The sons of Abraham; Isaac, and Ishmael. Chap. 1, Verse 28, [1CH].

These [are] their generations: The firstborn of Ishmael, Nebaioth; then Kedar, and Adbeel, and Mibsam, Chap. 1, Verse 29, [1CH].

Mishma, and Dumah, Massa, Hadad, and Tema, Chap. 1, Verse 30, [1CH].

Jetur, Naphish, and Kedemah. These are the sons of Ishmael. Chap. 1, Verse 31, [1CH].

Now the sons of Keturah, Abraham's concubine: she bare Zimran, and Jokshan, and Medan, and Midian, and Ishbak, and Shuah. And the sons of Jokshan; Sheba, and Dedan. Chap. 1,

Verse 32, [1CH].

And the sons of Midian; Ephah, and Epher, and Henoah, and Abida, and Eldaah. All these [are] the sons of Keturah. Chap. 1, Verse 33, [1CH].

And Abraham begat Isaac. The sons of Isaac; Esau and Israel. Chap. 1, Verse 34, [1CH].

The sons of Esau; Eliphaz, Reuel, and Jeush, and Jaalam, and Korah. Chap. 1, Verse 35, [1CH].

And when Samlah was dead, Shaul of Rehoboth by the river reigned in his stead. Chap. 1, Verse 48, [1CH].

Duke Magdiel, duke Iram. These [are] the dukes of Edom. Chap. 1, Verse 54, [1CH].

These [are] the sons of Israel; Reuben, Simeon, Levi, and Judah, Issachar, and Zebulun, Chap. 2, Verse 1, [1CH].

Dan, Joseph, and Benjamin, Naphtali, Gad, and Asher. Chap. 2, Verse 2, [1CH].

The sons of Judah; Er, and Onan, and Shelah: [which] three were born unto him of the daughter of Shua the Canaanitess. And Er, the firstborn of Judah, was evil in the sight of the LORD; and he slew him. Chap. 2, Verse 3, [1CH].

And Tamar his daughter in law bare him Pharez and Zerah. All the sons of Judah [were] five. Chap. 2, Verse 4, [1CH].

The sons of Pharez; Hezron, and Hamul. Chap. 2, Verse 5,

[1CH].

And the sons of Zerah; Zimri, and Ethan, and Heman, and Calcol, and Dara: five of them in all. Chap. 2, Verse 6, [1CH].

And the sons of Carmi; Achar, the troubler of Israel, who transgressed in the thing accursed. Chap. 2, Verse 7, [1CH].

And the sons of Ethan; Azariah. Chap. 2, Verse 8, [1CH].

The sons also of Hezron, that were born unto him; Jerahmeel, and Ram, and Chelubai. Chap. 2, Verse 9, [1CH].

And Ram begat Amminadab; and Amminadab begat Nahshon, prince of the children of Judah; Chap. 2, Verse 10, [1CH].

And Nahshon begat Salma, and Salma begat Boaz, Chap. 2, Verse 11, [1CH].

And Boaz begat Obed, and Obed begat Jesse. Chap. 2, Verse 12, [1CH].

And Jesse begat his firstborn Eliab, and Abinadab the second, and Shimma the third, Chap. 2, Verse 13, [1CH].

Nethaneel the fourth, Raddai the fifth, Chap. 2, Verse 14, [1CH].

Ozem the sixth, David the seventh: Chap. 2, Verse 15, [1CH].

Whose sisters [were] Zeruah, and Abigail. And the sons of Zeruah; Abishai, and Joab, and Asahel, three. Chap. 2, Verse 16, [1CH].

And Abigail bare Amasa: and the father of Amasa [was] Jether the Ishmeelite. Chap. 2, Verse 17, [1CH].

And Caleb the son of Hezron begat [children] of Azubah [his] wife, and of Jerioth: her sons [are] these; Jeshu, and Shobab, and Ardon. Chap. 2, Verse 18, [1CH].

And when Azubah was dead, Caleb took unto him Ephrath, which bare him Hur. Chap. 2, Verse 19, [1CH].

And Hur begat Uri, and Uri begat Bezaleel. Chap. 2, Verse 20, [1CH].

And afterward Hezron went in to the daughter of Machir the father of Gilead, whom he married when he [was] threescore years old; and she bare him Segub. Chap. 2, Verse 21, [1CH].

And Segub begat Jair, who had three and twenty cities in the land of Gilead. Chap. 2, Verse 22, [1CH].

And he took Geshur, and Aram, with the towns of Jair, from them, with Kenath, and the towns thereof, [even] threescore cities. All these [belonged to] the sons of Machir, the father of Gilead. Chap. 2, Verse 23, [1CH].

And after that Hezron was dead in Caleb-ephratah, then Abiah Hezron's wife bare him Ashur the father of Tekoa. Chap. 2, Verse 24, [1CH].

And the sons of Jerahmeel the firstborn of Hezron were, Ram the firstborn, and Bunah, and Oren, and Ozem, [and] Ahijah. Chap. 2, Verse 25, [1CH].

Jerahmeel had also another wife, whose name [was] Atarah; she [was] the mother of Onam. Chap. 2, Verse 26, [1CH].

And the sons of Ram the firstborn of Jerahmeel were, Maaz, and Jamin, and Eker. Chap. 2, Verse 27, [1CH].

And the sons of Onam were, Shammai, and Jada. And the sons of Shammai; Nadab, and Abishur. Chap. 2, Verse 28, [1CH].

And the name of the wife of Abishur [was] Abihail, and she bare him Ahban, and Molid. Chap. 2, Verse 29, [1CH].

And the sons of Nadab; Seled, and Appaim: but Seled died without children. Chap. 2, Verse 30, [1CH].

And the sons of Appaim; Ishi. And the sons of Ishi; Sheshan. And the children of Sheshan; Ahlai. Chap. 2, Verse 31, [1CH].

And the sons of Jada the brother of Shammai; Jether, and Jonathan: and Jether died without children. Chap. 2, Verse 32, [1CH].

And the sons of Jonathan; Peleth, and Zaza. These were the sons of Jerahmeel. Chap. 2, Verse 33, [1CH].

Now Sheshan had no sons, but daughters. And Sheshan had a servant, an Egyptian, whose name [was] Jarha. Chap. 2, Verse 34, [1CH].

And Sheshan gave his daughter to Jarha his servant to wife; and she bare him Attai. Chap. 2, Verse 35, [1CH].

And Attai begat Nathan, and Nathan begat Zabad, Chap. 2, Verse 36, [1CH].

And Zabad begat Ephlal, and Ephlal begat Obed, Chap. 2, Verse 37, [1CH].

And Obed begat Jehu, and Jehu begat Azariah, Chap. 2, Verse 38, [1CH].

And Azariah begat Helez, and Helez begat Eleasah, Chap. 2, Verse 39, [1CH].

And Eleasah begat Sisamai, and Sisamai begat Shallum, Chap. 2, Verse 40, [1CH].

And Shallum begat Jekamiah, and Jekamiah begat Elishama. Chap. 2, Verse 41, [1CH].

Now the sons of Caleb the brother of Jerahmeel [were], Mesha his firstborn, which was the father of Ziph; and the sons of Mareshah the father of Hebron. Chap. 2, Verse 42, [1CH].

And the sons of Hebron; Korah, and Tappuah, and Rekem, and Shema. Chap. 2, Verse 43, [1CH].

And Shema begat Raham, the father of Jorkoam: and Rekem begat Shammai. Chap. 2, Verse 44, [1CH].

And the son of Shammai [was] Maon: and Maon [was] the father of Beth-zur. Chap. 2, Verse 45, [1CH].

And Ephah, Caleb's concubine, bare Haran, and Moza, and Gazez: and Haran begat Gazez. Chap. 2, Verse 46, [1CH].

And the sons of Jahdai; Regem, and Jotham, and Gesham, and Pelet, and Ephah, and Shaaph. Chap. 2, Verse 47, [1CH].

Maachah, Caleb's concubine, bare Sheber, and Tirhanah. Chap. 2, Verse 48, [1CH].

She bare also Shaaph the father of Madmannah, Sheva the father of Machbenah, and the father of Gibeon: and the daughter of Caleb [was] Achsa. Chap. 2, Verse 49, [1CH].

These were the sons of Caleb the son of Hur, the firstborn of Ephrathah; Shobal the father of Kirjath-jearim, Chap. 2, Verse 50, [1CH].

Salma the father of Beth-lehem, Hareph the father of Beth-gader. Chap. 2, Verse 51, [1CH].

And Shobal the father of Kirjath-jearim had sons; Haroeh, [and] half of the Manahethites. Chap. 2, Verse 52, [1CH].

And the families of Kirjath-jearim; the Ithrites, and the Puhites, and the Shumathites, and the Mishraites; of them came the Zareathites, and the Eshtaulites. Chap. 2, Verse 53, [1CH].

The sons of Salma; Beth-lehem, and the Netophathites, Ataroth, the house of Joab, and half of the Manahethites, the Zorites. Chap. 2, Verse 54, [1CH].

And the families of the scribes which dwelt at Jabez; the Tirathites, the Shimeathites, [and] Suchathites. These [are] the Kenites that came of Hemath, the father of the house of Rechab. Chap. 2, Verse 55, [1CH].

Now these were the sons of David, which were born unto him in Hebron; the firstborn Amnon, of Ahinoam the Jezreelitess; the second Daniel, of Abigail the Carmelitess: Chap. 3, Verse 1, [1CH].

The third, Absalom the son of Maachah the daughter of Talmai king of Geshur: the fourth, Adonijah the son of Haggith: Chap. 3, Verse 2, [1CH].

The fifth, Shephatiah of Abital: the sixth, Ithream by Eglah his wife. Chap. 3, Verse 3, [1CH].

[These] six were born unto him in Hebron; and there he reigned seven years and six months: and in Jerusalem he reigned thirty and three years. Chap. 3, Verse 4, [1CH].

And these were born unto him in Jerusalem; Shimea, and Shobab, and Nathan, and Solomon, four, of Bath-shua the daughter of Ammiel: Chap. 3, Verse 5, [1CH].

Ibhar also, and Elishama, and Eliphelet, Chap. 3, Verse 6, [1CH].

And Nogah, and Nepheg, and Japhia, Chap. 3, Verse 7, [1CH].

And Elishama, and Eliada, and Eliphelet, nine. Chap. 3, Verse 8, [1CH].

[These were] all the sons of David, beside the sons of the concubines, and Tamar their sister. Chap. 3, Verse 9, [1CH].

And Solomon's son [was] Rehoboam, Abia his son, Asa his son, Jehoshaphat his son, Chap. 3, Verse 10, [1CH].

Joram his son, Ahaziah his son, Joash his son, Chap. 3, Verse 11, [1CH].

Amaziah his son, Azariah his son, Jotham his son, Chap. 3, Verse 12, [1CH].

Ahaz his son, Hezekiah his son, Manasseh his son, Chap. 3, Verse 13, [1CH].

Amon his son, Josiah his son. Chap. 3, Verse 14, [1CH].

And the sons of Josiah [were], the firstborn Johanan, the second Jehoiakim, the third Zedekiah, the fourth Shallum. Chap. 3, Verse 15, [1CH].

And the sons of Jehoiakim: Jeconiah his son, Zedekiah his son. Chap. 3, Verse 16, [1CH].

And the sons of Jeconiah; Assir, Salathiel his son, Chap. 3, Verse 17, [1CH].

Malchiram also, and Pedaiah, and Shenazar, Jecamiah, Hoshama, and Nedabiah. Chap. 3, Verse 18, [1CH].

And the sons of Pedaiah [were], Zerubbabel, and Shimei: and the sons of Zerubbabel; Meshullam, and Hananiah, and

Shelomith their sister: Chap. 3, Verse 19, [1CH].

And Hashubah, and Ohel, and Berechiah, and Hasadiah, Jushab-hesed, five. Chap. 3, Verse 20, [1CH].

And the sons of Hananiah; Pelatiah, and Jesaiah: the sons of Rephaiah, the sons of Arnan, the sons of Obadiah, the sons of Shechaniah. Chap. 3, Verse 21, [1CH].

And the sons of Shechaniah; Shemaiah: and the sons of Shemaiah; Hattush, and Igeal, and Bariah, and Neariah, and Shaphat, six. Chap. 3, Verse 22, [1CH].

And the sons of Neariah; Elioenai, and Hezekiah, and Azrikam, three. Chap. 3, Verse 23, [1CH].

And the sons of Elioenai [were], Hodaiah, and Eliashib, and Pelaiah, and Akkub, and Johanan, and Dalaiiah, and Anani, seven. Chap. 3, Verse 24, [1CH].

The sons of Judah; Pharez, Hezron, and Carmi, and Hur, and Shobal. Chap. 4, Verse 1, [1CH].

And Reaiah the son of Shobal begat Jahath; and Jahath begat Ahumai, and Lahad. These [are] the families of the Zorathites. Chap. 4, Verse 2, [1CH].

And these [were of] the father of Etam; Jezreel, and Ishma, and Idbash: and the name of their sister [was] Hazelelponi: Chap. 4, Verse 3, [1CH].

And Penuel the father of Gedor, and Ezer the father of Hushah. These [are] the sons of Hur, the firstborn of Ephratah, the father of Beth-lehem. Chap. 4, Verse 4, [1CH].

And Ashur the father of Tekoa had two wives, Helah and Naarah. Chap. 4, Verse 5, [1CH].

And Naarah bare him Ahuzam, and Hopher, and Temeni, and Haahashtari. These [were] the sons of Naarah. Chap. 4, Verse 6, [1CH].

And the sons of Helah [were], Zereth, and Jezoar, and Ethnan. Chap. 4, Verse 7, [1CH].

And Coz begat Anub, and Zobebah, and the families of

Aharhel the son of Harum. Chap. 4, Verse 8, [1CH].

And Jabez was more honourable than his brethren: and his mother called his name Jabez, saying, Because I bare him with sorrow. Chap. 4, Verse 9, [1CH].

And Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying, Oh that thou wouldest bless me indeed, and enlarge my coast, and that thine hand might be with me, and that thou wouldest keep [me] from evil, that it may not grieve me! And God granted him that which he requested. Chap. 4, Verse 10, [1CH].

And Chelub the brother of Shuah begat Mehir, which [was] the father of Eshton. Chap. 4, Verse 11, [1CH].

And Eshton begat Beth-rapha, and Paseah, and Tehinnah the father of Ir-nahash. These [are] the men of Rechah. Chap. 4, Verse 12, [1CH].

And the sons of Kenaz; Othniel, and Seraiah: and the sons of Othniel; Hathath. Chap. 4, Verse 13, [1CH].

And Meonothai begat Ophrah: and Seraiah begat Joab, the father of the valley of Charashim; for they were craftsmen. Chap. 4, Verse 14, [1CH].

And the sons of Caleb the son of Jephunneh; Iru, Elah, and Naam: and the sons of Elah, even Kenaz. Chap. 4, Verse 15, [1CH].

And the sons of Jehaleleel; Ziph, and Ziphah, Tiria, and Asareel. Chap. 4, Verse 16, [1CH].

And the sons of Ezra [were], Jether, and Mered, and Epher, and Jalon: and she bare Miriam, and Shammai, and Ishbah the father of Eshtemoa. Chap. 4, Verse 17, [1CH].

And his wife Jehudijah bare Jered the father of Gedor, and Heber the father of Socho, and Jekuthiel the father of Zanoah. And these [are] the sons of Bithiah the daughter of Pharaoh, which Mered took. Chap. 4, Verse 18, [1CH].

And the sons of [his] wife Hodiah the sister of Naham, the father of Keilah the Garmite, and Eshtemoa the Maachathite. Chap. 4, Verse 19, [1CH].

And the sons of Shimon [were], Amnon, and Rinnah, Benhanan, and Tilon. And the sons of Ishi [were], Zoheth, and Ben-zoheth. Chap. 4, Verse 20, [1CH].

The sons of Shelah the son of Judah [were], Er the father of Lecah, and Laadah the father of Mareshah, and the families of the house of them that wrought fine linen, of the house of Ashbea, Chap. 4, Verse 21, [1CH].

And Jokim, and the men of Chozeba, and Joash, and Saraph, who had the dominion in Moab, and Jashubi-lehem. And [these are] ancient things. Chap. 4, Verse 22, [1CH].

These [were] the potters, and those that dwelt among plants and hedges: there they dwelt with the king for his work. Chap. 4, Verse 23, [1CH].

The sons of Simeon [were], Nemuel, and Jamin, Jarib, Zerach, [and] Shaul: Chap. 4, Verse 24, [1CH].

Shallum his son, Mibsam his son, Mishma his son. Chap. 4, Verse 25, [1CH].

And the sons of Mishma; Hamuel his son, Zacchur his son, Shimei his son. Chap. 4, Verse 26, [1CH].

And Shimei had sixteen sons and six daughters; but his brethren had not many children, neither did all their family multiply, like to the children of Judah. Chap. 4, Verse 27, [1CH].

And they dwelt at Beer-sheba, and Moladah, and Hazar-shual, Chap. 4, Verse 28, [1CH].

And at Bilhah, and at Ezem, and at Tolad, Chap. 4, Verse 29, [1CH].

And at Bethuel, and at Hormah, and at Ziklag, Chap. 4, Verse 30, [1CH].

And at Beth-marcaboth, and Hazar-susim, and at Beth-birei, and at Shaaraim. These [were] their cities unto the reign of David. Chap. 4, Verse 31, [1CH].

And their villages [were], Etam, and Ain, Rimmon, and Tochen, and Ashan, five cities: Chap. 4, Verse 32, [1CH].

And all their villages that [were] round about the same cities, unto Baal. These [were] their habitations, and their genealogy. Chap. 4, Verse 33, [1CH].

And Meshobab, and Jamlech, and Joshah, the son of Amaziah, Chap. 4, Verse 34, [1CH].

And Joel, and Jehu the son of Josibiah, the son of Seraiah, the son of Asiel, Chap. 4, Verse 35, [1CH].

And Elioenai, and Jaakobah, and Jeshohaiah, and Asaiah, and Adiel, and Jesimiel, and Benaiah, Chap. 4, Verse 36, [1CH].

And Ziza the son of Shiphi, the son of Allon, the son of Jedaiah, the son of Shimri, the son of Shemaiah; Chap. 4, Verse 37, [1CH].

These mentioned by [their] names [were] princes in their families: and the house of their fathers increased greatly. Chap. 4, Verse 38, [1CH].

And they went to the entrance of Gedor, [even] unto the east side of the valley, to seek pasture for their flocks. Chap. 4, Verse 39, [1CH].

And they found fat pasture and good, and the land [was] wide, and quiet, and peaceable; for [they] of Ham had dwelt there of old. Chap. 4, Verse 40, [1CH].

And these written by name came in the days of Hezekiah king of Judah, and smote their tents, and the habitations that were found there, and destroyed them utterly unto this day, and dwelt in their rooms: because [there was] pasture there for their flocks. Chap. 4, Verse 41, [1CH].

And [some] of them, [even] of the sons of Simeon, five hundred men, went to mount Seir, having for their captains Pelatiah, and Neariah, and Rephaiah, and Uzziel, the sons of Ishi. Chap. 4, Verse 42, [1CH].

For Judah prevailed above his brethren, and of him [came] the chief ruler; but the birthright [was] Joseph's:) Chap. 5, Verse 2, [1CH].

The sons, [I say], of Reuben the firstborn of Israel [were], Hanoch, and Pallu, Hezron, and Carmi. Chap. 5, Verse 3, [1CH].

The sons of Joel; Shemaiah his son, Gog his son, Shimei his son, Chap. 5, Verse 4, [1CH].

Micah his son, Reaia his son, Baal his son, Chap. 5, Verse 5, [1CH].

Beerah his son, whom Tilgath-pilneser king of Assyria carried away [captive]: he [was] prince of the Reubenites. Chap. 5, Verse 6, [1CH].

And his brethren by their families, when the genealogy of their generations was reckoned, [were] the chief, Jeiel, and Zechariah, Chap. 5, Verse 7, [1CH].

And Bela the son of Azaz, the son of Shema, the son of Joel, who dwelt in Aroer, even unto Nebo and Baal-meon: Chap. 5, Verse 8, [1CH].

And eastward he inhabited unto the entering in of the wilderness from the river Euphrates: because their cattle were multiplied in the land of Gilead. Chap. 5, Verse 9, [1CH].

And in the days of Saul they made war with the Hagarites, who fell by their hand: and they dwelt in their tents throughout all the east [land] of Gilead. Chap. 5, Verse 10, [1CH].

And the children of Gad dwelt over against them, in the land of Bashan unto Salcah: Chap. 5, Verse 11, [1CH].

These [are] the children of Abihail the son of Huri, the son of Jaroah, the son of Gilead, the son of Michael, the son of Jeshishai, the son of Jahdo, the son of Buz; Chap. 5, Verse 14, [1CH].

Ahi the son of Abdiel, the son of Guni, chief of the house of their fathers. Chap. 5, Verse 15, [1CH].

And they dwelt in Gilead in Bashan, and in her towns, and in all the suburbs of Sharon, upon their borders. Chap. 5, Verse 16, [1CH].

All these were reckoned by genealogies in the days of Jotham king of Judah, and in the days of Jeroboam king of Israel. Chap. 5, Verse 17, [1CH].

And Iphedeiah, and Penuel, the sons of Shashak; Chap. 8, Verse 25, [1CH].

And Shamsherai, and Shehariah, and Athaliah, Chap. 8, Verse 26, [1CH].

And Jaresiah, and Eliah, and Zichri, the sons of Jeroham. Chap. 8, Verse 27, [1CH].

These [were] heads of the fathers, by their generations, chief [men]. These dwelt in Jerusalem. Chap. 8, Verse 28, [1CH].

And at Gibeon dwelt the father of Gibeon; whose wife's name [was] Maachah: Chap. 8, Verse 29, [1CH].

And his firstborn son Abdon, and Zur, and Kish, and Baal, and Nadab, Chap. 8, Verse 30, [1CH].

And Gedor, and Ahio, and Zacher. Chap. 8, Verse 31, [1CH].

And Mikloth begat Shimeah. And these also dwelt with their brethren in Jerusalem, over against them. Chap. 8, Verse 32, [1CH].

And Ner begat Kish, and Kish begat Saul, and Saul begat Jonathan, and Malchi-shua, and Abinadab, and Esh-baal.

Chap. 8, Verse 33, [1CH].

And the son of Jonathan [was] Merib-baal; and Merib-baal begat Micah. Chap. 8, Verse 34, [1CH].

And the sons of Micah [were], Pithon, and Melech, and Tarea, and Ahaz. Chap. 8, Verse 35, [1CH].

And Ahaz begat Jehoadah; and Jehoadah begat Alemeth, and Azmaveth, and Zimri; and Zimri begat Moza, Chap. 8, Verse 36, [1CH].

And Moza begat Binea: Rapha [was] his son, Eleasah his son, Azel his son: Chap. 8, Verse 37, [1CH].

And Azel had six sons, whose names [are] these, Azrikam, Bocheru, and Ishmael, and Sheariah, and Obadiah, and Hanan. All these [were] the sons of Azel. Chap. 8, Verse 38, [1CH].

And the sons of Eshek his brother [were], Ulam his firstborn, Jehush the second, and Eliphelet the third. Chap. 8, Verse 39, [1CH].

And the sons of Ulam were mighty men of valour, archers, and had many sons, and sons' sons, an hundred and fifty. All these [are] of the sons of Benjamin. Chap. 8, Verse 40, [1CH].

So all Israel were reckoned by genealogies; and, behold, they [were] written in the book of the kings of Israel and Judah, [who] were carried away to Babylon for their transgression. Chap. 9, Verse 1, [1CH].

Now the first inhabitants that [dwelt] in their possessions in their cities [were], the Israelites, the priests, Levites, and the Nethinims. Chap. 9, Verse 2, [1CH].

And in Jerusalem dwelt of the children of Judah, and of the children of Benjamin, and of the children of Ephraim, and Manasseh; Chap. 9, Verse 3, [1CH].

Uthai the son of Ammihud, the son of Omri, the son of Imri, the son of Bani, of the children of Pharez the son of Judah. Chap. 9, Verse 4, [1CH].

And of the Shilonites; Asaiah the firstborn, and his sons. Chap. 9, Verse 5, [1CH].

And of the sons of Zerah; Jeuel, and their brethren, six hundred and ninety. Chap. 9, Verse 6, [1CH].

And of the sons of Benjamin; Sallu the son of Meshullam, the son of Hodaviah, the son of Hasenuah, Chap. 9, Verse 7, [1CH].

And Ibneiah the son of Jeroham, and Elah the son of Uzzi, the son of Michri, and Meshullam the son of Shephathiah, the son of Reuel, the son of Ibnijah; Chap. 9, Verse 8, [1CH].

And their brethren, according to their generations, nine hundred and fifty and six. All these men [were] chief of the fathers in the house of their fathers. Chap. 9, Verse 9, [1CH].

And of the priests; Jedaiah, and Jehoiarib, and Jachin, Chap. 9, Verse 10, [1CH].

And Azariah the son of Hilkiah, the son of Meshullam, the son of Zadok, the son of Meraioth, the son of Ahitub, the ruler of the house of God; Chap. 9, Verse 11, [1CH].

And Aadaiah the son of Jeroham, the son of Pashur, the son of Malchijah, and Maasiai the son of Adiel, the son of Jahzerah, the son of Meshullam, the son of Meshillemith, the son of Immer; Chap. 9, Verse 12, [1CH].

And their brethren, heads of the house of their fathers, a thousand and seven hundred and threescore; very able men for the work of the service of the house of God. Chap. 9, Verse 13, [1CH].

And of the Levites; Shemaiah the son of Hasshub, the son of Azrikam, the son of Hashabiah, of the sons of Merari; Chap. 9, Verse 14, [1CH].

And Bakbakkar, Heresh, and Galal, and Mattaniah the son of Micah, the son of Zichri, the son of Asaph; Chap. 9, Verse 15, [1CH].

And Obadiah the son of Shemaiah, the son of Galal, the son of Jeduthun, and Berechiah the son of Asa, the son of

Elkanah, that dwelt in the villages of the Netophathites. Chap. 9, Verse 16, [1CH].

And the porters [were], Shallum, and Akkub, and Talmon, and Ahiman, and their brethren: Shallum [was] the chief; Chap. 9, Verse 17, [1CH].

Who hitherto [waited] in the king's gate eastward: they [were] porters in the companies of the children of Levi. Chap. 9, Verse 18, [1CH].

And Shallum the son of Kore, the son of Ebiasaph, the son of Korah, and his brethren, of the house of his father, the Korahites, [were] over the work of the service, keepers of the gates of the tabernacle: and their fathers, [being] over the host of the LORD, [were] keepers of the entry. Chap. 9, Verse 19, [1CH].

And Phinehas the son of Eleazar was the ruler over them in time past, [and] the LORD [was] with him. Chap. 9, Verse 20, [1CH].

[And] Zechariah the son of Meshelemiah [was] porter of the door of the tabernacle of the congregation. Chap. 9, Verse 21, [1CH].

All these [which were] chosen to be porters in the gates [were] two hundred and twelve. These were reckoned by their genealogy in their villages, whom David and Samuel the seer did ordain in their set office. Chap. 9, Verse 22, [1CH].

So they and their children [had] the oversight of the gates of the house of the LORD, [namely], the house of the tabernacle, by wards. Chap. 9, Verse 23, [1CH].

In four quarters were the porters, toward the east, west, north, and south. Chap. 9, Verse 24, [1CH].

And their brethren, [which were] in their villages, [were] to come after seven days from time to time with them. Chap. 9, Verse 25, [1CH].

For these Levites, the four chief porters, were in [their] set office, and were over the chambers and treasuries of the house of God. Chap. 9, Verse 26, [1CH].

And they lodged round about the house of God, because the

charge [was] upon them, and the opening thereof every morning [pertained] to them. Chap. 9, Verse 27, [1CH].

And [certain] of them had the charge of the ministering vessels, that they should bring them in and out by tale. Chap. 9, Verse 28, [1CH].

[Some] of them also [were] appointed to oversee the vessels and all the instruments of the sanctuary, and the fine flour, and the wine, and the oil, and the frankincense, and the spices. Chap. 9, Verse 29, [1CH].

And [some] of the sons of the priests made the ointment of the spices. Chap. 9, Verse 30, [1CH].

And Mattithiah, [one] of the Levites, who [was] the firstborn of Shallum the Korahite, had the set office over the things that were made in the pans. Chap. 9, Verse 31, [1CH].

And [other] of their brethren, of the sons of the Kohathites, [were] over the shewbread, to prepare [it] every sabbath. Chap. 9, Verse 32, [1CH].

And these [are] the singers, chief of the fathers of the Levites, [who remaining] in the chambers [were] free: for they were employed in [that] work day and night. Chap. 9, Verse 33, [1CH].

These chief fathers of the Levites [were] chief throughout their generations; these dwelt at Jerusalem. Chap. 9, Verse 34, [1CH].

And in Gibeon dwelt the father of Gibeon, Jehiel, whose wife's name [was] Maachah: Chap. 9, Verse 35, [1CH].

And his firstborn son Abdon, then Zur, and Kish, and Baal, and Ner, and Nadab, Chap. 9, Verse 36, [1CH].

And Gedor, and Ahio, and Zechariah, and Mikloth. Chap. 9, Verse 37, [1CH].

And Mikloth begat Shimeam. And they also dwelt with their brethren at Jerusalem, over against their brethren. Chap. 9, Verse 38, [1CH].

And Ner begat Kish; and Kish begat Saul; and Saul begat

Jonathan, and Malchi-shua, and Abinadab, and Esh-baal.
Chap. 9, Verse 39, [1CH].

And the son of Jonathan [was] Merib-baal: and Merib-baal
begat Micah. Chap. 9, Verse 40, [1CH].

And the sons of Micah [were], Pithon, and Melech, and
Tahrea, [and Ahaz]. Chap. 9, Verse 41, [1CH].

And Ahaz begat Jarah; and Jarah begat Alemeth, and
Azmaveth, and Zimri; and Zimri begat Moza; Chap. 9, Verse
42, [1CH].

And Moza begat Binea; and Rephaiah his son, Eleasah his
son, Azel his son. Chap. 9, Verse 43, [1CH].

And Azel had six sons, whose names [are] these, Azrikam,
Bocheru, and Ishmael, and Sheariah, and Obadiah, and Hanan:
these [were] the sons of Azel. Chap. 9, Verse 44, [1CH].

Now the Philistines fought against Israel; and the men of
Israel fled from before the Philistines, and fell down
slain in mount Gilboa. Chap. 10, Verse 1, [1CH].

And the Philistines followed hard after Saul, and after
his sons; and the Philistines slew Jonathan, and Abinadab,
and Malchi-shua, the sons of Saul. Chap. 10, Verse 2,
[1CH].

And the battle went sore against Saul, and the archers hit
him, and he was wounded of the archers. Chap. 10, Verse 3,
[1CH].

Then said Saul to his armourbearer, Draw thy sword, and
thrust me through therewith; lest these uncircumcised come
and abuse me. But his armourbearer would not; for he was
sore afraid. So Saul took a sword, and fell upon it. Chap.
10, Verse 4, [1CH].

And when his armourbearer saw that Saul was dead, he fell
likewise on the sword, and died. Chap. 10, Verse 5, [1CH].

So Saul died, and his three sons, and all his house died
together. Chap. 10, Verse 6, [1CH].

And when all the men of Israel that [were] in the valley
saw that they fled, and that Saul and his sons were dead,

then they forsook their cities, and fled: and the Philistines came and dwelt in them. Chap. 10, Verse 7, [1CH].

And it came to pass on the morrow, when the Philistines came to strip the slain, that they found Saul and his sons fallen in mount Gilboa. Chap. 10, Verse 8, [1CH].

And when they had stripped him, they took his head, and his armour, and sent into the land of the Philistines round about, to carry tidings unto their idols, and to the people. Chap. 10, Verse 9, [1CH].

And they put his armour in the house of their gods, and fastened his head in the temple of Dagon. Chap. 10, Verse 10, [1CH].

And when all Jabesh-gilead heard all that the Philistines had done to Saul, Chap. 10, Verse 11, [1CH].

They arose, all the valiant men, and took away the body of Saul, and the bodies of his sons, and brought them to Jabesh, and buried their bones under the oak in Jabesh, and fasted seven days. Chap. 10, Verse 12, [1CH].

So Saul died for his transgression which he committed against the LORD, [even] against the word of the LORD, which he kept not, and also for asking [counsel] of [one that had] a familiar spirit, to inquire [of it]; Chap. 10, Verse 13, [1CH].

And inquired not of the LORD: therefore he slew him, and turned the kingdom unto David the son of Jesse. Chap. 10, Verse 14, [1CH].

Then all Israel gathered themselves to David unto Hebron, saying, Behold, we [are] thy bone and thy flesh. Chap. 11, Verse 1, [1CH].

And moreover in time past, even when Saul was king, thou [wast] he that leddest out and broughtest in Israel: and the LORD thy God said unto thee, Thou shalt feed my people Israel, and thou shalt be ruler over my people Israel. Chap. 11, Verse 2, [1CH].

Therefore came all the elders of Israel to the king to Hebron; and David made a covenant with them in Hebron

before the LORD; and they anointed David king over Israel, according to the word of the LORD by Samuel. Chap. 11, Verse 3, [1CH].

And David and all Israel went to Jerusalem, which [is] Jebus; where the Jebusites [were], the inhabitants of the land. Chap. 11, Verse 4, [1CH].

And the inhabitants of Jebus said to David, Thou shalt not come hither. Nevertheless David took the castle of Zion, which [is] the city of David. Chap. 11, Verse 5, [1CH].

And David said, Whosoever smiteth the Jebusites first shall be chief and captain. So Joab the son of Zeruiah went first up, and was chief. Chap. 11, Verse 6, [1CH].

And David dwelt in the castle; therefore they called it the city of David. Chap. 11, Verse 7, [1CH].

And he built the city round about, even from Millo round about: and Joab repaired the rest of the city. Chap. 11, Verse 8, [1CH].

So David waxed greater and greater: for the LORD of hosts [was] with him. Chap. 11, Verse 9, [1CH].

These also [are] the chief of the mighty men whom David had, who strengthened themselves with him in his kingdom, [and] with all Israel, to make him king, according to the word of the LORD concerning Israel. Chap. 11, Verse 10, [1CH].

And this [is] the number of the mighty men whom David had; Jashobeam, an Hachmonite, the chief of the captains: he lifted up his spear against three hundred slain [by him] at one time. Chap. 11, Verse 11, [1CH].

And after him [was] Eleazar the son of Dodo, the Ahohite, who [was one] of the three mighties. Chap. 11, Verse 12, [1CH].

He was with David at Pas-dammim, and there the Philistines were gathered together to battle, where was a parcel of ground full of barley; and the people fled from before the Philistines. Chap. 11, Verse 13, [1CH].

And they set themselves in the midst of [that] parcel, and

delivered it, and slew the Philistines; and the LORD saved [them] by a great deliverance. Chap. 11, Verse 14, [1CH].

Now three of the thirty captains went down to the rock to David, into the cave of Adullam; and the host of the Philistines encamped in the valley of Rephaim. Chap. 11, Verse 15, [1CH].

And David [was] then in the hold, and the Philistines' garrison [was] then at Beth-lehem. Chap. 11, Verse 16, [1CH].

And David longed, and said, Oh that one would give me drink of the water of the well of Beth-lehem, that [is] at the gate! Chap. 11, Verse 17, [1CH].

And the three brake through the host of the Philistines, and drew water out of the well of Beth-lehem, that [was] by the gate, and took [it], and brought [it] to David: but David would not drink [of] it, but poured it out to the LORD, Chap. 11, Verse 18, [1CH].

And said, My God forbid it me, that I should do this thing: shall I drink the blood of these men that have put their lives in jeopardy? for with [the jeopardy of] their lives they brought it. Therefore he would not drink it. These things did these three mightiest. Chap. 11, Verse 19, [1CH].

And Abishai the brother of Joab, he was chief of the three: for lifting up his spear against three hundred, he slew [them], and had a name among the three. Chap. 11, Verse 20, [1CH].

Of the three, he was more honourable than the two; for he was their captain: howbeit he attained not to the [first] three. Chap. 11, Verse 21, [1CH].

Benaiah the son of Jehoiada, the son of a valiant man of Kabzeel, who had done many acts; he slew two lionlike men of Moab: also he went down and slew a lion in a pit in a snowy day. Chap. 11, Verse 22, [1CH].

And he slew an Egyptian, a man of [great] stature, five cubits high; and in the Egyptian's hand [was] a spear like a weaver's beam; and he went down to him with a staff, and plucked the spear out of the Egyptian's hand, and slew him

with his own spear. Chap. 11, Verse 23, [1CH].

These [things] did Benaiah the son of Jehoiada, and had the name among the three mighties. Chap. 11, Verse 24, [1CH].

Behold, he was honourable among the thirty, but attained not to the [first] three: and David set him over his guard. Chap. 11, Verse 25, [1CH].

Also the valiant men of the armies [were], Asahel the brother of Joab, Elhanan the son of Dodo of Beth-lehem, Chap. 11, Verse 26, [1CH].

Shammoth the Harorite, Helez the Pelonite, Chap. 11, Verse 27, [1CH].

Ira the son of Ikkesh the Tekoite, Abi-ezer the Antothite, Chap. 11, Verse 28, [1CH].

Sibbecai the Hushathite, Ilai the Ahohite, Chap. 11, Verse 29, [1CH].

Maharai the Netophathite, Heled the son of Baanah the Netophathite, Chap. 11, Verse 30, [1CH].

Ithai the son of Ribai of Gibeah, [that pertained] to the children of Benjamin, Benaiah the Pirathonite, Chap. 11, Verse 31, [1CH].

Hurai of the brooks of Gaash, Abiel the Arbathite, Chap. 11, Verse 32, [1CH].

Azmaveth the Baharumite, Eliahba the Shaalbonite, Chap. 11, Verse 33, [1CH].

The sons of Hashem the Gizonite, Jonathan the son of Shage the Hararite, Chap. 11, Verse 34, [1CH].

Ahiam the son of Sacar the Hararite, Eliphai the son of Ur, Chap. 11, Verse 35, [1CH].

Hepher the Mecherathite, Ahijah the Pelonite, Chap. 11, Verse 36, [1CH].

Hezro the Carmelite, Naarai the son of Ezbai, Chap. 11, Verse 37, [1CH].

Joel the brother of Nathan, Mibhar the son of Haggeri, Chap. 11, Verse 38, [1CH].

Zelek the Ammonite, Naharai the Berothite, the armourbearer of Joab the son of Zeruah, Chap. 11, Verse 39, [1CH].

Ira the Ithrite, Gareb the Ithrite, Chap. 11, Verse 40, [1CH].

Uriah the Hittite, Zabad the son of Ahlai, Chap. 11, Verse 41, [1CH].

Adina the son of Shiza the Reubenite, a captain of the Reubenites, and thirty with him, Chap. 11, Verse 42, [1CH].

Hanan the son of Maachah, and Joshaphat the Mithnite, Chap. 11, Verse 43, [1CH].

Uzzia the Ashterathite, Shama and Jehiel the sons of Hothan the Aroerite, Chap. 11, Verse 44, [1CH].

Jediael the son of Shimri, and Joha his brother, the Tizite, Chap. 11, Verse 45, [1CH].

Eliel the Mahavite, and Jeribai, and Joshaviah, the sons of Elnaam, and Ithmah the Moabite, Chap. 11, Verse 46, [1CH].

Eliel, and Obed, and Jasiel the Mesobaite. Chap. 11, Verse 47, [1CH].

Now these [are] they that came to David to Ziklag, while he yet kept himself close because of Saul the son of Kish: and they [were] among the mighty men, helpers of the war. Chap. 12, Verse 1, [1CH].

[They were] armed with bows, and could use both the right hand and the left in [hurling] stones and [shooting] arrows out of a bow, [even] of Saul's brethren of Benjamin. Chap. 12, Verse 2, [1CH].

The chief [was] Ahiezer, then Joash, the sons of Shemaah the Gibeathite; and Jeziel, and Pelet, the sons of Azmaveth; and Berachah, and Jehu the Antothite, Chap. 12,

Verse 3, [1CH].

And Ismaiah the Gibeonite, a mighty man among the thirty, and over the thirty; and Jeremiah, and Jahaziel, and Johanan, and Josabad the Gederathite, Chap. 12, Verse 4, [1CH].

Eluzai, and Jerimoth, and Bealiah, and Shemariah, and Shephatiah the Haruphite, Chap. 12, Verse 5, [1CH].

Elkanah, and Jesiah, and Azareel, and Joezer, and Jashobeam, the Korhites, Chap. 12, Verse 6, [1CH].

And Joelah, and Zebadiah, the sons of Jeroham of Gedor. Chap. 12, Verse 7, [1CH].

And of the Gadites there separated themselves unto David into the hold to the wilderness men of might, [and] men of war [fit] for the battle, that could handle shield and buckler, whose faces [were like] the faces of lions, and [were] as swift as the roes upon the mountains; Chap. 12, Verse 8, [1CH].

Ezer the first, Obadiah the second, Eliab the third, Chap. 12, Verse 9, [1CH].

Mishmannah the fourth, Jeremiah the fifth, Chap. 12, Verse 10, [1CH].

Attai the sixth, Eliel the seventh, Chap. 12, Verse 11, [1CH].

Johanan the eighth, Elzabad the ninth, Chap. 12, Verse 12, [1CH].

Jeremiah the tenth, Machbanai the eleventh. Chap. 12, Verse 13, [1CH].

These [were] of the sons of Gad, captains of the host: one of the least [was] over an hundred, and the greatest over a thousand. Chap. 12, Verse 14, [1CH].

These [are] they that went over Jordan in the first month, when it had overflowed all his banks; and they put to flight all [them] of the valleys, [both] toward the east, and toward the west. Chap. 12, Verse 15, [1CH].

And there came of the children of Benjamin and Judah to the hold unto David. Chap. 12, Verse 16, [1CH].

And David went out to meet them, and answered and said unto them, If ye be come peaceably unto me to help me, mine heart shall be knit unto you: but if [ye be come] to betray me to mine enemies, seeing [there is] no wrong in mine hands, the God of our fathers look [thereon], and rebuke [it]. Chap. 12, Verse 17, [1CH].

Then the spirit came upon Amasai, [who was] chief of the captains, [and he said], Thine [are we], David, and on thy side, thou son of Jesse: peace, peace [be] unto thee, and peace [be] to thine helpers; for thy God helpeth thee. Then David received them, and made them captains of the band. Chap. 12, Verse 18, [1CH].

And there fell [some] of Manasseh to David, when he came with the Philistines against Saul to battle: but they helped them not: for the lords of the Philistines upon advisement sent him away, saying, He will fall to his master Saul to [the jeopardy of] our heads. Chap. 12, Verse 19, [1CH].

As he went to Ziklag, there fell to him of Manasseh, Adnah, and Jozabad, and Jediahel, and Michael, and Jozabad, and Elihu, and Zilthai, captains of the thousands that [were] of Manasseh. Chap. 12, Verse 20, [1CH].

And they helped David against the band [of the rovers]: for they [were] all mighty men of valour, and were captains in the host. Chap. 12, Verse 21, [1CH].

For at [that] time day by day there came to David to help him, until [it was] a great host, like the host of God. Chap. 12, Verse 22, [1CH].

And these [are] the numbers of the bands [that were] ready armed to the war, [and] came to David to Hebron, to turn the kingdom of Saul to him, according to the word of the LORD. Chap. 12, Verse 23, [1CH].

The children of Judah that bare shield and spear [were] six thousand and eight hundred, ready armed to the war. Chap. 12, Verse 24, [1CH].

Of the children of Simeon, mighty men of valour for the

war, seven thousand and one hundred. Chap. 12, Verse 25, [1CH].

Of the children of Levi four thousand and six hundred. Chap. 12, Verse 26, [1CH].

And Jehoiada [was] the leader of the Aaronites, and with him [were] three thousand and seven hundred; Chap. 12, Verse 27, [1CH].

And Zadok, a young man mighty of valour, and of his father's house twenty and two captains. Chap. 12, Verse 28, [1CH].

And of the children of Benjamin, the kindred of Saul, three thousand: for hitherto the greatest part of them had kept the ward of the house of Saul. Chap. 12, Verse 29, [1CH].

And of the children of Ephraim twenty thousand and eight hundred, mighty men of valour, famous throughout the house of their fathers. Chap. 12, Verse 30, [1CH].

And of the half tribe of Manasseh eighteen thousand, which were expressed by name, to come and make David king. Chap. 12, Verse 31, [1CH].

And of the children of Issachar, [which were men] that had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do; the heads of them [were] two hundred; and all their brethren [were] at their commandment. Chap. 12, Verse 32, [1CH].

Of Zebulun, such as went forth to battle, expert in war, with all instruments of war, fifty thousand, which could keep rank: [they were] not of double heart. Chap. 12, Verse 33, [1CH].

And of Naphtali a thousand captains, and with them with shield and spear thirty and seven thousand. Chap. 12, Verse 34, [1CH].

And of the Danites expert in war twenty and eight thousand and six hundred. Chap. 12, Verse 35, [1CH].

And of Asher, such as went forth to battle, expert in war, forty thousand. Chap. 12, Verse 36, [1CH].

And on the other side of Jordan, of the Reubenites, and the Gadites, and of the half tribe of Manasseh, with all manner of instruments of war for the battle, an hundred and twenty thousand. Chap. 12, Verse 37, [1CH].

All these men of war, that could keep rank, came with a perfect heart to Hebron, to make David king over all Israel: and all the rest also of Israel [were] of one heart to make David king. Chap. 12, Verse 38, [1CH].

And there they were with David three days, eating and drinking: for their brethren had prepared for them. Chap. 12, Verse 39, [1CH].

Moreover they that were nigh them, [even] unto Issachar and Zebulun and Naphtali, brought bread on asses, and on camels, and on mules, and on oxen, [and] meat, meal, cakes of figs, and bunches of raisins, and wine, and oil, and oxen, and sheep abundantly: for [there was] joy in Israel. Chap. 12, Verse 40, [1CH].

And David consulted with the captains of thousands and hundreds, [and] with every leader. Chap. 13, Verse 1, [1CH].

And David said unto all the congregation of Israel, If [it seem] good unto you, and [that it be] of the LORD our God, let us send abroad unto our brethren every where, [that are] left in all the land of Israel, and with them [also] to the priests and Levites [which are] in their cities [and] suburbs, that they may gather themselves unto us: Chap. 13, Verse 2, [1CH].

And let us bring again the ark of our God to us: for we inquired not at it in the days of Saul. Chap. 13, Verse 3, [1CH].

And all the congregation said that they would do so: for the thing was right in the eyes of all the people. Chap. 13, Verse 4, [1CH].

So David gathered all Israel together, from Shihor of Egypt even unto the entering of Hemath, to bring the ark of God from Kirjath-jearim. Chap. 13, Verse 5, [1CH].

And David went up, and all Israel, to Baalah, [that is],

to Kirjath-jearim, which [belonged] to Judah, to bring up thence the ark of God the LORD, that dwelleth [between] the cherubims, whose name is called [on it]. Chap. 13, Verse 6, [1CH].

And they carried the ark of God in a new cart out of the house of Abinadab: and Uzza and Ahio drave the cart. Chap. 13, Verse 7, [1CH].

And David and all Israel played before God with all [their] might, and with singing, and with harps, and with psalteries, and with timbrels, and with cymbals, and with trumpets. Chap. 13, Verse 8, [1CH].

And when they came unto the threshingfloor of Chidon, Uzza put forth his hand to hold the ark; for the oxen stumbled. Chap. 13, Verse 9, [1CH].

And the anger of the LORD was kindled against Uzza, and he smote him, because he put his hand to the ark: and there he died before God. Chap. 13, Verse 10, [1CH].

And David was displeased, because the LORD had made a breach upon Uzza: wherefore that place is called Perez-uzza to this day. Chap. 13, Verse 11, [1CH].

And David was afraid of God that day, saying, How shall I bring the ark of God [home] to me? Chap. 13, Verse 12, [1CH].

So David brought not the ark [home] to himself to the city of David, but carried it aside into the house of Obed-edom the Gittite. Chap. 13, Verse 13, [1CH].

And the ark of God remained with the family of Obed-edom in his house three months. And the LORD blessed the house of Obed-edom, and all that he had. Chap. 13, Verse 14, [1CH].

Now Hiram king of Tyre sent messengers to David, and timber of cedars, with masons and carpenters, to build him an house. Chap. 14, Verse 1, [1CH].

And David perceived that the LORD had confirmed him king over Israel, for his kingdom was lifted up on high, because of his people Israel. Chap. 14, Verse 2, [1CH].

And David took more wives at Jerusalem: and David begat more sons and daughters. Chap. 14, Verse 3, [1CH].

Now these [are] the names of [his] children which he had in Jerusalem; Shammua, and Shobab, Nathan, and Solomon, Chap. 14, Verse 4, [1CH].

And Ibhar, and Elishua, and Elpalet, Chap. 14, Verse 5, [1CH].

And Nogah, and Nepheg, and Japhia, Chap. 14, Verse 6, [1CH].

And Elishama, and Beeliada, and Eliphalet. Chap. 14, Verse 7, [1CH].

And when the Philistines heard that David was anointed king over all Israel, all the Philistines went up to seek David. And David heard [of it], and went out against them. Chap. 14, Verse 8, [1CH].

And the Philistines came and spread themselves in the valley of Rephaim. Chap. 14, Verse 9, [1CH].

And David inquired of God, saying, Shall I go up against the Philistines? and wilt thou deliver them into mine hand? And the LORD said unto him, Go up; for I will deliver them into thine hand. Chap. 14, Verse 10, [1CH].

So they came up to Baal-perazim; and David smote them there. Then David said, God hath broken in upon mine enemies by mine hand like the breaking forth of waters: therefore they called the name of that place Baal-perazim. Chap. 14, Verse 11, [1CH].

And when they had left their gods there, David gave a commandment, and they were burned with fire. Chap. 14, Verse 12, [1CH].

And the Philistines yet again spread themselves abroad in the valley. Chap. 14, Verse 13, [1CH].

Therefore David inquired again of God; and God said unto him, Go not up after them; turn away from them, and come upon them over against the mulberry trees. Chap. 14, Verse 14, [1CH].

And it shall be, when thou shalt hear a sound of going in the tops of the mulberry trees, [that] then thou shalt go out to battle: for God is gone forth before thee to smite the host of the Philistines. Chap. 14, Verse 15, [1CH].

David therefore did as God commanded him: and they smote the host of the Philistines from Gibeon even to Gazer. Chap. 14, Verse 16, [1CH].

And the fame of David went out into all lands; and the LORD brought the fear of him upon all nations. Chap. 14, Verse 17, [1CH].

And [David] made him houses in the city of David, and prepared a place for the ark of God, and pitched for it a tent. Chap. 15, Verse 1, [1CH].

Then David said, None ought to carry the ark of God but the Levites: for them hath the LORD chosen to carry the ark of God, and to minister unto him for ever. Chap. 15, Verse 2, [1CH].

And David gathered all Israel together to Jerusalem, to bring up the ark of the LORD unto his place, which he had prepared for it. Chap. 15, Verse 3, [1CH].

And David assembled the children of Aaron, and the Levites: Chap. 15, Verse 4, [1CH].

Of the sons of Kohath; Uriel the chief, and his brethren an hundred and twenty: Chap. 15, Verse 5, [1CH].

Of the sons of Merari; Asaiah the chief, and his brethren two hundred and twenty: Chap. 15, Verse 6, [1CH].

Of the sons of Gershom; Joel the chief, and his brethren an hundred and thirty: Chap. 15, Verse 7, [1CH].

Of the sons of Elizaphan; Shemaiah the chief, and his brethren two hundred: Chap. 15, Verse 8, [1CH].

Of the sons of Hebron; Eliel the chief, and his brethren fourscore: Chap. 15, Verse 9, [1CH].

Of the sons of Uzziel; Amminadab the chief, and his brethren an hundred and twelve. Chap. 15, Verse 10, [1CH].

And David called for Zadok and Abiathar the priests, and for the Levites, for Uriel, Asaiah, and Joel, Shemaiah, and Eliel, and Amminadab, Chap. 15, Verse 11, [1CH].

And said unto them, Ye [are] the chief of the fathers of the Levites: sanctify yourselves, [both] ye and your brethren, that ye may bring up the ark of the LORD God of Israel unto [the place that] I have prepared for it. Chap. 15, Verse 12, [1CH].

For because ye [did it] not at the first, the LORD our God made a breach upon us, for that we sought him not after the due order. Chap. 15, Verse 13, [1CH].

So the priests and the Levites sanctified themselves to bring up the ark of the LORD God of Israel. Chap. 15, Verse 14, [1CH].

And the children of the Levites bare the ark of God upon their shoulders with the staves thereon, as Moses commanded according to the word of the LORD. Chap. 15, Verse 15, [1CH].

And David spake to the chief of the Levites to appoint their brethren [to be] the singers with instruments of music, psalteries and harps and cymbals, sounding, by lifting up the voice with joy. Chap. 15, Verse 16, [1CH].

So the Levites appointed Heman the son of Joel; and of his brethren, Asaph the son of Berechiah; and of the sons of Merari their brethren, Ethan the son of Kushaiah; Chap. 15, Verse 17, [1CH].

And with them their brethren of the second [degree], Zechariah, Ben, and Jaaziel, and Shemiramoth, and Jehiel, and Unni, Eliab, and Benaiah, and Maaseiah, and Mattithiah, and Elipheleh, and Mikneiah, and Obed-edom, and Jeiel, the porters. Chap. 15, Verse 18, [1CH].

So the singers, Heman, Asaph, and Ethan, [were appointed] to sound with cymbals of brass; Chap. 15, Verse 19, [1CH].

And Zechariah, and Aziel, and Shemiramoth, and Jehiel, and Unni, and Eliab, and Maaseiah, and Benaiah, with psalteries on Alamoth; Chap. 15, Verse 20, [1CH].

And Mattithiah, and Elipheleh, and Mikneiah, and Obed-

edom, and Jeiel, and Azaziah, with harps on the Sheminith to excel. Chap. 15, Verse 21, [1CH].

And Chenaniah, chief of the Levites, [was] for song: he instructed about the song, because he [was] skilful. Chap. 15, Verse 22, [1CH].

And Berechiah and Elkanah [were] doorkeepers for the ark. Chap. 15, Verse 23, [1CH].

And Shebaniah, and Jehoshaphat, and Nethaneel, and Amasai, and Zechariah, and Benaiah, and Eliezer, the priests, did blow with the trumpets before the ark of God: and Obed-edom and Jehiah [were] doorkeepers for the ark. Chap. 15, Verse 24, [1CH].

So David, and the elders of Israel, and the captains over thousands, went to bring up the ark of the covenant of the LORD out of the house of Obed-edom with joy. Chap. 15, Verse 25, [1CH].

And it came to pass, when God helped the Levites that bare the ark of the covenant of the LORD, that they offered seven bullocks and seven rams. Chap. 15, Verse 26, [1CH].

And David [was] clothed with a robe of fine linen, and all the Levites that bare the ark, and the singers, and Chenaniah the master of the song with the singers: David also [had] upon him an ephod of linen. Chap. 15, Verse 27, [1CH].

Thus all Israel brought up the ark of the covenant of the LORD with shouting, and with sound of the cornet, and with trumpets, and with cymbals, making a noise with psalteries and harps. Chap. 15, Verse 28, [1CH].

And it came to pass, [as] the ark of the covenant of the LORD came to the city of David, that Michal the daughter of Saul looking out at a window saw king David dancing and playing: and she despised him in her heart. Chap. 15, Verse 29, [1CH].

So they brought the ark of God, and set it in the midst of the tent that David had pitched for it: and they offered burnt sacrifices and peace offerings before God. Chap. 16, Verse 1, [1CH].

And when David had made an end of offering the burnt offerings and the peace offerings, he blessed the people in the name of the LORD. Chap. 16, Verse 2, [1CH].

And he dealt to every one of Israel, both man and woman, to every one a loaf of bread, and a good piece of flesh, and a flagon [of wine]. Chap. 16, Verse 3, [1CH].

And he appointed [certain] of the Levites to minister before the ark of the LORD, and to record, and to thank and praise the LORD God of Israel: Chap. 16, Verse 4, [1CH].

Asaph the chief, and next to him Zechariah, Jeiel, and Shemiramoth, and Jehiel, and Mattithiah, and Eliab, and Benaiah, and Obed-edom: and Jeiel with psalteries and with harps; but Asaph made a sound with cymbals; Chap. 16, Verse 5, [1CH].

Benaiah also and Jahaziel the priests with trumpets continually before the ark of the covenant of God. Chap. 16, Verse 6, [1CH].

Then on that day David delivered first [this psalm] to thank the LORD into the hand of Asaph and his brethren. Chap. 16, Verse 7, [1CH].

Give thanks unto the LORD, call upon his name, make known his deeds among the people. Chap. 16, Verse 8, [1CH].

Sing unto him, sing psalms unto him, talk ye of all his wondrous works. Chap. 16, Verse 9, [1CH].

Glory ye in his holy name: let the heart of them rejoice that seek the LORD. Chap. 16, Verse 10, [1CH].

Seek the LORD and his strength, seek his face continually. Chap. 16, Verse 11, [1CH].

Remember his marvellous works that he hath done, his wonders, and the judgments of his mouth; Chap. 16, Verse 12, [1CH].

O ye seed of Israel his servant, ye children of Jacob, his chosen ones. Chap. 16, Verse 13, [1CH].

He [is] the LORD our God; his judgments [are] in all the earth. Chap. 16, Verse 14, [1CH].

Be ye mindful always of his covenant; the word [which] he commanded to a thousand generations; Chap. 16, Verse 15, [1CH].

[Even of the covenant] which he made with Abraham, and of his oath unto Isaac; Chap. 16, Verse 16, [1CH].

And hath confirmed the same to Jacob for a law, [and] to Israel [for] an everlasting covenant, Chap. 16, Verse 17, [1CH].

Saying, Unto thee will I give the land of Canaan, the lot of your inheritance; Chap. 16, Verse 18, [1CH].

When ye were but few, even a few, and strangers in it. Chap. 16, Verse 19, [1CH].

And [when] they went from nation to nation, and from [one] kingdom to another people; Chap. 16, Verse 20, [1CH].

He suffered no man to do them wrong: yea, he reproveth kings for their sakes, Chap. 16, Verse 21, [1CH].

[Saying], Touch not mine anointed, and do my prophets no harm. Chap. 16, Verse 22, [1CH].

Sing unto the LORD, all the earth; shew forth from day to day his salvation. Chap. 16, Verse 23, [1CH].

Declare his glory among the heathen; his marvellous works among all nations. Chap. 16, Verse 24, [1CH].

For great [is] the LORD, and greatly to be praised: he also [is] to be feared above all gods. Chap. 16, Verse 25, [1CH].

For all the gods of the people [are] idols: but the LORD made the heavens. Chap. 16, Verse 26, [1CH].

Glory and honour [are] in his presence; strength and gladness [are] in his place. Chap. 16, Verse 27, [1CH].

Give unto the LORD, ye kindreds of the people, give unto the LORD glory and strength. Chap. 16, Verse 28, [1CH].

Give unto the LORD the glory [due] unto his name: bring an

offering, and come before him: worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness. Chap. 16, Verse 29, [1CH].

Fear before him, all the earth: the world also shall be stable, that it be not moved. Chap. 16, Verse 30, [1CH].

Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice: and let [men] say among the nations, The LORD reigneth. Chap. 16, Verse 31, [1CH].

Let the sea roar, and the fulness thereof: let the fields rejoice, and all that [is] therein. Chap. 16, Verse 32, [1CH].

Then shall the trees of the wood sing out at the presence of the LORD, because he cometh to judge the earth. Chap. 16, Verse 33, [1CH].

O give thanks unto the LORD; for [he is] good; for his mercy [endureth] for ever. Chap. 16, Verse 34, [1CH].

And say ye, Save us, O God of our salvation, and gather us together, and deliver us from the heathen, that we may give thanks to thy holy name, [and] glory in thy praise. Chap. 16, Verse 35, [1CH].

Blessed [be] the LORD God of Israel for ever and ever. And all the people said, Amen, and praised the LORD. Chap. 16, Verse 36, [1CH].

So he left there before the ark of the covenant of the LORD Asaph and his brethren, to minister before the ark continually, as every day's work required: Chap. 16, Verse 37, [1CH].

And Obed-edom with their brethren, threescore and eight; Obed-edom also the son of Jeduthun and Hosah [to be] porters: Chap. 16, Verse 38, [1CH].

And Zadok the priest, and his brethren the priests, before the tabernacle of the LORD in the high place that [was] at Gibeon, Chap. 16, Verse 39, [1CH].

To offer burnt offerings unto the LORD upon the altar of the burnt offering continually morning and evening, and [to do] according to all that is written in the law of the LORD, which he commanded Israel; Chap. 16, Verse 40,

[1CH].

And with them Heman and Jeduthun, and the rest that were chosen, who were expressed by name, to give thanks to the LORD, because his mercy [endureth] for ever; Chap. 16, Verse 41, [1CH].

And with them Heman and Jeduthun with trumpets and cymbals for those that should make a sound, and with musical instruments of God. And the sons of Jeduthun [were] porters. Chap. 16, Verse 42, [1CH].

And all the people departed every man to his house: and David returned to bless his house. Chap. 16, Verse 43, [1CH].

Now it came to pass, as David sat in his house, that David said to Nathan the prophet, Lo, I dwell in an house of cedars, but the ark of the covenant of the LORD [remaineth] under curtains. Chap. 17, Verse 1, [1CH].

Then Nathan said unto David, Do all that [is] in thine heart; for God [is] with thee. Chap. 17, Verse 2, [1CH].

And it came to pass the same night, that the word of God came to Nathan, saying, Chap. 17, Verse 3, [1CH].

Go and tell David my servant, Thus saith the LORD, Thou shalt not build me an house to dwell in: Chap. 17, Verse 4, [1CH].

For I have not dwelt in an house since the day that I brought up Israel unto this day; but have gone from tent to tent, and from [one] tabernacle [to another]. Chap. 17, Verse 5, [1CH].

Wheresoever I have walked with all Israel, spake I a word to any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to feed my people, saying, Why have ye not built me an house of cedars? Chap. 17, Verse 6, [1CH].

Now therefore thus shalt thou say unto my servant David, Thus saith the LORD of hosts, I took thee from the shepcote, [even] from following the sheep, that thou shouldest be ruler over my people Israel: Chap. 17, Verse 7, [1CH].

And I have been with thee whithersoever thou hast walked, and have cut off all thine enemies from before thee, and have made thee a name like the name of the great men that [are] in the earth. Chap. 17, Verse 8, [1CH].

Also I will ordain a place for my people Israel, and will plant them, and they shall dwell in their place, and shall be moved no more; neither shall the children of wickedness waste them any more, as at the beginning, Chap. 17, Verse 9, [1CH].

And since the time that I commanded judges [to be] over my people Israel. Moreover I will subdue all thine enemies. Furthermore I tell thee that the LORD will build thee an house. Chap. 17, Verse 10, [1CH].

And it shall come to pass, when thy days be expired that thou must go [to be] with thy fathers, that I will raise up thy seed after thee, which shall be of thy sons; and I will establish his kingdom. Chap. 17, Verse 11, [1CH].

He shall build me an house, and I will stablish his throne for ever. Chap. 17, Verse 12, [1CH].

I will be his father, and he shall be my son: and I will not take my mercy away from him, as I took [it] from [him] that was before thee: Chap. 17, Verse 13, [1CH].

But I will settle him in mine house and in my kingdom for ever: and his throne shall be established for evermore. Chap. 17, Verse 14, [1CH].

According to all these words, and according to all this vision, so did Nathan speak unto David. Chap. 17, Verse 15, [1CH].

And David the king came and sat before the LORD, and said, Who [am] I, O LORD God, and what [is] mine house, that thou hast brought me hitherto? Chap. 17, Verse 16, [1CH].

And [yet] this was a small thing in thine eyes, O God; for thou hast [also] spoken of thy servant's house for a great while to come, and hast regarded me according to the estate of a man of high degree, O LORD God. Chap. 17, Verse 17, [1CH].

What can David [speak] more to thee for the honour of thy

servant? for thou knowest thy servant. Chap. 17, Verse 18, [1CH].

O LORD, for thy servant's sake, and according to thine own heart, hast thou done all this greatness, in making known all [these] great things. Chap. 17, Verse 19, [1CH].

O LORD, [there is] none like thee, neither [is there any] God beside thee, according to all that we have heard with our ears. Chap. 17, Verse 20, [1CH].

And what one nation in the earth [is] like thy people Israel, whom God went to redeem [to be] his own people, to make thee a name of greatness and terribleness, by driving out nations from before thy people, whom thou hast redeemed out of Egypt? Chap. 17, Verse 21, [1CH].

For thy people Israel didst thou make thine own people for ever; and thou, LORD, becamest their God. Chap. 17, Verse 22, [1CH].

Therefore now, LORD, let the thing that thou hast spoken concerning thy servant and concerning his house be established for ever, and do as thou hast said. Chap. 17, Verse 23, [1CH].

Let it even be established, that thy name may be magnified for ever, saying, The LORD of hosts [is] the God of Israel, [even] a God to Israel: and [let] the house of David thy servant [be] established before thee. Chap. 17, Verse 24, [1CH].

For thou, O my God, hast told thy servant that thou wilt build him an house: therefore thy servant hath found [in his heart] to pray before thee. Chap. 17, Verse 25, [1CH].

And now, LORD, thou art God, and hast promised this goodness unto thy servant: Chap. 17, Verse 26, [1CH].

Now therefore let it please thee to bless the house of thy servant, that it may be before thee for ever: for thou blessest, O LORD, and [it shall be] blessed for ever. Chap. 17, Verse 27, [1CH].

Now after this it came to pass, that David smote the Philistines, and subdued them, and took Gath and her towns out of the hand of the Philistines. Chap. 18, Verse 1,

[1CH].

And he smote Moab; and the Moabites became David's servants, [and] brought gifts. Chap. 18, Verse 2, [1CH].

And David smote Hadarezer king of Zobah unto Hamath, as he went to stablish his dominion by the river Euphrates. Chap. 18, Verse 3, [1CH].

And David took from him a thousand chariots, and seven thousand horsemen, and twenty thousand footmen: David also houghed all the chariot [horses], but reserved of them an hundred chariots. Chap. 18, Verse 4, [1CH].

And when the Syrians of Damascus came to help Hadarezer king of Zobah, David slew of the Syrians two and twenty thousand men. Chap. 18, Verse 5, [1CH].

Then David put [garrisons] in Syria-damascus; and the Syrians became David's servants, [and] brought gifts. Thus the LORD preserved David whithersoever he went. Chap. 18, Verse 6, [1CH].

And David took the shields of gold that were on the servants of Hadarezer, and brought them to Jerusalem. Chap. 18, Verse 7, [1CH].

Likewise from Tibhath, and from Chun, cities of Hadarezer, brought David very much brass, wherewith Solomon made the brasen sea, and the pillars, and the vessels of brass. Chap. 18, Verse 8, [1CH].

Now when Tou king of Hamath heard how David had smitten all the host of Hadarezer king of Zobah; Chap. 18, Verse 9, [1CH].

He sent Hadoram his son to king David, to inquire of his welfare, and to congratulate him, because he had fought against Hadarezer, and smitten him; (for Hadarezer had war with Tou;) and [with him] all manner of vessels of gold and silver and brass. Chap. 18, Verse 10, [1CH].

Them also king David dedicated unto the LORD, with the silver and the gold that he brought from all [these] nations; from Edom, and from Moab, and from the children of Ammon, and from the Philistines, and from Amalek. Chap. 18, Verse 11, [1CH].

Moreover Abishai the son of Zeruiah slew of the Edomites in the valley of salt eighteen thousand. Chap. 18, Verse 12, [1CH].

And he put garrisons in Edom; and all the Edomites became David's servants. Thus the LORD preserved David whithersoever he went. Chap. 18, Verse 13, [1CH].

So David reigned over all Israel, and executed judgment and justice among all his people. Chap. 18, Verse 14, [1CH].

And Joab the son of Zeruiah [was] over the host; and Jehoshaphat the son of Ahilud, recorder. Chap. 18, Verse 15, [1CH].

And Zadok the son of Ahitub, and Abimelech the son of Abiathar, [were] the priests; and Shavsha was scribe; Chap. 18, Verse 16, [1CH].

And Benaiah the son of Jehoiada [was] over the Cherethites and the Pelethites; and the sons of David [were] chief about the king. Chap. 18, Verse 17, [1CH].

Now it came to pass after this, that Nahash the king of the children of Ammon died, and his son reigned in his stead. Chap. 19, Verse 1, [1CH].

And David said, I will shew kindness unto Hanun the son of Nahash, because his father shewed kindness to me. And David sent messengers to comfort him concerning his father. So the servants of David came into the land of the children of Ammon to Hanun, to comfort him. Chap. 19, Verse 2, [1CH].

But the princes of the children of Ammon said to Hanun, Thinkest thou that David doth honour thy father, that he hath sent comforters unto thee? are not his servants come unto thee for to search, and to overthrow, and to spy out the land? Chap. 19, Verse 3, [1CH].

Wherefore Hanun took David's servants, and shaved them, and cut off their garments in the midst hard by their buttocks, and sent them away. Chap. 19, Verse 4, [1CH].

Then there went [certain], and told David how the men were served. And he sent to meet them: for the men were greatly

ashamed. And the king said, Tarry at Jericho until your beards be grown, and [then] return. Chap. 19, Verse 5, [1CH].

And when the children of Ammon saw that they had made themselves odious to David, Hanun and the children of Ammon sent a thousand talents of silver to hire them chariots and horsemen out of Mesopotamia, and out of Syria-maachah, and out of Zobah. Chap. 19, Verse 6, [1CH].

So they hired thirty and two thousand chariots, and the king of Maachah and his people; who came and pitched before Medeba. And the children of Ammon gathered themselves together from their cities, and came to battle. Chap. 19, Verse 7, [1CH].

And when David heard [of it], he sent Joab, and all the host of the mighty men. Chap. 19, Verse 8, [1CH].

And the children of Ammon came out, and put the battle in array before the gate of the city: and the kings that were come [were] by themselves in the field. Chap. 19, Verse 9, [1CH].

Now when Joab saw that the battle was set against him before and behind, he chose out of all the choice of Israel, and put [them] in array against the Syrians. Chap. 19, Verse 10, [1CH].

And the rest of the people he delivered unto the hand of Abishai his brother, and they set [themselves] in array against the children of Ammon. Chap. 19, Verse 11, [1CH].

And he said, If the Syrians be too strong for me, then thou shalt help me: but if the children of Ammon be too strong for thee, then I will help thee. Chap. 19, Verse 12, [1CH].

Be of good courage, and let us behave ourselves valiantly for our people, and for the cities of our God: and let the LORD do [that which is] good in his sight. Chap. 19, Verse 13, [1CH].

So Joab and the people that [were] with him drew nigh before the Syrians unto the battle; and they fled before him. Chap. 19, Verse 14, [1CH].

And when the children of Ammon saw that the Syrians were fled, they likewise fled before Abishai his brother, and entered into the city. Then Joab came to Jerusalem. Chap. 19, Verse 15, [1CH].

And when the Syrians saw that they were put to the worse before Israel, they sent messengers, and drew forth the Syrians that [were] beyond the river: and Shophach the captain of the host of Hadarezer [went] before them. Chap. 19, Verse 16, [1CH].

And it was told David; and he gathered all Israel, and passed over Jordan, and came upon them, and set [the battle] in array against them. So when David had put the battle in array against the Syrians, they fought with him. Chap. 19, Verse 17, [1CH].

But the Syrians fled before Israel; and David slew of the Syrians seven thousand [men which fought in] chariots, and forty thousand footmen, and killed Shophach the captain of the host. Chap. 19, Verse 18, [1CH].

And when the servants of Hadarezer saw that they were put to the worse before Israel, they made peace with David, and became his servants: neither would the Syrians help the children of Ammon any more. Chap. 19, Verse 19, [1CH].

And it came to pass, that after the year was expired, at the time that kings go out [to battle], Joab led forth the power of the army, and wasted the country of the children of Ammon, and came and besieged Rabbah. But David tarried at Jerusalem. And Joab smote Rabbah, and destroyed it. Chap. 20, Verse 1, [1CH].

And David took the crown of their king from off his head, and found it to weigh a talent of gold, and [there were] precious stones in it; and it was set upon David's head: and he brought also exceeding much spoil out of the city. Chap. 20, Verse 2, [1CH].

And he brought out the people that [were] in it, and cut [them] with saws, and with harrows of iron, and with axes. Even so dealt David with all the cities of the children of Ammon. And David and all the people returned to Jerusalem. Chap. 20, Verse 3, [1CH].

And it came to pass after this, that there arose war at

Gezer with the Philistines; at which time Sibbechai the Hushathite slew Sippai, [that was] of the children of the giant: and they were subdued. Chap. 20, Verse 4, [1CH].

And there was war again with the Philistines; and Elhanan the son of Jair slew Lahmi the brother of Goliath the Gittite, whose spear staff [was] like a weaver's beam. Chap. 20, Verse 5, [1CH].

And yet again there was war at Gath, where was a man of [great] stature, whose fingers and toes [were] four and twenty, six [on each hand], and six [on each foot]: and he also was the son of the giant. Chap. 20, Verse 6, [1CH].

But when he defied Israel, Jonathan the son of Shimea David's brother slew him. Chap. 20, Verse 7, [1CH].

These were born unto the giant in Gath; and they fell by the hand of David, and by the hand of his servants. Chap. 20, Verse 8, [1CH].

And Satan stood up against Israel, and provoked David to number Israel. Chap. 21, Verse 1, [1CH].

And David said to Joab and to the rulers of the people, Go, number Israel from Beer-sheba even to Dan; and bring the number of them to me, that I may know [it]. Chap. 21, Verse 2, [1CH].

And Joab answered, The LORD make his people an hundred times so many more as they [be]: but, my lord the king, [are] they not all my lord's servants? why then doth my lord require this thing? why will he be a cause of trespass to Israel? Chap. 21, Verse 3, [1CH].

Nevertheless the king's word prevailed against Joab. Wherefore Joab departed, and went throughout all Israel, and came to Jerusalem. Chap. 21, Verse 4, [1CH].

And Joab gave the sum of the number of the people unto David. And all [they of] Israel were a thousand thousand and an hundred thousand men that drew sword: and Judah [was] four hundred threescore and ten thousand men that drew sword. Chap. 21, Verse 5, [1CH].

But Levi and Benjamin counted he not among them: for the king's word was abominable to Joab. Chap. 21, Verse 6,

[1CH].

And God was displeased with this thing; therefore he smote Israel. Chap. 21, Verse 7, [1CH].

And David said unto God, I have sinned greatly, because I have done this thing: but now, I beseech thee, do away the iniquity of thy servant; for I have done very foolishly. Chap. 21, Verse 8, [1CH].

And the LORD spake unto Gad, David's seer, saying, Chap. 21, Verse 9, [1CH].

Go and tell David, saying, Thus saith the LORD, I offer thee three [things]: choose thee one of them, that I may do [it] unto thee. Chap. 21, Verse 10, [1CH].

So Gad came to David, and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Choose thee Chap. 21, Verse 11, [1CH].

Either three years' famine; or three months to be destroyed before thy foes, while that the sword of thine enemies overtaketh [thee]; or else three days the sword of the LORD, even the pestilence, in the land, and the angel of the LORD destroying throughout all the coasts of Israel. Now therefore advise thyself what word I shall bring again to him that sent me. Chap. 21, Verse 12, [1CH].

And David said unto Gad, I am in a great strait: let me fall now into the hand of the LORD; for very great [are] his mercies: but let me not fall into the hand of man. Chap. 21, Verse 13, [1CH].

So the LORD sent pestilence upon Israel: and there fell of Israel seventy thousand men. Chap. 21, Verse 14, [1CH].

And God sent an angel unto Jerusalem to destroy it: and as he was destroying, the LORD beheld, and he repented him of the evil, and said to the angel that destroyed, It is enough, stay now thine hand. And the angel of the LORD stood by the threshingfloor of Ornan the Jebusite. Chap. 21, Verse 15, [1CH].

And David lifted up his eyes, and saw the angel of the LORD stand between the earth and the heaven, having a drawn sword in his hand stretched out over Jerusalem. Then David and the elders [of Israel, who were] clothed in sackcloth,

fell upon their faces. Chap. 21, Verse 16, [1CH].

And David said unto God, [Is it] not I [that] commanded the people to be numbered? even I it is that have sinned and done evil indeed; but [as for] these sheep, what have they done? let thine hand, I pray thee, O LORD my God, be on me, and on my father's house; but not on thy people, that they should be plagued. Chap. 21, Verse 17, [1CH].

Then the angel of the LORD commanded Gad to say to David, that David should go up, and set up an altar unto the LORD in the threshingfloor of Ornan the Jebusite. Chap. 21, Verse 18, [1CH].

And David went up at the saying of Gad, which he spake in the name of the LORD. Chap. 21, Verse 19, [1CH].

And Ornan turned back, and saw the angel; and his four sons with him hid themselves. Now Ornan was threshing wheat. Chap. 21, Verse 20, [1CH].

And as David came to Ornan, Ornan looked and saw David, and went out of the threshingfloor, and bowed himself to David with [his] face to the ground. Chap. 21, Verse 21, [1CH].

Then David said to Ornan, Grant me the place of [this] threshingfloor, that I may build an altar therein unto the LORD: thou shalt grant it me for the full price: that the plague may be stayed from the people. Chap. 21, Verse 22, [1CH].

And Ornan said unto David, Take [it] to thee, and let my lord the king do [that which is] good in his eyes: lo, I give [thee] the oxen [also] for burnt offerings, and the threshing instruments for wood, and the wheat for the meat offering; I give it all. Chap. 21, Verse 23, [1CH].

And king David said to Ornan, Nay; but I will verily buy it for the full price: for I will not take [that] which [is] thine for the LORD, nor offer burnt offerings without cost. Chap. 21, Verse 24, [1CH].

So David gave to Ornan for the place six hundred shekels of gold by weight. Chap. 21, Verse 25, [1CH].

And David built there an altar unto the LORD, and offered

burnt offerings and peace offerings, and called upon the LORD; and he answered him from heaven by fire upon the altar of burnt offering. Chap. 21, Verse 26, [1CH].

And the LORD commanded the angel; and he put up his sword again into the sheath thereof. Chap. 21, Verse 27, [1CH].

At that time when David saw that the LORD had answered him in the threshingfloor of Ornan the Jebusite, then he sacrificed there. Chap. 21, Verse 28, [1CH].

For the tabernacle of the LORD, which Moses made in the wilderness, and the altar of the burnt offering, [were] at that season in the high place at Gibeon. Chap. 21, Verse 29, [1CH].

But David could not go before it to inquire of God: for he was afraid because of the sword of the angel of the LORD. Chap. 21, Verse 30, [1CH].

Then David said, This [is] the house of the LORD God, and this [is] the altar of the burnt offering for Israel. Chap. 22, Verse 1, [1CH].

And David commanded to gather together the strangers that [were] in the land of Israel; and he set masons to hew wrought stones to build the house of God. Chap. 22, Verse 2, [1CH].

And David prepared iron in abundance for the nails for the doors of the gates, and for the joinings; and brass in abundance without weight; Chap. 22, Verse 3, [1CH].

Also cedar trees in abundance: for the Zidonians and they of Tyre brought much cedar wood to David. Chap. 22, Verse 4, [1CH].

And David said, Solomon my son [is] young and tender, and the house [that is] to be builded for the LORD [must be] exceeding magnificent, of fame and of glory throughout all countries: I will [therefore] now make preparation for it. So David prepared abundantly before his death. Chap. 22, Verse 5, [1CH].

Then he called for Solomon his son, and charged him to build an house for the LORD God of Israel. Chap. 22, Verse 6, [1CH].

And David said to Solomon, My son, as for me, it was in my mind to build an house unto the name of the LORD my God: Chap. 22, Verse 7, [1CH].

But the word of the LORD came to me, saying, Thou hast shed blood abundantly, and hast made great wars: thou shalt not build an house unto my name, because thou hast shed much blood upon the earth in my sight. Chap. 22, Verse 8, [1CH].

Behold, a son shall be born to thee, who shall be a man of rest; and I will give him rest from all his enemies round about: for his name shall be Solomon, and I will give peace and quietness unto Israel in his days. Chap. 22, Verse 9, [1CH].

He shall build an house for my name; and he shall be my son, and I [will be] his father; and I will establish the throne of his kingdom over Israel for ever. Chap. 22, Verse 10, [1CH].

Now, my son, the LORD be with thee; and prosper thou, and build the house of the LORD thy God, as he hath said of thee. Chap. 22, Verse 11, [1CH].

Only the LORD give thee wisdom and understanding, and give thee charge concerning Israel, that thou mayest keep the law of the LORD thy God. Chap. 22, Verse 12, [1CH].

Then shalt thou prosper, if thou takest heed to fulfil the statutes and judgments which the LORD charged Moses with concerning Israel: be strong, and of good courage; dread not, nor be dismayed. Chap. 22, Verse 13, [1CH].

Now, behold, in my trouble I have prepared for the house of the LORD an hundred thousand talents of gold, and a thousand thousand talents of silver; and of brass and iron without weight; for it is in abundance: timber also and stone have I prepared; and thou mayest add thereto. Chap. 22, Verse 14, [1CH].

Moreover [there are] workmen with thee in abundance, hewers and workers of stone and timber, and all manner of cunning men for every manner of work. Chap. 22, Verse 15, [1CH].

Of the gold, the silver, and the brass, and the iron, [there is] no number. Arise [therefore], and be doing, and the LORD be with thee. Chap. 22, Verse 16, [1CH].

David also commanded all the princes of Israel to help Solomon his son, [saying], Chap. 22, Verse 17, [1CH].

[Is] not the LORD your God with you? and hath he [not] given you rest on every side? for he hath given the inhabitants of the land into mine hand; and the land is subdued before the LORD, and before his people. Chap. 22, Verse 18, [1CH].

Now set your heart and your soul to seek the LORD your God; arise therefore, and build ye the sanctuary of the LORD God, to bring the ark of the covenant of the LORD, and the holy vessels of God, into the house that is to be built to the name of the LORD. Chap. 22, Verse 19, [1CH].

So when David was old and full of days, he made Solomon his son king over Israel. Chap. 23, Verse 1, [1CH].

And he gathered together all the princes of Israel, with the priests and the Levites. Chap. 23, Verse 2, [1CH].

Now the Levites were numbered from the age of thirty years and upward: and their number by their polls, man by man, was thirty and eight thousand. Chap. 23, Verse 3, [1CH].

Of which, twenty and four thousand [were] to set forward the work of the house of the LORD; and six thousand [were] officers and judges: Chap. 23, Verse 4, [1CH].

Moreover four thousand [were] porters; and four thousand praised the LORD with the instruments which I made, [said David], to praise [therewith]. Chap. 23, Verse 5, [1CH].

And David divided them into courses among the sons of Levi, [namely], Gershon, Kohath, and Merari. Chap. 23, Verse 6, [1CH].

Of the Gershonites [were], Laadan, and Shimei. Chap. 23, Verse 7, [1CH].

The sons of Laadan; the chief [was] Jehiel, and Zetham, and Joel, three. Chap. 23, Verse 8, [1CH].

The sons of Shimei; Shelomith, and Haziël, and Haran, three. These [were] the chief of the fathers of Laadan. Chap. 23, Verse 9, [1CH].

And the sons of Shimei [were], Jahath, Zina, and Jeush, and Beriah. These four [were] the sons of Shimei. Chap. 23, Verse 10, [1CH].

And Jahath was the chief, and Zizah the second: but Jeush and Beriah had not many sons; therefore they were in one reckoning, according to [their] father's house. Chap. 23, Verse 11, [1CH].

The sons of Kohath; Amram, Izhar, Hebron, and Uzziel, four. Chap. 23, Verse 12, [1CH].

The sons of Amram; Aaron and Moses: and Aaron was separated, that he should sanctify the most holy things, he and his sons for ever, to burn incense before the LORD, to minister unto him, and to bless in his name for ever. Chap. 23, Verse 13, [1CH].

Now [concerning] Moses the man of God, his sons were named of the tribe of Levi. Chap. 23, Verse 14, [1CH].

The sons of Moses [were], Gershom, and Eliezer. Chap. 23, Verse 15, [1CH].

Of the sons of Gershom, Shebuel [was] the chief. Chap. 23, Verse 16, [1CH].

And the sons of Eliezer [were], Rehabiah the chief. And Eliezer had none other sons; but the sons of Rehabiah were very many. Chap. 23, Verse 17, [1CH].

Of the sons of Izhar; Shelomith the chief. Chap. 23, Verse 18, [1CH].

Of the sons of Hebron; Jeriah the first, Amariah the second, Jahaziel the third, and Jekameam the fourth. Chap. 23, Verse 19, [1CH].

Of the sons of Uzziel; Micah the first, and Jesiah the second. Chap. 23, Verse 20, [1CH].

The sons of Merari; Mahli, and Mushi. The sons of Mahli; Eleazar, and Kish. Chap. 23, Verse 21, [1CH].

And Eleazar died, and had no sons, but daughters: and their brethren the sons of Kish took them. Chap. 23, Verse 22, [1CH].

The sons of Mushi; Mahli, and Eder, and Jeremoth, three. Chap. 23, Verse 23, [1CH].

These [were] the sons of Levi after the house of their fathers; [even] the chief of the fathers, as they were counted by number of names by their polls, that did the work for the service of the house of the LORD, from the age of twenty years and upward. Chap. 23, Verse 24, [1CH].

For David said, The LORD God of Israel hath given rest unto his people, that they may dwell in Jerusalem for ever: Chap. 23, Verse 25, [1CH].

And also unto the Levites; they shall no [more] carry the tabernacle, nor any vessels of it for the service thereof. Chap. 23, Verse 26, [1CH].

For by the last words of David the Levites [were] numbered from twenty years old and above: Chap. 23, Verse 27, [1CH].

Because their office [was] to wait on the sons of Aaron for the service of the house of the LORD, in the courts, and in the chambers, and in the purifying of all holy things, and the work of the service of the house of God; Chap. 23, Verse 28, [1CH].

Both for the shewbread, and for the fine flour for meat offering, and for the unleavened cakes, and for [that which is baked in] the pan, and for that which is fried, and for all manner of measure and size; Chap. 23, Verse 29, [1CH].

And to stand every morning to thank and praise the LORD, and likewise at even; Chap. 23, Verse 30, [1CH].

And to offer all burnt sacrifices unto the LORD in the sabbaths, in the new moons, and on the set feasts, by number, according to the order commanded unto them, continually before the LORD: Chap. 23, Verse 31, [1CH].

And that they should keep the charge of the tabernacle of the congregation, and the charge of the holy [place], and

the charge of the sons of Aaron their brethren, in the service of the house of the LORD. Chap. 23, Verse 32, [1CH].

Now [these are] the divisions of the sons of Aaron. The sons of Aaron; Nadab, and Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar. Chap. 24, Verse 1, [1CH].

But Nadab and Abihu died before their father, and had no children: therefore Eleazar and Ithamar executed the priest's office. Chap. 24, Verse 2, [1CH].

And David distributed them, both Zadok of the sons of Eleazar, and Ahimelech of the sons of Ithamar, according to their offices in their service. Chap. 24, Verse 3, [1CH].

And there were more chief men found of the sons of Eleazar than of the sons of Ithamar; and [thus] were they divided. Among the sons of Eleazar [there were] sixteen chief men of the house of [their] fathers, and eight among the sons of Ithamar according to the house of their fathers. Chap. 24, Verse 4, [1CH].

Thus were they divided by lot, one sort with another; for the governors of the sanctuary, and governors [of the house] of God, were of the sons of Eleazar, and of the sons of Ithamar. Chap. 24, Verse 5, [1CH].

And Shemaiah the son of Nethaneel the scribe, [one] of the Levites, wrote them before the king, and the princes, and Zadok the priest, and Ahimelech the son of Abiathar, and [before] the chief of the fathers of the priests and Levites: one principal household being taken for Eleazar, and [one] taken for Ithamar. Chap. 24, Verse 6, [1CH].

Now the first lot came forth to Jehoiarib, the second to Jedaiah, Chap. 24, Verse 7, [1CH].

The third to Harim, the fourth to Seorim, Chap. 24, Verse 8, [1CH].

The fifth to Malchijah, the sixth to Mijamin, Chap. 24, Verse 9, [1CH].

The seventh to Hakkoz, the eighth to Abijah, Chap. 24, Verse 10, [1CH].

The ninth to Jeshuah, the tenth to Shecaniah, Chap. 24, Verse 11, [1CH].

The eleventh to Eliashib, the twelfth to Jakim, Chap. 24, Verse 12, [1CH].

The thirteenth to Huppah, the fourteenth to Jeshebeab, Chap. 24, Verse 13, [1CH].

The fifteenth to Bilgah, the sixteenth to Immer, Chap. 24, Verse 14, [1CH].

The seventeenth to Hezir, the eighteenth to Apses, Chap. 24, Verse 15, [1CH].

The nineteenth to Pethahiah, the twentieth to Jehzekiel, Chap. 24, Verse 16, [1CH].

The one and twentieth to Jachin, the two and twentieth to Gamul, Chap. 24, Verse 17, [1CH].

The three and twentieth to Delaiah, the four and twentieth to Maaziah. Chap. 24, Verse 18, [1CH].

These [were] the orderings of them in their service to come into the house of the LORD, according to their manner, under Aaron their father, as the LORD God of Israel had commanded him. Chap. 24, Verse 19, [1CH].

And the rest of the sons of Levi [were these]: Of the sons of Amram; Shubael: of the sons of Shubael; Jehdeiah. Chap. 24, Verse 20, [1CH].

Concerning Rehabiah: of the sons of Rehabiah, the first [was] Isshiah. Chap. 24, Verse 21, [1CH].

Of the Izharites; Shelomoth: of the sons of Shelomoth; Jahath. Chap. 24, Verse 22, [1CH].

And the sons [of Hebron]; Jeriah [the first], Amariah the second, Jahaziel the third, Jekameam the fourth. Chap. 24, Verse 23, [1CH].

[Of] the sons of Uzziel; Michah: of the sons of Michah; Shamir. Chap. 24, Verse 24, [1CH].

The brother of Michah [was] Isshiah: of the sons of

Isshiah; Zechariah. Chap. 24, Verse 25, [1CH].

The sons of Merari [were] Mahli and Mushi: the sons of Jaaziah; Beno. Chap. 24, Verse 26, [1CH].

The sons of Merari by Jaaziah; Beno, and Shoham, and Zaccur, and Ibri. Chap. 24, Verse 27, [1CH].

Of Mahli [came] Eleazar, who had no sons. Chap. 24, Verse 28, [1CH].

Concerning Kish: the son of Kish [was] Jerahmeel. Chap. 24, Verse 29, [1CH].

The sons also of Mushi; Mahli, and Eder, and Jerimoth. These [were] the sons of the Levites after the house of their fathers. Chap. 24, Verse 30, [1CH].

These likewise cast lots over against their brethren the sons of Aaron in the presence of David the king, and Zadok, and Ahimelech, and the chief of the fathers of the priests and Levites, even the principal fathers over against their younger brethren. Chap. 24, Verse 31, [1CH].

Moreover David and the captains of the host separated to the service of the sons of Asaph, and of Heman, and of Jeduthun, who should prophesy with harps, with psalteries, and with cymbals: and the number of the workmen according to their service was: Chap. 25, Verse 1, [1CH].

Of the sons of Asaph; Zaccur, and Joseph, and Nethaniah, and Asarelah, the sons of Asaph under the hands of Asaph, which prophesied according to the order of the king. Chap. 25, Verse 2, [1CH].

Of Jeduthun: the sons of Jeduthun; Gedaliah, and Zeri, and Jeshaiiah, Hashabiah, and Mattithiah, six, under the hands of their father Jeduthun, who prophesied with a harp, to give thanks and to praise the LORD. Chap. 25, Verse 3, [1CH].

Of Heman: the sons of Heman; Bukkiah, Mattaniah, Uzziel, Shebuel, and Jerimoth, Hananiah, Hanani, Eliathah, Giddalti, and Romamti-ezer, Joshbekashah, Mallothi, Hothir, [and] Mahazioth: Chap. 25, Verse 4, [1CH].

All these [were] the sons of Heman the king's seer in the

words of God, to lift up the horn. And God gave to Heman fourteen sons and three daughters. Chap. 25, Verse 5, [1CH].

All these [were] under the hands of their father for song [in] the house of the LORD, with cymbals, psalteries, and harps, for the service of the house of God, according to the king's order to Asaph, Jeduthun, and Heman. Chap. 25, Verse 6, [1CH].

So the number of them, with their brethren that were instructed in the songs of the LORD, [even] all that were cunning, was two hundred fourscore and eight. Chap. 25, Verse 7, [1CH].

And they cast lots, ward against [ward], as well the small as the great, the teacher as the scholar. Chap. 25, Verse 8, [1CH].

Now the first lot came forth for Asaph to Joseph: the second to Gedaliah, who with his brethren and sons [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 9, [1CH].

The third to Zaccur, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 10, [1CH].

The fourth to Izri, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 11, [1CH].

The fifth to Nethaniah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 12, [1CH].

The sixth to Bukkiah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 13, [1CH].

The seventh to Jesharelah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 14, [1CH].

The eighth to Jeshaiiah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 15, [1CH].

The ninth to Mattaniah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 16, [1CH].

The tenth to Shimei, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 17, [1CH].

The eleventh to Azareel, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 18, [1CH].

The twelfth to Hashabiah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 19, [1CH].

The thirteenth to Shubael, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 20, [1CH].

The fourteenth to Mattithiah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 21, [1CH].

The fifteenth to Jeremoth, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 22, [1CH].

The sixteenth to Hananiah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 23, [1CH].

The seventeenth to Joshbekashah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 24, [1CH].

The eighteenth to Hanani, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 25, [1CH].

The nineteenth to Mallothi, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 26, [1CH].

The twentieth to Eliathah, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 27, [1CH].

The one and twentieth to Hothir, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 28, [1CH].

The two and twentieth to Giddalti, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 29, [1CH].

The three and twentieth to Mahazioth, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve: Chap. 25, Verse 30, [1CH].

The four and twentieth to Romamti-ezer, [he], his sons, and his brethren, [were] twelve. Chap. 25, Verse 31, [1CH].

Concerning the divisions of the porters: Of the Korhites [was] Meshelemiah the son of Kore, of the sons of Asaph. Chap. 26, Verse 1, [1CH].

And the sons of Meshelemiah [were], Zechariah the firstborn, Jediael the second, Zebadiah the third, Jathniel the fourth, Chap. 26, Verse 2, [1CH].

Elam the fifth, Jehohanan the sixth, Elioenai the seventh. Chap. 26, Verse 3, [1CH].

Moreover the sons of Obed-edom [were], Shemaiah the firstborn, Jehozabad the second, Joah the third, and Sacar the fourth, and Nethaneel the fifth, Chap. 26, Verse 4, [1CH].

Ammiel the sixth, Issachar the seventh, Peulthai the eighth: for God blessed him. Chap. 26, Verse 5, [1CH].

Also unto Shemaiah his son were sons born, that ruled throughout the house of their father: for they [were] mighty men of valour. Chap. 26, Verse 6, [1CH].

The sons of Shemaiah; Othni, and Rephael, and Obed, Elzabad, whose brethren [were] strong men, Elihu, and Semachiah. Chap. 26, Verse 7, [1CH].

All these of the sons of Obed-edom: they and their sons and their brethren, able men for strength for the service, [were] threescore and two of Obed-edom. Chap. 26, Verse 8, [1CH].

And Meshelemiah had sons and brethren, strong men, eighteen. Chap. 26, Verse 9, [1CH].

Also Hosah, of the children of Merari, had sons; Simri the chief, (for [though] he was not the firstborn, yet his father made him the chief;) Chap. 26, Verse 10, [1CH].

Hilkiah the second, Tebaliah the third, Zechariah the fourth: all the sons and brethren of Hosah [were] thirteen. Chap. 26, Verse 11, [1CH].

Among these [were] the divisions of the porters, [even] among the chief men, [having] wards one against another, to minister in the house of the LORD. Chap. 26, Verse 12, [1CH].

And they cast lots, as well the small as the great, according to the house of their fathers, for every gate. Chap. 26, Verse 13, [1CH].

And the lot eastward fell to Shelemiah. Then for Zechariah his son, a wise counsellor, they cast lots; and his lot came out northward. Chap. 26, Verse 14, [1CH].

To Obed-edom southward; and to his sons the house of Asuppim. Chap. 26, Verse 15, [1CH].

To Shuppim and Hosah [the lot came forth] westward, with the gate Shallecheth, by the causeway of the going up, ward against ward. Chap. 26, Verse 16, [1CH].

Eastward [were] six Levites, northward four a day, southward four a day, and toward Asuppim two [and] two. Chap. 26, Verse 17, [1CH].

At Parbar westward, four at the causeway, [and] two at Parbar. Chap. 26, Verse 18, [1CH].

These [are] the divisions of the porters among the sons of Kore, and among the sons of Merari. Chap. 26, Verse 19, [1CH].

And of the Levites, Ahijah [was] over the treasures of the house of God, and over the treasures of the dedicated things. Chap. 26, Verse 20, [1CH].

[As concerning] the sons of Laadan; the sons of the Gershonite Laadan, chief fathers, [even] of Laadan the Gershonite, [were] Jehieli. Chap. 26, Verse 21, [1CH].

The sons of Jehieli; Zetham, and Joel his brother, [which were] over the treasures of the house of the LORD. Chap. 26, Verse 22, [1CH].

Of the Amramites, [and] the Izharites, the Hebronites, [and] the Uzzielites: Chap. 26, Verse 23, [1CH].

And Shebuel the son of Gershom, the son of Moses, [was] ruler of the treasures. Chap. 26, Verse 24, [1CH].

And his brethren by Eliezer; Rehabiah his son, and Jeshaiah his son, and Joram his son, and Zichri his son, and Shelomith his son. Chap. 26, Verse 25, [1CH].

Which Shelomith and his brethren [were] over all the treasures of the dedicated things, which David the king,

and the chief fathers, the captains over thousands and hundreds, and the captains of the host, had dedicated. Chap. 26, Verse 26, [1CH].

Out of the spoils won in battles did they dedicate to maintain the house of the LORD. Chap. 26, Verse 27, [1CH].

And all that Samuel the seer, and Saul the son of Kish, and Abner the son of Ner, and Joab the son of Zeruah, had dedicated; [and] whosoever had dedicated [any thing, it was] under the hand of Shelomith, and of his brethren. Chap. 26, Verse 28, [1CH].

Of the Izharites, Chenaniah and his sons [were] for the outward business over Israel, for officers and judges. Chap. 26, Verse 29, [1CH].

[And] of the Hebronites, Hashabiah and his brethren, men of valour, a thousand and seven hundred, [were] officers among them of Israel on this side Jordan westward in all the business of the LORD, and in the service of the king. Chap. 26, Verse 30, [1CH].

Among the Hebronites [was] Jerijah the chief, [even] among the Hebronites, according to the generations of his fathers. In the fortieth year of the reign of David they were sought for, and there were found among them mighty men of valour at Jazer of Gilead. Chap. 26, Verse 31, [1CH].

And his brethren, men of valour, [were] two thousand and seven hundred chief fathers, whom king David made rulers over the Reubenites, the Gadites, and the half tribe of Manasseh, for every matter pertaining to God, and affairs of the king. Chap. 26, Verse 32, [1CH].

Now the children of Israel after their number, [to wit], the chief fathers and captains of thousands and hundreds, and their officers that served the king in any matter of the courses, which came in and went out month by month throughout all the months of the year, of every course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 1, [1CH].

Over the first course for the first month [was] Jashobeam the son of Zabdiel: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 2, [1CH].

Of the children of Perez [was] the chief of all the

captains of the host for the first month. Chap. 27, Verse 3, [1CH].

And over the course of the second month [was] Dodai an Ahohite, and of his course [was] Mikloth also the ruler: in his course likewise [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 4, [1CH].

The third captain of the host for the third month [was] Benaiah the son of Jehoiada, a chief priest: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 5, [1CH].

This [is that] Benaiah, [who was] mighty [among] the thirty, and above the thirty: and in his course [was] Ammizabad his son. Chap. 27, Verse 6, [1CH].

The fourth [captain] for the fourth month [was] Asahel the brother of Joab, and Zebadiah his son after him: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 7, [1CH].

The fifth captain for the fifth month [was] Shamhuth the Izrahite: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 8, [1CH].

The sixth [captain] for the sixth month [was] Ira the son of Ikkesh the Tekoite: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 9, [1CH].

The seventh [captain] for the seventh month [was] Helez the Pelonite, of the children of Ephraim: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 10, [1CH].

The eighth [captain] for the eighth month [was] Sibbecai the Hushathite, of the Zarhites: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 11, [1CH].

The ninth [captain] for the ninth month [was] Abi-ezer the Anetothite, of the Benjamites: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 12, [1CH].

The tenth [captain] for the tenth month [was] Maharai the Netophathite, of the Zarhites: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 13, [1CH].

The eleventh [captain] for the eleventh month [was] Benaiah the Pirathonite, of the children of Ephraim: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 14, [1CH].

The twelfth [captain] for the twelfth month [was] Heldai the Netophathite, of Othniel: and in his course [were] twenty and four thousand. Chap. 27, Verse 15, [1CH].

Furthermore over the tribes of Israel: the ruler of the Reubenites [was] Eliezer the son of Zichri: of the Simeonites, Shephatiah the son of Maachah: Chap. 27, Verse 16, [1CH].

Of the Levites, Hashabiah the son of Kemuel: of the Aaronites, Zadok: Chap. 27, Verse 17, [1CH].

Of Judah, Elihu, [one] of the brethren of David: of Issachar, Omri the son of Michael: Chap. 27, Verse 18, [1CH].

Of Zebulun, Ishmaiah the son of Obadiah: of Naphtali, Jerimoth the son of Azriel: Chap. 27, Verse 19, [1CH].

Of the children of Ephraim, Hoshea the son of Azaziah: of the half tribe of Manasseh, Joel the son of Pedaiah: Chap. 27, Verse 20, [1CH].

Of the half [tribe] of Manasseh in Gilead, Iddo the son of Zechariah: of Benjamin, Jaasiel the son of Abner: Chap. 27, Verse 21, [1CH].

Of Dan, Azareel the son of Jeroham. These [were] the princes of the tribes of Israel. Chap. 27, Verse 22, [1CH].

But David took not the number of them from twenty years old and under: because the LORD had said he would increase Israel like to the stars of the heavens. Chap. 27, Verse 23, [1CH].

Joab the son of Zeruiah began to number, but he finished not, because there fell wrath for it against Israel; neither was the number put in the account of the chronicles of king David. Chap. 27, Verse 24, [1CH].

And over the king's treasures [was] Azmaveth the son of

Adiel: and over the storehouses in the fields, in the cities, and in the villages, and in the castles, [was] Jehonathan the son of Uzziah: Chap. 27, Verse 25, [1CH].

And over them that did the work of the field for tillage of the ground [was] Ezri the son of Chelub: Chap. 27, Verse 26, [1CH].

And over the vineyards [was] Shimei the Ramathite: over the increase of the vineyards for the wine cellars [was] Zabdi the Shiphmite: Chap. 27, Verse 27, [1CH].

And over the olive trees and the sycamore trees that [were] in the low plains [was] Baal-hanan the Gederite: and over the cellars of oil [was] Joash: Chap. 27, Verse 28, [1CH].

And over the herds that fed in Sharon [was] Shitrai the Sharonite: and over the herds [that were] in the valleys [was] Shaphat the son of Adlai: Chap. 27, Verse 29, [1CH].

Over the camels also [was] Obil the Ishmaelite: and over the asses [was] Jehdeiah the Meronothite: Chap. 27, Verse 30, [1CH].

And over the flocks [was] Jaziz the Hagerite. All these [were] the rulers of the substance which [was] king David's. Chap. 27, Verse 31, [1CH].

Also Jonathan David's uncle was a counsellor, a wise man, and a scribe: and Jehiel the son of Hachmoni [was] with the king's sons: Chap. 27, Verse 32, [1CH].

And Ahithophel [was] the king's counsellor: and Hushai the Archite [was] the king's companion: Chap. 27, Verse 33, [1CH].

And after Ahithophel [was] Jehoiada the son of Benaiah, and Abiathar: and the general of the king's army [was] Joab. Chap. 27, Verse 34, [1CH].

And David assembled all the princes of Israel, the princes of the tribes, and the captains of the companies that ministered to the king by course, and the captains over the thousands, and captains over the hundreds, and the stewards over all the substance and possession of the king, and of his sons, with the officers, and with the mighty men, and

with all the valiant men, unto Jerusalem. Chap. 28, Verse 1, [1CH].

Then David the king stood up upon his feet, and said, Hear me, my brethren, and my people: [As for me], I [had] in mine heart to build an house of rest for the ark of the covenant of the LORD, and for the footstool of our God, and had made ready for the building: Chap. 28, Verse 2, [1CH].

But God said unto me, Thou shalt not build an house for my name, because thou [hast been] a man of war, and hast shed blood. Chap. 28, Verse 3, [1CH].

Howbeit the LORD God of Israel chose me before all the house of my father to be king over Israel for ever: for he hath chosen Judah [to be] the ruler; and of the house of Judah, the house of my father; and among the sons of my father he liked me to make [me] king over all Israel: Chap. 28, Verse 4, [1CH].

And of all my sons, (for the LORD hath given me many sons,) he hath chosen Solomon my son to sit upon the throne of the kingdom of the LORD over Israel. Chap. 28, Verse 5, [1CH].

And he said unto me, Solomon thy son, he shall build my house and my courts: for I have chosen him [to be] my son, and I will be his father. Chap. 28, Verse 6, [1CH].

Moreover I will establish his kingdom for ever, if he be constant to do my commandments and my judgments, as at this day. Chap. 28, Verse 7, [1CH].

Now therefore in the sight of all Israel the congregation of the LORD, and in the audience of our God, keep and seek for all the commandments of the LORD your God: that ye may possess this good land, and leave [it] for an inheritance for your children after you for ever. Chap. 28, Verse 8, [1CH].

And thou, Solomon my son, know thou the God of thy father, and serve him with a perfect heart and with a willing mind: for the LORD searcheth all hearts, and understandeth all the imaginations of the thoughts: if thou seek him, he will be found of thee; but if thou forsake him, he will cast thee off for ever. Chap. 28, Verse 9, [1CH].

Take heed now; for the LORD hath chosen thee to build an house for the sanctuary: be strong, and do [it]. Chap. 28, Verse 10, [1CH].

Then David gave to Solomon his son the pattern of the porch, and of the houses thereof, and of the treasuries thereof, and of the upper chambers thereof, and of the inner parlours thereof, and of the place of the mercy seat, Chap. 28, Verse 11, [1CH].

And the pattern of all that he had by the spirit, of the courts of the house of the LORD, and of all the chambers round about, of the treasuries of the house of God, and of the treasuries of the dedicated things: Chap. 28, Verse 12, [1CH].

Also for the courses of the priests and the Levites, and for all the work of the service of the house of the LORD, and for all the vessels of service in the house of the LORD. Chap. 28, Verse 13, [1CH].

[He gave] of gold by weight for [things] of gold, for all instruments of all manner of service; [silver also] for all instruments of silver by weight, for all instruments of every kind of service: Chap. 28, Verse 14, [1CH].

Even the weight for the candlesticks of gold, and for their lamps of gold, by weight for every candlestick, and for the lamps thereof: and for the candlesticks of silver by weight, [both] for the candlestick, and [also] for the lamps thereof, according to the use of every candlestick. Chap. 28, Verse 15, [1CH].

And by weight [he gave] gold for the tables of shewbread, for every table; and [likewise] silver for the tables of silver: Chap. 28, Verse 16, [1CH].

Also pure gold for the fleshhooks, and the bowls, and the cups: and for the golden basins [he gave gold] by weight for every basin; and [likewise silver] by weight for every basin of silver: Chap. 28, Verse 17, [1CH].

And for the altar of incense refined gold by weight; and gold for the pattern of the chariot of the cherubims, that spread out [their wings], and covered the ark of the covenant of the LORD. Chap. 28, Verse 18, [1CH].

All [this, said David], the LORD made me understand in writing by [his] hand upon me, [even] all the works of this pattern. Chap. 28, Verse 19, [1CH].

And David said to Solomon his son, Be strong and of good courage, and do [it]: fear not, nor be dismayed: for the LORD God, [even] my God, [will be] with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee, until thou hast finished all the work for the service of the house of the LORD. Chap. 28, Verse 20, [1CH].

And, behold, the courses of the priests and the Levites, [even they shall be with thee] for all the service of the house of God: and [there shall be] with thee for all manner of workmanship every willing skilful man, for any manner of service: also the princes and all the people [will be] wholly at thy commandment. Chap. 28, Verse 21, [1CH].

Furthermore David the king said unto all the congregation, Solomon my son, whom alone God hath chosen, [is yet] young and tender, and the work [is] great: for the palace [is] not for man, but for the LORD God. Chap. 29, Verse 1, [1CH].

Now I have prepared with all my might for the house of my God the gold for [things to be made] of gold, and the silver for [things] of silver, and the brass for [things] of brass, the iron for [things] of iron, and wood for [things] of wood; onyx stones, and [stones] to be set, glistening stones, and of divers colours, and all manner of precious stones, and marble stones in abundance. Chap. 29, Verse 2, [1CH].

Moreover, because I have set my affection to the house of my God, I have of mine own proper good, of gold and silver, [which] I have given to the house of my God, over and above all that I have prepared for the holy house, Chap. 29, Verse 3, [1CH].

[Even] three thousand talents of gold, of the gold of Ophir, and seven thousand talents of refined silver, to overlay the walls of the houses [withal]: Chap. 29, Verse 4, [1CH].

The gold for [things] of gold, and the silver for [things] of silver, and for all manner of work [to be made] by the hands of artificers. And who [then] is willing to

consecrate his service this day unto the LORD? Chap. 29, Verse 5, [1CH].

Then the chief of the fathers and princes of the tribes of Israel, and the captains of thousands and of hundreds, with the rulers of the king's work, offered willingly, Chap. 29, Verse 6, [1CH].

And gave for the service of the house of God of gold five thousand talents and ten thousand drams, and of silver ten thousand talents, and of brass eighteen thousand talents, and one hundred thousand talents of iron. Chap. 29, Verse 7, [1CH].

And they with whom [precious] stones were found gave [them] to the treasure of the house of the LORD, by the hand of Jehiel the Gershonite. Chap. 29, Verse 8, [1CH].

Then the people rejoiced, for that they offered willingly, because with perfect heart they offered willingly to the LORD: and David the king also rejoiced with great joy. Chap. 29, Verse 9, [1CH].

Wherefore David blessed the LORD before all the congregation: and David said, Blessed [be] thou, LORD God of Israel our father, for ever and ever. Chap. 29, Verse 10, [1CH].

Thine, O LORD, [is] the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty: for all [that is] in the heaven and in the earth [is thine]; thine [is] the kingdom, O LORD, and thou art exalted as head above all. Chap. 29, Verse 11, [1CH].

Both riches and honour [come] of thee, and thou reignest over all; and in thine hand [is] power and might; and in thine hand [it is] to make great, and to give strength unto all. Chap. 29, Verse 12, [1CH].

Now therefore, our God, we thank thee, and praise thy glorious name. Chap. 29, Verse 13, [1CH].

But who [am] I, and what [is] my people, that we should be able to offer so willingly after this sort? for all things [come] of thee, and of thine own have we given thee. Chap. 29, Verse 14, [1CH].

For we [are] strangers before thee, and sojourners, as [were] all our fathers: our days on the earth [are] as a shadow, and [there is] none abiding. Chap. 29, Verse 15, [1CH].

O LORD our God, all this store that we have prepared to build thee an house for thine holy name [cometh] of thine hand, and [is] all thine own. Chap. 29, Verse 16, [1CH].

I know also, my God, that thou triest the heart, and hast pleasure in uprightness. As for me, in the uprightness of mine heart I have willingly offered all these things: and now have I seen with joy thy people, which are present here, to offer willingly unto thee. Chap. 29, Verse 17, [1CH].

O LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, our fathers, keep this for ever in the imagination of the thoughts of the heart of thy people, and prepare their heart unto thee: Chap. 29, Verse 18, [1CH].

And give unto Solomon my son a perfect heart, to keep thy commandments, thy testimonies, and thy statutes, and to do all [these things], and to build the palace, [for] the which I have made provision. Chap. 29, Verse 19, [1CH].

And David said to all the congregation, Now bless the LORD your God. And all the congregation blessed the LORD God of their fathers, and bowed down their heads, and worshipped the LORD, and the king. Chap. 29, Verse 20, [1CH].

And they sacrificed sacrifices unto the LORD, and offered burnt offerings unto the LORD, on the morrow after that day, [even] a thousand bullocks, a thousand rams, [and] a thousand lambs, with their drink offerings, and sacrifices in abundance for all Israel: Chap. 29, Verse 21, [1CH].

And did eat and drink before the LORD on that day with great gladness. And they made Solomon the son of David king the second time, and anointed [him] unto the LORD [to be] the chief governor, and Zadok [to be] priest. Chap. 29, Verse 22, [1CH].

Then Solomon sat on the throne of the LORD as king instead of David his father, and prospered; and all Israel obeyed him. Chap. 29, Verse 23, [1CH].

And all the princes, and the mighty men, and all the sons likewise of king David, submitted themselves unto Solomon the king. Chap. 29, Verse 24, [1CH].

And the LORD magnified Solomon exceedingly in the sight of all Israel, and bestowed upon him [such] royal majesty as had not been on any king before him in Israel. Chap. 29, Verse 25, [1CH].

Thus David the son of Jesse reigned over all Israel. Chap. 29, Verse 26, [1CH].

And the time that he reigned over Israel [was] forty years; seven years reigned he in Hebron, and thirty and three [years] reigned he in Jerusalem. Chap. 29, Verse 27, [1CH].

And he died in a good old age, full of days, riches, and honour: and Solomon his son reigned in his stead. Chap. 29, Verse 28, [1CH].

Now the acts of David the king, first and last, behold, they [are] written in the book of Samuel the seer, and in the book of Nathan the prophet, and in the book of Gad the seer, Chap. 29, Verse 29, [1CH].

With all his reign and his might, and the times that went over him, and over Israel, and over all the kingdoms of the countries. Chap. 29, Verse 30, [1CH].
