Paul, a prisoner of Jesus Christ, and Timothy [our] brother, unto Philemon our dearly beloved, and fellowlabourer, Chap. 1, Verse 1, [PHM].

And to [our] beloved Apphia, and Archippus our fellowsoldier, and to the church in thy house: Chap. 1, Verse 2, [PHM].

Grace to you, and peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Chap. 1, Verse 3, [PHM].

I thank my God, making mention of thee always in my prayers, Chap. 1, Verse 4, [PHM].

Hearing of thy love and faith, which thou hast toward the Lord Jesus, and toward all saints; Chap. 1, Verse 5, [PHM].

That the communication of thy faith may become effectual by the acknowledging of every good thing which is in you in Christ Jesus. Chap. 1, Verse 6, [PHM].

For we have great joy and consolation in thy love, because the bowels of the saints are refreshed by thee, brother. Chap. 1, Verse 7, [PHM].

Wherefore, though I might be much bold in Christ to enjoin thee that which is convenient, Chap. 1, Verse 8, [PHM].

Yet for love's sake I rather beseech [thee], being such an one as Paul the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jesus Christ. Chap. 1, Verse 9, [PHM].

I beseech thee for my son Onesimus, whom I have begotten in my bonds: Chap. 1, Verse 10, [PHM].

Which in time past was to thee unprofitable, but now profitable to thee and to me: Chap. 1, Verse 11, [PHM].

Whom I have sent again: thou therefore receive him, that is, mine own bowels: Chap. 1, Verse 12, [PHM].

Whom I would have retained with me, that in thy stead he might have ministered unto me in the bonds of the gospel: Chap. 1, Verse 13, [PHM].

But without thy mind would I do nothing; that thy benefit should not be as it were of necessity, but willingly. Chap. 1, Verse 14, [PHM].

For perhaps he therefore departed for a season, that thou shouldest receive him for ever; Chap. 1, Verse 15, [PHM].

Not now as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to me, but how much more unto thee, both in the flesh, and in the Lord? Chap. 1, Verse 16, [PHM].

If thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself. Chap. 1, Verse 17, [PHM].

If he hath wronged thee, or oweth [thee] ought, put that on mine account; Chap. 1, Verse 18, [PHM].

I Paul have written [it] with mine own hand, I will repay [it]: albeit I do not say to thee how thou owest unto me even thine own self besides. Chap. 1, Verse 19, [PHM].

Yea, brother, let me have joy of thee in the Lord: refresh my bowels in the Lord. Chap. 1, Verse 20, [PHM].

Having confidence in thy obedience I wrote unto thee, knowing that thou wilt also do more than I say. Chap. 1, Verse 21, [PHM].

But withal prepare me also a lodging: for I trust that through your prayers I shall be given unto you. Chap. 1, Verse 22, [PHM].

There salute thee Epaphras, my fellowprisoner in Christ Jesus; Chap. 1, Verse 23, [PHM].

Marcus, Aristarchus, Demas, Lucas, my fellowlabourers. Chap. 1, Verse 24, [PHM].

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ [be] with your spirit. Amen. Chap. 1, Verse 25, [PHM].
