

The elder unto the wellbeloved Gaius, whom I love in the truth. Chap. 1, Verse 1, [3JO].

Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth. Chap. 1, Verse 2, [3JO].

For I rejoiced greatly, when the brethren came and testified of the truth that is in thee, even as thou walkest in the truth. Chap. 1, Verse 3, [3JO].

I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth. Chap. 1, Verse 4, [3JO].

Beloved, thou doest faithfully whatsoever thou doest to the brethren, and to strangers; Chap. 1, Verse 5, [3JO].

Which have borne witness of thy charity before the church: whom if thou bring forward on their journey after a godly sort, thou shalt do well: Chap. 1, Verse 6, [3JO].

Because that for his name's sake they went forth, taking nothing of the Gentiles. Chap. 1, Verse 7, [3JO].

We therefore ought to receive such, that we might be fellowhelpers to the truth. Chap. 1, Verse 8, [3JO].

I wrote unto the church: but Diotrephes, who loveth to have the preeminence among them, receiveth us not. Chap. 1, Verse 9, [3JO].

Wherefore, if I come, I will remember his deeds which he doeth, prating against us with malicious words: and not content therewith, neither doth he himself receive the brethren, and forbiddeth them that would, and casteth [them] out of the church. Chap. 1, Verse 10, [3JO].

Beloved, follow not that which is evil, but that which is good. He that doeth good is of God: but he that doeth evil hath not seen God. Chap. 1, Verse 11, [3JO].

Demetrius hath good report of all [men], and of the truth itself: yea, and we [also] bear record; and ye know that our record is true. Chap. 1, Verse 12, [3JO].

I had many things to write, but I will not with ink and

pen write unto thee: Chap. 1, Verse 13, [3JO].

But I trust I shall shortly see thee, and we shall speak
face to face. Peace [be] to thee. [Our] friends salute
thee. Greet the friends by name. Chap. 1, Verse 14, [3JO].
