR].

And as he went out of the temple, one of his disciples saith unto him, Master, see what manner of stones and what buildings [are here]! Chap. 13, Verse 1, [MAR].

And Jesus answering said unto him, Seest thou these great buildings? there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down. Chap. 13, Verse 2, [MAR].

And as he sat upon the mount of Olives over against the temple, Peter and James and John and Andrew asked him privately, Chap. 13, Verse 3, [MAR].

Tell us, when shall these things be? and what [shall be] the sign when all these things shall be fulfilled? Chap. 13, Verse 4, [MAR].

And Jesus answering them began to say, Take heed lest any [man] deceive you: Chap. 13, Verse 5, [MAR].

For many shall come in my name, saying, I am [Christ]; and shall deceive many. Chap. 13, Verse 6, [MAR].

And when ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars, be ye not troubled: for [such things] must needs be; but the end [shall] not [be] yet. Chap. 13, Verse 7, [MAR].

For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: and there shall be earthquakes in divers places, and there shall be famines and troubles: these [are] the beginnings of sorrows. Chap. 13, Verse 8, [MAR].

But take heed to yourselves: for they shall deliver you up to councils; and in the synagogues ye shall be beaten: and ye shall be brought before rulers and kings for my sake, for a testimony against them. Chap. 13, Verse 9, [MAR].

And the gospel must first be published among all nations. Chap. 13, Verse 10, [MAR].

But when they shall lead [you], and deliver you up, take no thought beforehand what ye shall speak, neither do ye premeditate: but whatsoever shall be given you in that hour, that speak ye: for it is not ye that speak, but the Holy Ghost. Chap. 13, Verse 11, [MAR].

Now the brother shall betray the brother to death, and the father the son; and children shall rise up against [their] parents, and shall cause them to be put to death. Chap. 13, Verse 12, [MAR].

And ye shall be hated of all [men] for my name's sake: but he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved. Chap. 13, Verse 13, [MAR].

But when ye shall see the abomination of desolation,

spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing where it ought not, (let him that readeth understand,) then let them that be in Judaea flee to the mountains: Chap. 13, Verse 14, [MAR].

And let him that is on the housetop not go down into the house, neither enter [therein], to take any thing out of his house: Chap. 13, Verse 15, [MAR].

And let him that is in the field not turn back again for to take up his garment. Chap. 13, Verse 16, [MAR].

But woe to them that are with child, and to them that give suck in those days! Chap. 13, Verse 17, [MAR].

And pray ye that your flight be not in the winter. Chap. 13, Verse 18, [MAR].

For [in] those days shall be affliction, such as was not from the beginning of the creation which God created unto this time, neither shall be. Chap. 13, Verse 19, [MAR].

And except that the Lord had shortened those days, no flesh should be saved: but for the elect's sake, whom he hath chosen, he hath shortened the days. Chap. 13, Verse 20, [MAR].

And then if any man shall say to you, Lo, here [is] Christ; or, lo, [he is] there; believe [him] not: Chap. 13, Verse 21, [MAR].

For false Christs and false prophets shall rise, and shall shew signs and wonders, to seduce, if [it were] possible, even the elect. Chap. 13, Verse 22, [MAR].

But take ye heed: behold, I have foretold you all things. Chap. 13, Verse 23, [MAR].

But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun shall be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, Chap. 13, Verse 24, [MAR].

And the stars of heaven shall fall, and the powers that are in heaven shall be shaken. Chap. 13, Verse 25, [MAR].

And then shall they see the Son of man coming in the clouds with great power and glory. Chap. 13, Verse 26,

[MAR].

And then shall he send his angels, and shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from the uttermost part of the earth to the uttermost part of heaven. Chap. 13, Verse 27, [MAR].

Now learn a parable of the fig tree; When her branch is yet tender, and putteth forth leaves, ye know that summer is near: Chap. 13, Verse 28, [MAR].

So ye in like manner, when ye shall see these things come to pass, know that it is nigh, [even] at the doors. Chap. 13, Verse 29, [MAR].

Verily I say unto you, that this generation shall not pass, till all these things be done. Chap. 13, Verse 30, [MAR].

Heaven and earth shall pass away: but my words shall not pass away. Chap. 13, Verse 31, [MAR].

But of that day and [that] hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels which are in heaven, neither the Son, but the Father. Chap. 13, Verse 32, [MAR].

Take ye heed, watch and pray: for ye know not when the time is. Chap. 13, Verse 33, [MAR].

[For the Son of man is] as a man taking a far journey, who left his house, and gave authority to his servants, and to every man his work, and commanded the porter to watch. Chap. 13, Verse 34, [MAR].

Watch ye therefore: for ye know not when the master of the house cometh, at even, or at midnight, or at the cockcrowing, or in the morning: Chap. 13, Verse 35, [MAR].

Lest coming suddenly he find you sleeping. Chap. 13, Verse 36, [MAR].

And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch. Chap. 13, Verse 37, [MAR].

After two days was [the feast of] the passover, and of unleavened bread: and the chief priests and the scribes sought how they might take him by craft, and put [him] to

death. Chap. 14, Verse 1, [MAR].

But they said, Not on the feast [day], lest there be an uproar of the people. Chap. 14, Verse 2, [MAR].

And being in Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at meat, there came a woman having an alabaster box of ointment of spikenard very precious; and she brake the box, and poured [it] on his head. Chap. 14, Verse 3, [MAR].

And there were some that had indignation within themselves, and said, Why was this waste of the ointment made? Chap. 14, Verse 4, [MAR].

For it might have been sold for more than three hundred pence, and have been given to the poor. And they murmured against her. Chap. 14, Verse 5, [MAR].

And Jesus said, Let her alone; why trouble ye her? she hath wrought a good work on me. Chap. 14, Verse 6, [MAR].

For ye have the poor with you always, and whensoever ye will ye may do them good: but me ye have not always. Chap. 14, Verse 7, [MAR].

She hath done what she could: she is come aforehand to anoint my body to the burying. Chap. 14, Verse 8, [MAR].

Verily I say unto you, Wheresoever this gospel shall be preached throughout the whole world, [this] also that she hath done shall be spoken of for a memorial of her. Chap. 14, Verse 9, [MAR].

And Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve, went unto the chief priests, to betray him unto them. Chap. 14, Verse 10, [MAR].

And when they heard [it], they were glad, and promised to give him money. And he sought how he might conveniently betray him. Chap. 14, Verse 11, [MAR].

And the first day of unleavened bread, when they killed the passover, his disciples said unto him, Where wilt thou that we go and prepare that thou mayest eat the passover? Chap. 14, Verse 12, [MAR].

And he sendeth forth two of his disciples, and saith unto them, Go ye into the city, and there shall meet you a man bearing a pitcher of water: follow him. Chap. 14, Verse 13, [MAR].

And wheresoever he shall go in, say ye to the goodman of the house, The Master saith, Where is the guestchamber, where I shall eat the passover with my disciples? Chap. 14, Verse 14, [MAR].

And he will shew you a large upper room furnished [and] prepared: there make ready for us. Chap. 14, Verse 15, [MAR].

And his disciples went forth, and came into the city, and found as he had said unto them: and they made ready the passover. Chap. 14, Verse 16, [MAR].

And in the evening he cometh with the twelve. Chap. 14, Verse 17, [MAR].

And as they sat and did eat, Jesus said, Verily I say unto you, One of you which eateth with me shall betray me. Chap. 14, Verse 18, [MAR].

And they began to be sorrowful, and to say unto him one by one, [Is] it I? and another [said, Is] it I? Chap. 14, Verse 19, [MAR].

And he answered and said unto them, [It is] one of the twelve, that dippeth with me in the dish. Chap. 14, Verse 20, [MAR].

The Son of man indeed goeth, as it is written of him: but woe to that man by whom the Son of man is betrayed! good were it for that man if he had never been born. Chap. 14, Verse 21, [MAR].

And as they did eat, Jesus took bread, and blessed, and brake [it], and gave to them, and said, Take, eat: this is my body. Chap. 14, Verse 22, [MAR].

And he took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave [it] to them: and they all drank of it. Chap. 14, Verse 23, [MAR].

And he said unto them, This is my blood of the new

testament, which is shed for many. Chap. 14, Verse 24, [MAR].

Verily I say unto you, I will drink no more of the fruit of the vine, until that day that I drink it new in the kingdom of God. Chap. 14, Verse 25, [MAR].

And when they had sung an hymn, they went out into the mount of Olives. Chap. 14, Verse 26, [MAR].

And Jesus saith unto them, All ye shall be offended because of me this night: for it is written, I will smite the shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered. Chap. 14, Verse 27, [MAR].

But after that I am risen, I will go before you into Galilee. Chap. 14, Verse 28, [MAR].

But Peter said unto him, Although all shall be offended, yet [will] not I. Chap. 14, Verse 29, [MAR].

And Jesus saith unto him, Verily I say unto thee, That this day, [even] in this night, before the cock crow twice, thou shalt deny me thrice. Chap. 14, Verse 30, [MAR].

But he spake the more vehemently, If I should die with thee, I will not deny thee in any wise. Likewise also said they all. Chap. 14, Verse 31, [MAR].

And they came to a place which was named Gethsemane: and he saith to his disciples, Sit ye here, while I shall pray. Chap. 14, Verse 32, [MAR].

And he taketh with him Peter and James and John, and began to be sore amazed, and to be very heavy; Chap. 14, Verse 33, [MAR].

And saith unto them, My soul is exceeding sorrowful unto death: tarry ye here, and watch. Chap. 14, Verse 34, [MAR].

And he went forward a little, and fell on the ground, and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. Chap. 14, Verse 35, [MAR].

And he said, Abba, Father, all things [are] possible unto thee; take away this cup from me: nevertheless not what I

will, but what thou wilt. Chap. 14, Verse 36, [MAR].

And he cometh, and findeth them sleeping, and saith unto Peter, Simon, sleepest thou? couldst not thou watch one hour? Chap. 14, Verse 37, [MAR].

Watch ye and pray, lest ye enter into temptation. The spirit truly [is] ready, but the flesh [is] weak. Chap. 14, Verse 38, [MAR].

And again he went away, and prayed, and spake the same words. Chap. 14, Verse 39, [MAR].

And when he returned, he found them asleep again, (for their eyes were heavy,) neither wist they what to answer him. Chap. 14, Verse 40, [MAR].

And he cometh the third time, and saith unto them, Sleep on now, and take [your] rest: it is enough, the hour is come; behold, the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Chap. 14, Verse 41, [MAR].

Rise up, let us go; lo, he that betrayeth me is at hand. Chap. 14, Verse 42, [MAR].

And immediately, while he yet spake, cometh Judas, one of the twelve, and with him a great multitude with swords and staves, from the chief priests and the scribes and the elders. Chap. 14, Verse 43, [MAR].

And he that betrayed him had given them a token, saying, Whomsoever I shall kiss, that same is he; take him, and lead [him] away safely. Chap. 14, Verse 44, [MAR].

And as soon as he was come, he goeth straightway to him, and saith, Master, master; and kissed him. Chap. 14, Verse 45, [MAR].

And they laid their hands on him, and took him. Chap. 14, Verse 46, [MAR].

And one of them that stood by drew a sword, and smote a servant of the high priest, and cut off his ear. Chap. 14, Verse 47, [MAR].

And Jesus answered and said unto them, Are ye come out, as against a thief, with swords and [with] staves to take me?

Chap. 14, Verse 48, [MAR].

I was daily with you in the temple teaching, and ye took me not: but the scriptures must be fulfilled. Chap. 14, Verse 49, [MAR].

And they all forsook him, and fled. Chap. 14, Verse 50, [MAR].

And there followed him a certain young man, having a linen cloth cast about [his] naked [body]; and the young men laid hold on him: Chap. 14, Verse 51, [MAR].

And he left the linen cloth, and fled from them naked. Chap. 14, Verse 52, [MAR].

And they led Jesus away to the high priest: and with him were assembled all the chief priests and the elders and the scribes. Chap. 14, Verse 53, [MAR].

And Peter followed him afar off, even into the palace of the high priest: and he sat with the servants, and warmed himself at the fire. Chap. 14, Verse 54, [MAR].

And the chief priests and all the council sought for witness against Jesus to put him to death; and found none. Chap. 14, Verse 55, [MAR].

For many bare false witness against him, but their witness agreed not together. Chap. 14, Verse 56, [MAR].

And there arose certain, and bare false witness against him, saying, Chap. 14, Verse 57, [MAR].

We heard him say, I will destroy this temple that is made with hands, and within three days I will build another made without hands. Chap. 14, Verse 58, [MAR].

But neither so did their witness agree together. Chap. 14, Verse 59, [MAR].

And the high priest stood up in the midst, and asked Jesus, saying, Answerest thou nothing? what [is it which] these witness against thee? Chap. 14, Verse 60, [MAR].

But he held his peace, and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked him, and said unto him, Art thou the

Christ, the Son of the Blessed? Chap. 14, Verse 61, [MAR].

And Jesus said, I am: and ye shall see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven. Chap. 14, Verse 62, [MAR].

Then the high priest rent his clothes, and saith, What need we any further witnesses? Chap. 14, Verse 63, [MAR].

Ye have heard the blasphemy: what think ye? And they all condemned him to be guilty of death. Chap. 14, Verse 64, [MAR].

And some began to spit on him, and to cover his face, and to buffet him, and to say unto him, Prophecy: and the servants did strike him with the palms of their hands. Chap. 14, Verse 65, [MAR].

And as Peter was beneath in the palace, there cometh one of the maids of the high priest: Chap. 14, Verse 66, [MAR].

And when she saw Peter warming himself, she looked upon him, and said, And thou also wast with Jesus of Nazareth. Chap. 14, Verse 67, [MAR].

But he denied, saying, I know not, neither understand I what thou sayest. And he went out into the porch; and the cock crew. Chap. 14, Verse 68, [MAR].

And a maid saw him again, and began to say to them that stood by, This is [one] of them. Chap. 14, Verse 69, [MAR].

And he denied it again. And a little after, they that stood by said again to Peter, Surely thou art [one] of them: for thou art a Galilaean, and thy speech agreeth [thereto]. Chap. 14, Verse 70, [MAR].

But he began to curse and to swear, [saying], I know not this man of whom ye speak. Chap. 14, Verse 71, [MAR].

And the second time the cock crew. And Peter called to mind the word that Jesus said unto him, Before the cock crow twice, thou shalt deny me thrice. And when he thought thereon, he wept. Chap. 14, Verse 72, [MAR].

And straightway in the morning the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council, and bound Jesus, and carried [him] away, and delivered [him] to Pilate. Chap. 15, Verse 1, [MAR].

And Pilate asked him, Art thou the King of the Jews? And he answering said unto him, Thou sayest [it]. Chap. 15, Verse 2, [MAR].

And the chief priests accused him of many things: but he answered nothing. Chap. 15, Verse 3, [MAR].

And Pilate asked him again, saying, Answerest thou nothing? behold how many things they witness against thee. Chap. 15, Verse 4, [MAR].

But Jesus yet answered nothing; so that Pilate marvelled. Chap. 15, Verse 5, [MAR].

Now at [that] feast he released unto them one prisoner, whomsoever they desired. Chap. 15, Verse 6, [MAR].

And there was [one] named Barabbas, [which lay] bound with them that had made insurrection with him, who had committed murder in the insurrection. Chap. 15, Verse 7, [MAR].

And the multitude crying aloud began to desire [him to do] as he had ever done unto them. Chap. 15, Verse 8, [MAR].

But Pilate answered them, saying, Will ye that I release unto you the King of the Jews? Chap. 15, Verse 9, [MAR].

For he knew that the chief priests had delivered him for envy. Chap. 15, Verse 10, [MAR].

But the chief priests moved the people, that he should rather release Barabbas unto them. Chap. 15, Verse 11, [MAR].

And Pilate answered and said again unto them, What will ye then that I shall do [unto him] whom ye call the King of the Jews? Chap. 15, Verse 12, [MAR].

And they cried out again, Crucify him. Chap. 15, Verse 13, [MAR].

Then Pilate said unto them, Why, what evil hath he done?

And they cried out the more exceedingly, Crucify him.
Chap. 15, Verse 14, [MAR].

And [so] Pilate, willing to content the people, released Barabbas unto them, and delivered Jesus, when he had scourged [him], to be crucified. Chap. 15, Verse 15, [MAR].

And the soldiers led him away into the hall, called Praetorium; and they call together the whole band. Chap. 15, Verse 16, [MAR].

And they clothed him with purple, and platted a crown of thorns, and put it about his [head], Chap. 15, Verse 17, [MAR].

And began to salute him, Hail, King of the Jews! Chap. 15, Verse 18, [MAR].

And they smote him on the head with a reed, and did spit upon him, and bowing [their] knees worshipped him. Chap. 15, Verse 19, [MAR].

And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple from him, and put his own clothes on him, and led him out to crucify him. Chap. 15, Verse 20, [MAR].

And they compel one Simon a Cyrenian, who passed by, coming out of the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to bear his cross. Chap. 15, Verse 21, [MAR].

And they bring him unto the place Golgotha, which is, being interpreted, The place of a skull. Chap. 15, Verse 22, [MAR].

And they gave him to drink wine mingled with myrrh: but he received [it] not. Chap. 15, Verse 23, [MAR].

And when they had crucified him, they parted his garments, casting lots upon them, what every man should take. Chap. 15, Verse 24, [MAR].

And it was the third hour, and they crucified him. Chap. 15, Verse 25, [MAR].

And the superscription of his accusation was written over, THE KING OF THE JEWS. Chap. 15, Verse 26, [MAR].

And with him they crucify two thieves; the one on his right hand, and the other on his left. Chap. 15, Verse 27, [MAR].

And the scripture was fulfilled, which saith, And he was numbered with the transgressors. Chap. 15, Verse 28, [MAR].

And they that passed by railed on him, wagging their heads, and saying, Ah, thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest [it] in three days, Chap. 15, Verse 29, [MAR].

Save thyself, and come down from the cross. Chap. 15, Verse 30, [MAR].

Likewise also the chief priests mocking said among themselves with the scribes, He saved others; himself he cannot save. Chap. 15, Verse 31, [MAR].

Let Christ the King of Israel descend now from the cross, that we may see and believe. And they that were crucified with him reviled him. Chap. 15, Verse 32, [MAR].

And when the sixth hour was come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. Chap. 15, Verse 33, [MAR].

And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani? which is, being interpreted, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? Chap. 15, Verse 34, [MAR].

And some of them that stood by, when they heard [it], said, Behold, he calleth Elias. Chap. 15, Verse 35, [MAR].

And one ran and filled a sponge full of vinegar, and put [it] on a reed, and gave him to drink, saying, Let alone; let us see whether Elias will come to take him down. Chap. 15, Verse 36, [MAR].

And Jesus cried with a loud voice, and gave up the ghost. Chap. 15, Verse 37, [MAR].

And the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom. Chap. 15, Verse 38, [MAR].

And when the centurion, which stood over against him, saw that he so cried out, and gave up the ghost, he said, Truly this man was the Son of God. Chap. 15, Verse 39, [MAR].

There were also women looking on afar off: among whom was Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the less and of Joses, and Salome; Chap. 15, Verse 40, [MAR].

(Who also, when he was in Galilee, followed him, and ministered unto him;) and many other women which came up with him unto Jerusalem. Chap. 15, Verse 41, [MAR].

And now when the even was come, because it was the preparation, that is, the day before the sabbath, Chap. 15, Verse 42, [MAR].

Joseph of Arimathaea, an honourable counsellor, which also waited for the kingdom of God, came, and went in boldly unto Pilate, and craved the body of Jesus. Chap. 15, Verse 43, [MAR].

And Pilate marvelled if he were already dead: and calling [unto him] the centurion, he asked him whether he had been any while dead. Chap. 15, Verse 44, [MAR].

And when he knew [it] of the centurion, he gave the body to Joseph. Chap. 15, Verse 45, [MAR].

And he bought fine linen, and took him down, and wrapped him in the linen, and laid him in a sepulchre which was hewn out of a rock, and rolled a stone unto the door of the sepulchre. Chap. 15, Verse 46, [MAR].

And Mary Magdalene and Mary [the mother] of Joses beheld where he was laid. Chap. 15, Verse 47, [MAR].

And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the [mother] of James, and Salome, had bought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him. Chap. 16, Verse 1, [MAR].

And very early in the morning the first [day] of the week, they came unto the sepulchre at the rising of the sun. Chap. 16, Verse 2, [MAR].

And they said among themselves, Who shall roll us away the stone from the door of the sepulchre? Chap. 16, Verse 3,

[MAR].

And when they looked, they saw that the stone was rolled away: for it was very great. Chap. 16, Verse 4, [MAR].

And entering into the sepulchre, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a long white garment; and they were affrighted. Chap. 16, Verse 5, [MAR].

And he saith unto them, Be not affrighted: Ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified: he is risen; he is not here: behold the place where they laid him. Chap. 16, Verse 6, [MAR].

But go your way, tell his disciples and Peter that he goeth before you into Galilee: there shall ye see him, as he said unto you. Chap. 16, Verse 7, [MAR].

And they went out quickly, and fled from the sepulchre; for they trembled and were amazed: neither said they any thing to any [man]; for they were afraid. Chap. 16, Verse 8, [MAR].

Now when [Jesus] was risen early the first [day] of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast seven devils. Chap. 16, Verse 9, [MAR].

[And] she went and told them that had been with him, as they mourned and wept. Chap. 16, Verse 10, [MAR].

And they, when they had heard that he was alive, and had been seen of her, believed not. Chap. 16, Verse 11, [MAR].

After that he appeared in another form unto two of them, as they walked, and went into the country. Chap. 16, Verse 12, [MAR].

And they went and told [it] unto the residue: neither believed they them. Chap. 16, Verse 13, [MAR].

Afterward he appeared unto the eleven as they sat at meat, and upbraided them with their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they believed not them which had seen him after he was risen. Chap. 16, Verse 14, [MAR].

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. Chap. 16, Verse 15,

[MAR].

He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. Chap. 16, Verse 16, [MAR].

And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; Chap. 16, Verse 17, [MAR].

They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover. Chap. 16, Verse 18, [MAR].

So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God. Chap. 16, Verse 19, [MAR].

And they went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with [them], and confirming the word with signs following. Amen. Chap. 16, Verse 20, [MAR].
