Paul and Timotheus, the servants of Jesus Christ, to all the saints in Christ Jesus which are at Philippi, with the bishops and deacons: Chap. 1, Verse 1, [PHI].

Grace [be] unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and [from] the Lord Jesus Christ. Chap. 1, Verse 2, [PHI].

I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, Chap. 1, Verse 3, [PHI].

Always in every prayer of mine for you all making request with joy, Chap. 1, Verse 4, [PHI].

For your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now; Chap. 1, Verse 5, [PHI].

Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform [it] until the day of Jesus Christ: Chap. 1, Verse 6, [PHI].

Even as it is meet for me to think this of you all, because I have you in my heart; inasmuch as both in my bonds, and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel, ye all are partakers of my grace. Chap. 1, Verse 7, [PHI].

For God is my record, how greatly I long after you all in the bowels of Jesus Christ. Chap. 1, Verse 8, [PHI].

And this I pray, that your love may abound yet more and more in knowledge and [in] all judgment; Chap. 1, Verse 9, [PHI].

That ye may approve things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and without offence till the day of Christ; Chap. 1, Verse 10, [PHI].

Being filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God. Chap. 1, Verse 11, [PHI].

But I would ye should understand, brethren, that the things [which happened] unto me have fallen out rather unto the furtherance of the gospel; Chap. 1, Verse 12, [PHI].

So that my bonds in Christ are manifest in all the palace, and in all other [places]; Chap. 1, Verse 13, [PHI].

And many of the brethren in the Lord, waxing confident by my bonds, are much more bold to speak the word without fear. Chap. 1, Verse 14, [PHI].

Some indeed preach Christ even of envy and strife; and some also of good will: Chap. 1, Verse 15, [PHI].

The one preach Christ of contention, not sincerely, supposing to add affliction to my bonds: Chap. 1, Verse 16, [PHI].

But the other of love, knowing that I am set for the defence of the gospel. Chap. 1, Verse 17, [PHI].

What then? notwithstanding, every way, whether in pretence, or in truth, Christ is preached; and I therein do rejoice, yea, and will rejoice. Chap. 1, Verse 18, [PHI].

For I know that this shall turn to my salvation through your prayer, and the supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, Chap. 1, Verse 19, [PHI].

According to my earnest expectation and [my] hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but [that] with all boldness, as always, [so] now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether [it be] by life, or by death. Chap. 1, Verse 20, [PHI].

For to me to live [is] Christ, and to die [is] gain. Chap. 1, Verse 21, [PHI].

But if I live in the flesh, this [is] the fruit of my labour: yet what I shall choose I wot not. Chap. 1, Verse 22, [PHI].

For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better: Chap. 1, Verse 23, [PHI].

Nevertheless to abide in the flesh [is] more needful for you. Chap. 1, Verse 24, [PHI].

And having this confidence, I know that I shall abide and continue with you all for your furtherance and joy of faith; Chap. 1, Verse 25, [PHI].

That your rejoicing may be more abundant in Jesus Christ for me by my coming to you again. Chap. 1, Verse 26, [PHI].

Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel; Chap. 1, Verse 27, [PHI].

And in nothing terrified by your adversaries: which is to them an evident token of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that of God. Chap. 1, Verse 28, [PHI].

For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake; Chap. 1, Verse 29, [PHI].

Having the same conflict which ye saw in me, and now hear [to be] in me. Chap. 1, Verse 30, [PHI].

If [there be] therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies, Chap. 2, Verse 1, [PHI].

Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, [being] of one accord, of one mind. Chap. 2, Verse 2, [PHI].

[Let] nothing [be done] through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves. Chap. 2, Verse 3, [PHI].

Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others. Chap. 2, Verse 4, [PHI].

Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Chap. 2, Verse 5, [PHI].

Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: Chap. 2, Verse 6, [PHI].

But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: Chap. 2, Verse 7, [PHI].

And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself,

and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Chap. 2, Verse 8, [PHI].

Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: Chap. 2, Verse 9, [PHI].

That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of [things] in heaven, and [things] in earth, and [things] under the earth; Chap. 2, Verse 10, [PHI].

And [that] every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ [is] Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Chap. 2, Verse 11, [PHI].

Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. Chap. 2, Verse 12, [PHI].

For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of [his] good pleasure. Chap. 2, Verse 13, [PHI].

Do all things without murmurings and disputings: Chap. 2, Verse 14, [PHI].

That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world; Chap. 2, Verse 15, [PHI].

Holding forth the word of life; that I may rejoice in the day of Christ, that I have not run in vain, neither laboured in vain. Chap. 2, Verse 16, [PHI].

Yea, and if I be offered upon the sacrifice and service of your faith, I joy, and rejoice with you all. Chap. 2, Verse 17, [PHI].

For the same cause also do ye joy, and rejoice with me. Chap. 2, Verse 18, [PHI].

But I trust in the Lord Jesus to send Timotheus shortly unto you, that I also may be of good comfort, when I know your state. Chap. 2, Verse 19, [PHI].

For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state. Chap. 2, Verse 20, [PHI].

For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's. Chap. 2, Verse 21, [PHI].

But ye know the proof of him, that, as a son with the father, he hath served with me in the gospel. Chap. 2, Verse 22, [PHI].

Him therefore I hope to send presently, so soon as I shall see how it will go with me. Chap. 2, Verse 23, [PHI].

But I trust in the Lord that I also myself shall come shortly. Chap. 2, Verse 24, [PHI].

Yet I supposed it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother, and companion in labour, and fellowsoldier, but your messenger, and he that ministered to my wants. Chap. 2, Verse 25, [PHI].

For he longed after you all, and was full of heaviness, because that ye had heard that he had been sick. Chap. 2, Verse 26, [PHI].

For indeed he was sick nigh unto death: but God had mercy on him; and not on him only, but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow. Chap. 2, Verse 27, [PHI].

I sent him therefore the more carefully, that, when ye see him again, ye may rejoice, and that I may be the less sorrowful. Chap. 2, Verse 28, [PHI].

Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness; and hold such in reputation: Chap. 2, Verse 29, [PHI].

Because for the work of Christ he was nigh unto death, not regarding his life, to supply your lack of service toward me. Chap. 2, Verse 30, [PHI].

Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you, to me indeed [is] not grievous, but for you [it is] safe. Chap. 3, Verse 1, [PHI].

Beware of dogs, beware of evil workers, beware of the concision. Chap. 3, Verse 2, [PHI].

For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence

in the flesh. Chap. 3, Verse 3, [PHI].

Though I might also have confidence in the flesh. If any other man thinketh that he hath whereof he might trust in the flesh, I more: Chap. 3, Verse 4, [PHI].

Circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, [of] the tribe of Benjamin, an Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, a Pharisee; Chap. 3, Verse 5, [PHI].

Concerning zeal, persecuting the church; touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless. Chap. 3, Verse 6, [PHI].

But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ. Chap. 3, Verse 7, [PHI].

Yea doubtless, and I count all things [but] loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them [but] dung, that I may win Christ, Chap. 3, Verse 8, [PHI].

And be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith: Chap. 3, Verse 9, [PHI].

That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death; Chap. 3, Verse 10, [PHI].

If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead. Chap. 3, Verse 11, [PHI].

Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus. Chap. 3, Verse 12, [PHI].

Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but [this] one thing [I do], forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, Chap. 3, Verse 13, [PHI].

I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. Chap. 3, Verse 14, [PHI].

Let us therefore, as many as be perfect, be thus minded: and if in any thing ye be otherwise minded, God shall reveal even this unto you. Chap. 3, Verse 15, [PHI].

Nevertheless, whereto we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let us mind the same thing. Chap. 3, Verse 16, [PHI].

Brethren, be followers together of me, and mark them which walk so as ye have us for an ensample. Chap. 3, Verse 17, [PHI].

(For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, [that they are] the enemies of the cross of Christ: Chap. 3, Verse 18, [PHI].

Whose end [is] destruction, whose God [is their] belly, and [whose] glory [is] in their shame, who mind earthly things.) Chap. 3, Verse 19, [PHI].

For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ: Chap. 3, Verse 20, [PHI].

Who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body, according to the working whereby he is able even to subdue all things unto himself. Chap. 3, Verse 21, [PHI].

Therefore, my brethren dearly beloved and longed for, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, [my] dearly beloved. Chap. 4, Verse 1, [PHI].

I beseech Euodias, and beseech Syntyche, that they be of the same mind in the Lord. Chap. 4, Verse 2, [PHI].

And I intreat thee also, true yokefellow, help those women which laboured with me in the gospel, with Clement also, and [with] other my fellowlabourers, whose names [are] in the book of life. Chap. 4, Verse 3, [PHI].

Rejoice in the Lord alway: [and] again I say, Rejoice. Chap. 4, Verse 4, [PHI].

Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord [is] at hand. Chap. 4, Verse 5, [PHI].

Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. Chap. 4, Verse 6, [PHI].

And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Chap. 4, Verse 7, [PHI].

Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things [are] honest, whatsoever things [are] just, whatsoever things [are] pure, whatsoever things [are] lovely, whatsoever things [are] of good report; if [there be] any virtue, and if [there be] any praise, think on these things. Chap. 4, Verse 8, [PHI].

Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you. Chap. 4, Verse 9, [PHI].

But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly, that now at the last your care of me hath flourished again; wherein ye were also careful, but ye lacked opportunity. Chap. 4, Verse 10, [PHI].

Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, [therewith] to be content. Chap. 4, Verse 11, [PHI].

I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. Chap. 4, Verse 12, [PHI].

I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me. Chap. 4, Verse 13, [PHI].

Notwithstanding ye have well done, that ye did communicate with my affliction. Chap. 4, Verse 14, [PHI].

Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only. Chap. 4, Verse 15, [PHI].

For even in Thessalonica ye sent once and again unto my necessity. Chap. 4, Verse 16, [PHI].

Not because I desire a gift: but I desire fruit that may abound to your account. Chap. 4, Verse 17, [PHI].

But I have all, and abound: I am full, having received of Epaphroditus the things [which were sent] from you, an odour of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, wellpleasing to God. Chap. 4, Verse 18, [PHI].

But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus. Chap. 4, Verse 19, [PHI].

Now unto God and our Father [be] glory for ever and ever. Amen. Chap. 4, Verse 20, [PHI].

Salute every saint in Christ Jesus. The brethren which are with me greet you. Chap. 4, Verse 21, [PHI].

All the saints salute you, chiefly they that are of Caesar's household. Chap. 4, Verse 22, [PHI].

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ [be] with you all. Amen. Chap. 4, Verse 23, [PHI].
